What a week this has been. On Thursday, April 17th, we were honored with visits from Senator Johnny Key, Representative Karen Hopper, and Mr. Gary Newton, President and CEO of ArkansasLearns. Our legislators and Mr. Newton delivered checks of more than \$25,000 to Pinkston Middle School and Mountain Home Junior High School. This money was a performance based reward for the students at those schools finishing which finished in the top 20% and top 10% respectively. I am very proud of these students obviously, but I am proud of every teacher, administrator, and staff member of every school because they prepare these students for success at those schools and high school. If one looks at our performance in the district, one would discover that our students tend to improve as they move up through the system. This is what good teaching does. It helps students increase their achievement as they learn more and more each year.

We had our regular board meeting on Thursday evening. It was a long evening, but a very productive one! Kindergarten students lead the Pledge and sang us a song from their spring program.

We honored our Library Media Specialists at the meeting. Really they honored us! Each board member and superintendent received a gift of a book which had either been heavily used or damaged. A nice story with each book was presented, laughter during the presentation occurred and appreciation was shared both from and to our wonderful media specialists. Devona



Pendergrass was presented a very nice framed copy of her article *Dewey or Don't We* which was printed in the national magazine *Knowledge Quest*. I shared with the audience just what an honor it was to be published nationally and it is good of Devona to share that honor with her colleagues in Mountain Home.

Two Odyssey of the Mind teams were present at our board meeting. Both teams are state champions and both teams will be going to World Championship competition in Ames, Iowa. Congratulations to Pinkston OM for a great year. Our high school OM team finished 4th in state competition. We are proud of all our OM competitors.

Our board also approved the purchase of band bleachers to be installed at Bomber Stadium. The bleachers will seat 240 people. It will be exciting to hear our band demonstrating their awesome sound to the home bleachers next year. We have an amazing band and now they will play for the home stands! As we move our band students to those bleachers located on the end of the stadium towards the *Hanger*, we will free up seats in the home bleachers which will allow for a much more comfortable seating arrangement there as well.

Becca Camp and Dr. Gigliotti presented a school calendar for 2014-15 and it was approved unanimously. The start date for students will be August 20, 2014. The start date for teachers is August 13th.

For me personally, the most exciting part of our meeting was devoted to three of our schools presenting a proposal to become "Schools of Innovation" in the state of Arkansas. This presentation was bold and exciting. I am very hopeful the Arkansas Department of Education will approve these plans, but we will not know until May or June if we are approved. The innovation will be geared towards more curriculum offerings, presented in innovative formats and engagement of students to improve their academic performance. The end result would hopefully be reducing the achievement gap among one or more groups of students by accelerating learning experiences for academically low-achieving students while increasing all

student learning through the implementation of highly rigorous standards for student performance. Innovation simply means a new or creative alternative to the existing instructional and administrative practices that is intended to improve academic performance and learning for all students.

The board passed Policy 6.2 addressing **Relations with School Support Organizations,** tabled Policy 6.4 **Volunteers** and passed the Mountain Home Public Schools Volunteer Handbook. Policy 6.4 will be reviewed by our school attorney.

I am so proud of our board for taking on this agenda which contained the largest body of work ever presented at one meeting in my four years in Mountain Home. We are fortunate to have board members who devote themselves so thoroughly to the work of our school district.

The Mountain Home High School EAST Initiative students have created a Pilot News program entitled "Bomber News Network" and will air on your Hometown Television station 26.1 Digital Antenna and Suddenlink channel 22 in the Mountain Home area this Thursday at 6:00pm. Be sure to check out these talented kids who created this newscast from scratch.

MHHS Civics Students Visit the State Capitol & Clinton Library




