1.2 intro

So, why do Topicdemo.amirx?

Well, I've been an IRC user for ooh about 7 months now, and I've seen so many good topics that it's unbelievable ;) I got sick and tired of calling one from memory all the time that I've been bored in a channel, so I decided to write a script which would randomly call a topic.

This script will, once run, randomly put a topic onto the channel that you are currently on. At the moment, it is very limited. I am working on making the topics user configurable.

What's the difference between Topicdemo.amirx and Topic.amirx?

Well, Topicdemo.amirx (the file you now have) has a limited number of topics. Topic.amirx has a lot more topics, and doesn't have the annoying message preceding the topic change ;-)

1.3 full

So, you want the full version, do you?

1.4 install

Installation of this script is really easy.

All you have to do is:

- Get the file Topicdemo.amirx
- Copy it to Amirc:rexx
- Assign Amirc: if you haven't already done so ;)
- Eg Assign AmIRC: Data:AmIRC

OK?

1.5 usage

To use this script is very easy.

All you need to do is either :

- 1) Select the script from the REXX menu on AmIRC
- 2) Type /rx topicdemo

TIP

Why not try using an alias?

I use /t to put a new topic to the channel.

How do I set an alias then?

All you need to so is type:

```
/alias t topicdemo.amirx %p
```

That will enable you to randomly select a topic by only typing /t

Cool eh? ;-)
