News for the week:

The January School Board meeting was a busy evening. We honored National Board Certified teachers Linda Thrasher, Chris Davis, Cristy Curtis and Jennifer Seaman. Each of these individuals has worked diligently to improve themselves professionally and there is not a more rigorous program than National Board Certification. Congratulations to a wonderful group of professionals!



We honored the Mountain Home School Board in recognition of their work. Please see attachment of the Press Release which was sent to the press.

The School Board approved an agreement between MHPS and the City of Mountain Home for the use of the city's baseball and softball fields. Those fields include the Lester White Baseball Field, Clysta Willett South #1, Keller Park Fields #1 and #2. This agreement is another example of the wonderful working relationship between the city and our school district.

Our board also approved a recommendation to accept a bid for fiber optic cable which will run from Pinkston Middle School to the recently acquired facilities across the street from PMS and referred to as the new Auxiliary Services buildings. This cable will provide internet services for that facility which is planned to house food services and FIRST Robotics in the near future.

Mr. Wes Henderson presented a resolution for local support of our Facilities Master Plan & Partnership Program. This is a required update to let the state know what we have in mind in term of facilities. At this time there are no plans to build new buildings; thus this approval is done primarily to meet the required submission rules.



After more days off than originally anticipated during Christmas break, we are back with the regular routine of busing students. Generally, kids seemed anxious to get back to school even though most would say NOT!

It is time once again to have the State-mandated school bus evacuation drills for this semester. Janelle will be in touch with the buildings to arrange a time for these drills. The State mandates that each child be given instruction on how to evacuate a school bus in case of an emergency. At some time or other, each student will be on a school bus so everyone needs this instruction. We appreciate Principals working with us to get these drills completed before March 15.

MAINTENANCE MATTERS

The Christmas break and the first week of January found all of the maintenance men and custodians busy clearing snow and ice from around the buildings. At this same time numerous paint jobs were completed at the Senior High and Junior High.

The installation of the sheet rock and texturing of the wall at the new Food Service Offices at the Auxiliary Services Building was completed. Those offices and the warehouse will be very nice when completed.

We did the set-up and take-down for various sporting events along with the monthly State-mandated inspections. The metal from the old canopies which came down during the storm was taken to the recycle center. The weekly run picking up cardboard around the district was made with the cardboard taken to the recycle center.

Several of the men along with Mike Walker and Wes Henderson ran the wet vac machines cleaning up major floods at Pinkston and at the Senior High. This was due to the storm that first week this month. Many ceiling tiles had to be replaced. Wet insulation had to be removed from the attic along with plaster ceilings. Carpets had to have the water removed and cleaned in the north end offices. At Pinkston this was all due to a frozen water line in the attic that serves a water fountain below in the hallway.

An additional frozen line burst at the Senior High old gym which flooded the old dressing rooms. Jeff McLean continues the work of repairing the plumbing in this area.
