## Quick Start

This interface looks best using a 256-color palette.

The main screen you will see every time you start is called the **Software Control Center (SCC)**. Here are simple descriptions for each of the features in the SCC:

**NOTE:** If you leave your cursor on top of a section of the interface for about 3 seconds, you will see appear a hint box giving you a short description of this particular part of the interface.

## Main window



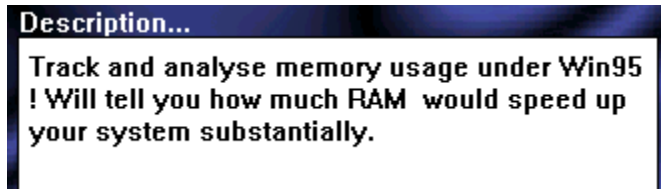
### CATEGORIES:

Choose among the various categories to view shareware titles.

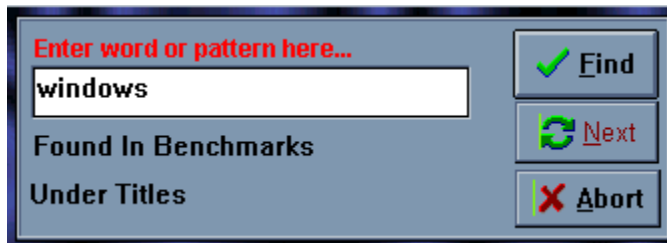


### TITLES:

Title of the software package.

**DESCRIPTION:**

A few lines to describe the use(s) and purpose of the software package.

**SEARCH BOX:**

The search engine is a quick and easy way to let you find what you are looking for. Simply enter the word(s) or string to browse for throughout the entire compilation, then click on the FIND button. The search engine will browse through the titles and descriptions. Any word(s) or string are acceptable.

**ENTER WORD...:**

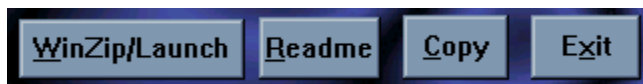
This is where you write in the expression to search for.

**FIND:**

Click on this button to begin searching for the expression in the search box.

**NEXT:**

Search for the next match in your specified search.

**WINZIP/LAUNCH:**

By clicking on this button, the presently selected title will be launched/activated. For many programs, a setup is required, but many can be run directly from the CD-ROM.

**README:**

When clicked, this button displays additional information. When not available (the software needs to be set up first), this button will be greyed out (will not be available).

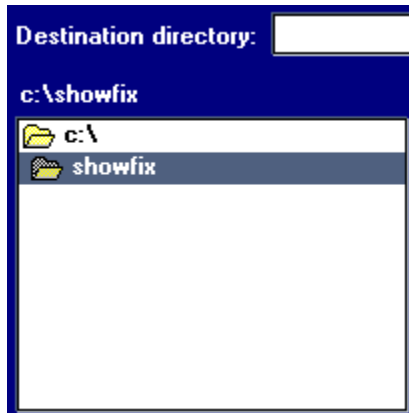
**COPY:**

When you click on the COPY button, you will be prompted to select a destination. You can choose to copy either the program files or the compressed program files (ZIP or EXE self-executable.ZIP files). See below for explanation of the copy procedure.

**EXIT:**

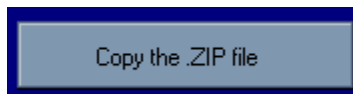
Terminates the program.

## COPY FILE UTILITY

**DESTINATION DIRECTORY:**

Lets you choose where you want to copy the file(s) to. Double-click on a directory to change the default destination, or enter it manually in the rectangle above the directory tree

If you are creating a diectory, then add a "\" after the directory name at the end.

**COPY ZIPPED FILE:**

Will copy the compressed (.ZIP) file to any location (directory) you select. Once the copy process is complete, a dialog box will appear to notify you.

**DRIVE:**

Choose which destination drive you will copy the file(s) to.

**BACK TO MAIN:**

Cancel the operation, and return to the main menu.

