Lets you change the way QuicKeys appears when you first run it. It also lets you decide whether or not to open a new instance of Viewer for each different book you search.

Searching using QuicKeys involves the following main steps:

- * select a book to search with Viewer
- * specify a QuicKeys combination to activate searches in that book
- * specify whether to use index or full-text searching for that book

QuicKeys

An application that calls Viewer to perform full-text-searching on text selected in a Windows application.

Specifying the Book to Search

You must first specify which book you want to search for a given **QuicKeys combination**.

To specify the book to be searched:

* Select the book's name from the list box labeled "Select a book, then choose a key combination."

Specifying the QuicKeys Combination

Once you select a book, the QuicKey and Look Up Using options become active. Use the QuicKey option to select a keystroke combination. This keystroke combination activates the search in the book you have selected.

To specify the QuicKeys combination:

- 1 Select any combination of the CTRL, SHIFT, and ALT check-box options. You can also leave all three check boxes blank.
- 2 Press any key except one of the following keys: any arrow key, BACKSPACE, CAPS LOCK, DEL, END, ENTER, HOME, INS, PAUSE, PAGE DOWN, PAGE UP, PRT SC, SCROLL LOCK, or any other key on the numeric keypad.
 - Or select a key name from the Key list. The keyname appears in the Key box.
 - If you did not select a key combination in step 1, or if you selected only the SHIFT key, this second key must be one of the function keys (F1 through F12) on your keyboard.
- 3 Choose the Add button.

The <u>QuicKeys combination</u> appears next to the book name in the list box labeled "Select a book, then choose a key combination."

Specifying the Search Method

Once you select a book, the QuicKey and Look Up Using options become active. Select a Look Up Using option to specify what type of search the <u>QuicKeys combination</u> carries out.

To specify the type of search the QuicKeys combination will perform:

* Select one of the option buttons in the Look Up Using area.

Select Index Facility to use an index search.

Select Search Facility to use a full-text search.

Carrying Out the Search

Once you set up a QuicKeys combination, you can use QuicKeys to search the book assigned to that combination.

To search using a QuicKeys combination:

- 1 Make sure QuicKeys is running.
- 2 Open the Windows application and select the text you want to search for.
 - If you are using an index search, the text you select must be defined in the index for the book you are searching.
 - If you are using a full-text search, the text you select is treated as the <u>search query</u>. Viewer searches for topics containing any word in the selected text.
- 3 Press the keys for the QuicKeys combination you have defined.
 - Viewer opens the book you selected and searches for the text you selected in the Windows application. Viewer uses the search method you defined for the QuicKeys combination.

- 1 Select the book name from the list box labeled "Select a book, then choose a key combination."
- 2 Select a new QuicKeys combination or search method.
- 3 Choose Add.

- 1 Select the book name from the list box labeled "Select a book, then choose a key combination."
- 2 Choose Delete.

Setting Preferences

The QuicKeys Edit menu has a single command: Preferences. Use this command to specify preferences for running QuicKeys.

To minimize QuicKeys each time you open it:

* Select Minimize QuicKeys When Opened.

To run QuicKeys in a window each time you open it:

* Leave the Minimize QuicKeys When Opened check box unchecked.

To search all books using the same instance of Viewer:

* Select Use One Viewer Window Only.

To open a separate instance of Viewer for each book you search:

* Leave the Use One Viewer Window Only check box unchecked.

- 1 Click the Control box to open its menu.
- 2 Choose Close.
