Goal: Mountain Home High School Career Academies will provide support for students in making healthy lifestyle choices implementing systems to aid in decreasing the average BMI on routine annual student screening and increasing collaboration between all segments of the school community in support of positive lifestyle choices.

## Priority 1: Literacy

1. LITERACY BENCHMARK DATA, Grade(s) 11 : In 2013, $76.73 \%$ of combined students scored proficient or advanced and 62.04\% of TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) scored proficient or advanced. ESEA Subgroups performed as listed: 65.12\% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced; $11.11 \%$ of students with disabilities scored proficient or advanced; 100\% of English Learner students scored proficient or advanced; 75.3\% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced; 100\% of African American students scored proficient or advanced; and $100 \%$ of Hispanic students scored proficient or advanced. LITERACY BENCHMARK DATA, Grade(s) 11 : In 2012, 74.1\% of combined students scored proficient or advanced and 61.87\% of TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) scored proficient or advanced. ESEA Subgroups performed as listed: 62.96\% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced; $\mathrm{n}<10 \%$ of English Learner students scored proficient or advanced; 75\% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced; $\mathrm{n}<10 \%$ of African American students scored proficient or advanced; and $n<10 \%$ of Hispanic students scored proficient or advanced.
2. Literacy BENCHMARK DATA, Grade 11: In 2011, $82 \%$ of combined students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in practical passages, open response; 82\% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in practical passages, open response; 74\% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in practical passages, open response; 14\% of special education students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in practical passages, open response.
3. LITERACY NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Leadership teams reviewed and analyzed the results from the 2013 Literacy exam. The results for both the combined population and each of the subpopulations were reviewed and analyzed to determine the main areas of weakness. Also, the three most recent years of summative data as well as attendance rates were studied.

Studying the trend data allowed identification of specific areas of need, and allowed alignment of classroom instruction with the curriculum, professional development, and assessments. Our 2013 supporting data statements show the discrepancies in achievement among our populations. Based on our data analysis we came to the conclusion that the following areas reflect our greatest need within the Math priority:
4. The expected AMO (annual measurable objective) for percentage proficient of our students in grades 112013 Literacy was $86.38 \%$ for all students; we missed this with $85.40 \% \%$ of our students proficient. Our TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) expected AMO was 80.74 \%. Our TAGG missed this benchmark with $79.48 \%$ of our students proficient.
5. Attendance rate $-92.5 \%$
6. Graduation rate $-85.49 \%$

All students will demonstrate an improvement in content passages performance on the End-Of-Level Literacy Exam.
It is expected that Mountain Home High School will exceed the 2014 AMO (Annual Measurable Objective) Literacy proficiency benchmark of 86.94 \% for all students and $78.23 \%$ for TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group - students with disabilities, English learners, and economically disadvantaged students.)

ALGEBRA, GEOMETRY EOC DATA, Grade(s) 9,10,11,12 : In 2012, 84.78\% of combined students scored proficient or advanced and $76.88 \%$ of TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) scored proficient or advanced. 2. Algebra I BENCHMARK DATA: In 2011, $81 \%$ of combined students scored proficient or Supporting Data: advanced showing weaknesses in open response, linear functions and solving equations; $81 \%$ of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, linear functions and solving equations; 64\% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, linear functions and solving equations; $11 \%$ of special education students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, linear functions and solving equations.
3. Geometry BENCHMARK DATA: In 2011, $81 \%$ of combined students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, triangles; 81\% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, triangles; 70\% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, triangles; 33\% of special education students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, triangles.
4. MATH NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Leadership teams reviewed and analyzed the results from the 2013 Algebra EOC exam and Geometry EOC exam. The results for both the combined population and each of the subpopulations were reviewed and analyzed to determine the main areas of weakness. Also, the three most recent years of summative data as well as attendance rates were studied. Studying the trend data allowed identification of specific
areas of need, and allowed alignment of classroom instruction with the curriculum, professional development, and assessments. Our 2013 supporting data statements show the discrepancies in achievement among our populations. Based on our data analysis we came to the conclusion that the following areas reflect our greatest need within the Math priority:
5. The expected AMO (annual measurable objective) for percentage proficient of our students in grades $9,10,11$ and 122013 Algebra and Geometry EOC was $87.60 \%$ for all students; we did not meet this goal with $82.39 \%$ of our students proficient and advanced. Our TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) expected AMO was 82.06 \%. Our TAGG did not meet this goal with $76.19 \%$ proficient or advanced.