## Shareware/Freeware and public Domain programs

**Shareware is a distribution method** developed so as to offer the consumer the opportunity to try out programs at their leisure. After a certain amount of time of use, the user is to register the product, by paying a reasonable fee.

**Shareware** programs are the property of the author(s) and/or copyright holders. The authors/owners give you a limited right of use for their work. You cannot sell/lease, package with a commercial product, among other things ( more specific information is offered in the text file offered with every software package). We are supplying you with a wide selection, for evaluation purposes, and in no way whatsoever do we or you own any rights to the software programs. Our part is limited to distribute programs in return for a fee covering costs related to getting you these programs. In other words, your cost is to cover handling, copying and other related fees.

More to the point: shareware involves an enormous amount of effort on the part of the creator(s). Registration fees are usually very reasonable. In many instances, when you register a program, there are many extras that may be offered to you, such as free updates, published manual, support, and many others. Shareware has been key to helping millions of users extract better use and performance from their computers. Help them by encouraging these valiant workers.

**Freeware** software are programs can be distributed any which way, yet in most cases, the author will retain the copyright. Freeware does not require you to pay a registration fee, though many authors would not mind receiving some acknowledgement. One original way to do so is for users to send your software author a postcard. They deserve it fully.

**Public Domain** refers to a work that has no copyright restriction. In other words, no limitations whatsoever is made unto the distribution or the product itself.

## Using Winzip

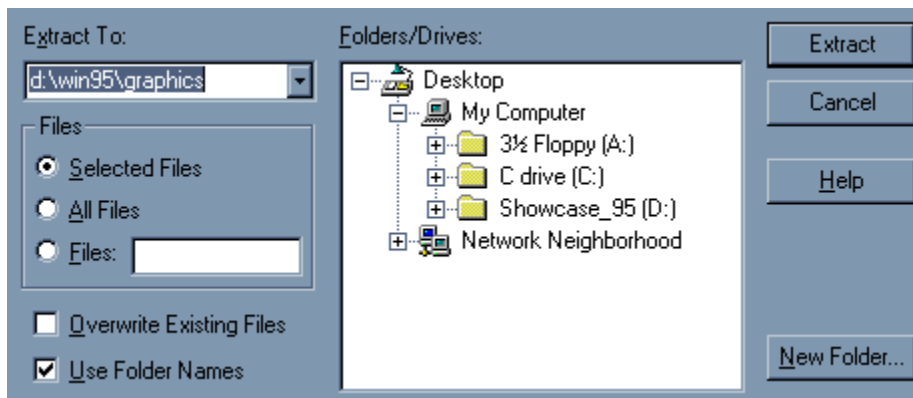
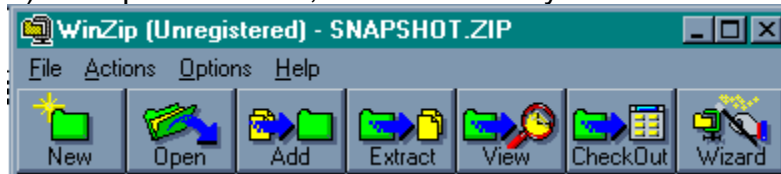
When you install Winzip 6.1 during the installation procedure, all compressed (**.ZIP**) files are associated with Winzip. This simply means that from this moment on, anytime you double-click on a file with the .ZIP extension, anywhere in the Explorer window, or especially when you click on the **Winzip/Launch** button. Winzip will be launched every time that you choose a file that is compressed. If a file is an Windows executable, then Winzip will not launch; the author(s)' own installation will begin.

You can use the **Wizard** included with Winzip 6.1 if you need assistance. You can enable this feature if you haven't done so through the OPTIONS menu at any time.



1) Click on the **Winzip/Launch** button

2) Winzip is activated, and immediately loads the content of the file you selected



3) Simply click on the **Extract** button, and by choose where you want the file to be decompressed, then click on the Extract button in that dialog. If you want to create a directory, then click on the **NEW FOLDER** button

Additional information is provided through Winzip by pressing **F1** or clicking on **HELP** from the menu bar.
