






### **Baxter Bomb Squad**

# Josh Baker Farm Bureau Teacher of the Year





### **MHHS College and Career Action Plan**

Students at the high school are preparing for the CCAP (College and Career Action Plan) interviews which will be held in February. Each grade level is working diligently to prepare for these interviews. On Tuesday, December 3, 2013 during their Academic Advisory Period, the three grade levels did some preliminary preparation for those interviews. The Seniors listened to their teachers talk about interviewing etiquette followed by a discussion, the Juniors did some peer interviews, and the Sophomores went to the computer labs and used Arkansas Works to do some assessments and prepare their resumes. All grade levels will continue working to prepare their portfolios for this February activity.



#### November Volunteer Board Report 1,641.5+ Volunteer Hours

#### Kindergarten – 25 volunteers, 386 hours

Volunteers copied, laminated, and cut materials for teachers. They hung Christmas lights and decorations in the halls. Volunteers counted BoxTops and took home items to cut out. Nov 7th and 8<sup>th</sup> we helped with Grandparents Day and Nov 7th through Nov 15th was Book Fair.





#### Nelson-Wilks-Herron – 38 volunteers, 434.5 hours

Nelson Wilkes Herron volunteers copied and assembled handouts for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teachers. They prepared for Thanksgiving activities, projects, and parties. Volunteers are already using their creativity by planning Christmas activities and projects for the students and hallway! Volunteers helped celebrate 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade classroom winners for BoxTops.

#### Hackler – 34 volunteers, 324 hours

Volunteers copied materials for teachers, laminated work, copied newsletters, created bulletin board displays and decorations. We also worked counting BoxTops.

#### Pinkston – 23 volunteers, 200 hours

Volunteers copied materials and created bulletin boards. We distributed weekly snack packs to students. Volunteers served 6<sup>th</sup> grade students a Holiday feast throughout the day.

#### Jr High -5 volunteers, 20 hours

Volunteers assisted with hall monitoring during the lunch hour, photocopied materials, and collected and organized items for the clothing closet. We also decorated the hallways and assisted with administrating tests to students.

#### **High School – 25++ volunteers, 277++ hours**

Athletics volunteers (24vol-272 hours) worked as assistant coaches and athletic game organizers, and provided food for team members. Band Booster(+) volunteers (unspecified vols and hours) ran game concessions. Volunteers (1vol-5hour) also helped with general copying and assistance. Community Mentors(+) (unspecified vols and hours) also worked with students in their classes.
