1.2 What the heck is HLH?

Introduction

HotListHandler (HLH) will manage your hotlist!

My goal was to share one hotlist with all the browsers available for the Amiga.

If you use more than one browser then use HotListHandler.

If you stick with one browser, well, use it anyway.

Features

- o A nice toolbar
- o Easy to use
- o Supports many browsers
- o Share one hotlist with different browsers
- o Offers a QuickMenu for fastlinks
- o Creates an index when viewing the hotlist through a browser
- o Grab URL's from browsers (if the browser supports it via ARexx)
- o Edit the hotlist while off-line (create groups, add URL's, etc.)
- o Jump to any public screen
- o Totally font sensitive
- o And many more
- NEW Features in version 1.10
- o Search a Hotlist
- o Sort a Hotlist
- o HLH Toolbar Position Tooltypes
- o Print a Hotlist
- o Reload, Open, Load, and Save As menu items.
- o Support for the new Voyager, Voyager-NT
- o An ARexx port for program control
- Install HLH and see why it is so useful.

HotListHandler is Shareware, but it is not crippled in any way.

1.8 How to install HLH

Installation

Nothing terribly difficult. An Installer Script is provided to simplify your life. After all, that's what computers are supposed to be for! The Installer Script will use your Amiga's Install program. For those who are "Installer Impaired", here is what the script will do :) Copy HotListHandler to a convenient place on your drive. Set the HOTLIST ToolType in the icon if you like. Run an ARexx script contained in the "Extras" drawer if it finds an AddToHotlist hotlist in your AWeb drawer. After running the Installer: Use Icon Edit to change other ToolTypes as you see fit. See usage to run HotListHandler Register when you find that you cannot live without HLH.

1.9 How to use HLH

Usage

HotListHandler may be run from the Workbench or a CLI.

From WB, just double click on its icon.

You can set some tooltypes in the icon.

From the CLI, type the path (if necessary) and the name to start HLH.

You must specify a stack of at least 4096 bytes to successfully launch HLH.

HLH will also accept some CLI arguments .

Note that CLI arguments will override any tooltypes!

When you start HLH a toolbar will open on the default or named public screen.

If the pubscreen you have named is not open HLH will open on the system default pubscreen.

Before the toolbar is opened HLH will try to read a hotlist. HLH can read AWeb's hotlist format. It will use a similar format when saving, so AWeb can always display the hotlist on it's own. Check the browsers page to see if the browsers you use are supported by HLH.

ARexx can control HLH, so scripts can be written to support nearly any Amiga program.

Use the toolbar to open the various HLH windows .

When any HLH window is open you can access a menu.

When you see a URL you would like to add to your hotlist, open or move HLH to the same screen as your reader. It is then easy to grab or copy the link.

1.10 That funny looking thing at the top of your screen

Toolbar

When you start HotListHandler a toolbar will open on the default public screen, or, if you have set the tooltype and/or provided a CLI argument, on the specified public screen. If the pubscreen you have named is not open HLH will open on the default pubscreen. See the menu page for information on jumping to another pubscreen.

Use the ToolTypes to specify a position for the Toolbar. NEW

The toolbar will adapt itself to the screenbar height and has five image buttons; presented here from left to right.

QUIT To quit HLH, you will be warned if changes have not been saved.

OPEN This button will open the main window .

QM Open a QuickMenu for fastlinks.

SHOW Tells the browser (if running) to show your hotlist. HLH will also create an index for it.

QGRAB With this button you QuickGrab a URL from a browser (if running and if the browser supports it). If no other window of HLH is open, or no group is selected, the URLs are placed in a buffer . Later you can place these URLs in your hotlist.

1.11 HLH ARexx Commands

ARexx NEW

PortName = HLHANDLER

'addlink' TITLE/A/K, URL/A/K, GROUP/K, QM/S

Add a URL to the currently loaded hotlist.

TITLE is the name you wish to associate with the URL.

URL is the address of the page.

GROUP will add the URL to the named group. If the specified group does not yet exist it will be created.

If GROUP is not specified, AddLink will function like the QuickGrab button. The URL will be placed in the buffer .

QM will add the URL to the QuickMenu only if a GROUP is named.

Example: addlink TITLE '"Robert's Homepage"' URL "http://www.tip.nl/users/robertn"

'addgroup' /K

Add a new GROUP to the end of the current Hotlist.

Examples: addgroup "Companies"

addgroup '"Personal Homepages"'

'hotlist' LOAD/S, SAVE/S, FILE/K, FORCE/S

Load or save a hotlist.

LOAD without a FILE argument will reload the hotlist.

SAVE will save the current hotlist.

FILE will LOAD or SAVE the named FILE.

FORCE will not bring up a requester even if you have made changes to the hotlist. Any changes will be discarded.

Examples: hotlist LOAD FORCE

hotlist FILE "Work: Voyager/HLHandler.hotlist" SAVE

NOTE: The 'FILE' keyword works like the menu options 'Save as...' & 'Open'. HLH will use this path and filename the next time 'Load' or 'Save' are called.

'show' Displays the hotlist through the browser.

'quit' FORCE/S

Quits HLH.

FORCE will not bring up a requester even if you have made changes to the hotlist. All changes will be lost.

