We had another great week in the Mountain Home School District. Following are just a few of the many good things that happened:

Mountain Home was 1 of 5 school districts in the state to receive an online-learning grant. We received \$12,500. Thanks to Dorothy Cook, Darla Deatherage, and Dr. Gigliotti for doing the writing. The first time award will help our school system to offset student tuition costs for online, or digitally delivered, courses. The money comes at a good time as we gear up to comply with Act 1280 of 2013. The law requires students in the Class of 2018—next year's ninth-graders—and all subsequent classes to complete at least one digitally delivered course to be eligible for high school graduation.





We awarded the "Big Heart" award to Cindy Burg at Mountain Home High School Monday morning. Both Cindy and Kristyn will choose \$250 worth of books to be used at their school for whatever they choose. We also awarded the "Teacher's Heart" award to Kristyn Goodwin at Hackler Intermediate School. As we awarded the Big Heart Award to Cindy, there were several adults and students present. It was a good time to have a "teachable moment" with the students and remind them the importance of having a big heart as one works in any situation. It is very true that we must successfully learn content such as English, Math, Science and Social Studies but it is equally important that each and every team member of a team is most respected when he/she puts the needs of others ahead of their personal needs. Congratulations to Cindy and Kristyn...two of the most unselfish, cheerful, and effective employees in our District. We couldn't do it without you! 



On-Line Book Fair is currently open through March 14th.



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Self Realization is the current theme of the ninth grade Common Core unit at MHJH. 
The *Bomber* was created by the 2012-2013 yearbook staff under the direction of Jennifer Seaman, yearbook adviser.
