

Superintendent Update: March 7, 2014

We received some encouraging data from the Arkansas Department of Education this week. Each year at about this time we receive information from the previous year. In the case of this particular data, the information I share will be from the 2012-13 school year. The data I want to share concerns our ACT Scores and our graduation rate.

Our ACT average score was 22.4 which improved from 22.1 the previous year. The state average score is 21.3 and the national average is 21.0; thus we are a full percentage point ahead of the state and national average which is significant. ACT is certainly not the only indicator of future success, but it is a very good indicator. I am proud of this score. The students and teacher of Mountain Home continue to deliver a finished product (the student) who performs above state and national ACT scores.

We also received data on graduation rate. The state goal has been 85% graduation rate for at least the last three years. The state average for graduation rate has been 79.6 in 2011, 84.1% in 2012 and 84.9 in 2013. I am very, very happy to report our gains for the last three years. Our graduation rate was 80.2 in 2011, 85.5 in 2012 and 86.4 in 2013. We have emphasized graduation rate in the last four years and the implementation of Guy Berry College and Career Academy has helped improve our rate significantly. In the last three years (including this year's projections) we will have graduated some 60 students who would not have otherwise graduated. This effort combined with the wonderful effort of our traditional schools speaks positively about our teachers, administrators and support staff in their efforts to reach every student—every time!

GAPP walk-a-thon slated Saturday

The GAPP Walk-a-thon to Germany is set for 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday at Bomber Stadium. The event includes a silent auction, with items donated by area businesses, a bake sale and concession stand. Twenty-three Mountain Home High School students will participate to raise money for an upcoming trip to Europe with the German American Partnership Program. The group of students has pledged to walk a total of 4,946 miles — the distance to Regensburg, Germany, where the students will study this summer. Professional Development Modules to Support Teachers

As a part of its commitment to support implementation of the PARCC assessment system, PARCC is creating a series of online professional development modules to accompany its next-generation assessment system. The five modules will consist of a series of short videos to support teachers and schools as they transition to the PARCC assessments.

The professional development modules will provide additional information in the following areas: overview of the four main assessment system components, administering the non-summative assessments, using nonsummative data to support instruction, and available supports and accommodations. Educators are interested in these tools, some of the most powerful in the PARCC system, because the modules will give them flexible access to information.
