






Kara Morris: "I took the ALS challenge because I was challenged by Mrs. Whiteaker's class and to help bring awareness and funding to an incurable disease."



Susie Reding: "I did it in honor of Debra Chaney who passed away last year of ALS. I will donate money to ALS and hope they will find a cure."