1.12 HLH Windows

Windows

Main Window Access the Main Program. Quick Menu To bounce to an often used web page. Edit Window Enhance and modify your HotList, edit your QuickMenu. Search Window Search your HotList. NEW Buffer Copies and Cuts are stored here.

Menu Technnincally not a window, but, when an HLH window is active, you have access to this with the right mouse button.

1.13 Where most of HLH's features are found

Main Window

+= This button will open the buffer window (see also QGRAB).

Parent NEW Go to the parent group if you are in a subgroup.

Up & Down buttons in the main window will allow easy rearrangement of your hotlist.

Cut & Copy place a URL in the HLH buffer, allowing you to select a group, or groups, to contain the URL.

Groups takes you up to the Hotlist Index.

Edit opens the edit window .

New will allow you to manually enter a URL.

Remove You can not get back what you have Removed, the URL or group is lost after clicking Remove!

Grab will grab the URL you are viewing and place it in the currently selected group. If no group is selected the URL will be placed in the buffer .

Search NEW Opens a search window.

Sort NEW Sort Groups or URLs.

About opens a standard Amiga requester.

Reload NEW Reload the hotlist, deleting any changes you have made.

Save to save your changes to disk.

Cancel to not save your changes.

You can use a Tooltype to have HLH open the MainWindow upon startup. NEW

1.14 The Fast way to GoTo a URL

QuickMenu

QuickMenu (QM) is a small window containing URLs which you have chosen to be (you guessed it!) quickly available, without having to go through the Groups in the Main Window or the browser's hotlist.

Clicking a name in the QuickMenu will tell the browser (if running) to go to this URL.

Remember it's a QuickMenu, one click on a URL is enough.

Click QM or the RMB to close this menu, or click another HLH window to close the QuickMenu.

Select or unselect the QM box in the edit window to control which URLs are contained in the QM.

1.15 How to modify your HotList

Edit Window

The Edit Window is reached from the Main Window .

The Edit Window is used to modify the Title or the URL, and to control the QuickMenu list.

Besides the standard Amiga gadgets the edit window has two text fields and four buttons.

Text:

Title so you can change the title of the URL which has captured your interest.

URL will allow you to keep up with the rapid changes of home page addresses.

Buttons:

QM will add or subtract this URL from your QuickMenu.

Accept will not close this window. This is very handy for adding new URL's or groups manually, as well as setting up your QuickMenu.

Accept & Close will do as stated.

Cancel will also do as stated.

Use the Main Window to SAVE your changes.

1.16 Where modifications are made

Buffer Window

The buffer window is accessed by opening the Main Window and clicking on the += button on the top right.

HLH's buffer is used to hold URLs which have been cut or copied from the Main Window.

It also can hold URLs which have been grabbed via the QuickGrab button or the ARexx command 'AddLink'.

Multiselect is supported when choosing URLs in the buffer window.

After selecting at least one URL in the buffer window, you can copy or move them into any group you desire.

NOTE: The buffer window does not hold URLs which have been REMOVED!

1.17 Search an HLH hotlist

Search Window
Ignore Case
Do not differentiate between upper and lower case characters
Wildcards
You can use standard AmigaDos wildcards to search your hotlist.
Only Whole Words
Because it doesn't make sense to use wildcards when searching on whole words, HLH will not even let you try it.
Search
HLH will search every URL for a match on names and links.
Next / Prev
allow you to walk through all the URLs that HLH has identified as a match.
Clear
Clear the search window.
Follow
will tell the current browser to go to this link!
Сору
will copy the URL to the selected group.
If no group is opened HLH will place the URL in the buffer (which works the same as the Grab button).
Cancel
Cancel the search and close the window.

1.18 Sort an HLH hotlist

Sort

Group

When a group has been opened HLH displays the URLs within this group.

All URLs in this group will be sorted.

Groups

If no group is selected, HLH will sort only the 'main' groups.

When a group has been selected, HLH will sort the subgroups one level deeper than the selected group. Note that you can Unselect a selected group with another click on it.

1.19 Use the right mouse button with HLH

Menu
Project
Reload NEW
Will reload the currently defined hotlist.
```

Open NEW

To open a new hotlist from a file selector.

Save

Save your hotlist by overwriting the last loaded hotlist.

Save As... NEW

Save your hotlist under a new name, via file requester.

Print NEW

Output your hotlist to PRT:

About

Will open an Amiga requester containing information about HotListHandler. This will look friendlier after you have registered ;)

Quit

Will quit HLH.

Settings

Browser Type>>

Using the menu you can set the browser type so HLH knows which command it has to use. See Browsers for the list of browsers HLH supports.

Note that HLH default settings are for AWeb.

Close on Follow

Toggle this on or off. When checked the HLH Main Window will close after a URL is double-clicked.

Active to Front NEW

Toggle this on to cause the active window to come to the front of your screen.

PubScreen

Choosing 'PubScreen' from the menu will present a submenu which includes all available pubscreens. It allows you to pick the public screen you want HLH to jump to.

This way you won't have to quit and restart HLH when you start and stop your browser. You can modify your hotlist and then run AWeb, or vica versa. This can also be handy when you are reading news or email.

1.20 How to Setup HLH
