# 1.2 BirdBase Help: Read this first!

This is the BETA version! To make things clear, this means that it ↔ is not the final release. I do not in any way guarantee that it is bug free. In fact, I suspect it is full of bugs. That is why it is a beta version. Your role becomes that of a tester. You use the program at your own risk and if you discover any bugs report them to me so I can fix them. So use it as you like, but be aware that you could/probably will unexpectedly lose all your data, especially if you do a lot of editing and deleting as I known those routines are a bit dodgy. Anyway report any bugs and make any suggestions and I will be very grateful.

Also if you've used J-Windows I would really like to hear from you as I am having no end of problems getting it to do what I want. The biggest problems at the moment are getting Amigaguide to open on the BirdBase window and getting the button keyboard shortcuts to work.

#### 1.4 BirdBase Help: Basic Principles

BirdBase is a program for maintaining your bird watching records. It uses four tables to hold your bird records. A species table, a sites table, a field-trips table and a lists table.

The species database is a complete list of British birds and comes supplied with the program. The sites database is unique to you and contains a list of all sites visited. The field-trips database holds data on your visits and the birds seen and the lists database holds your pre-defined lists. The databases are dependent on each other. For instance you can't enter a field-trip for Cley if you haven't already entered a site called Cley.

Once you have entered some data you can use the report facilities to search the database for particular records. For instance you could define a report for all records from Cley. If you wanted you could define a list for Cley and then you wouldn't have to keep typing in Cley, you could just select the list from the Lists Window. Because all your records are stored you can define new lists when ever you want and they will automatically be created from your existing records.

# 1.8 BirdBase Help: The Sites Database

The sites database holds data on the sites you have visited. You can enter the site and county.

# 1.9 BirdBase Help: The Field-trips Database

The field-trips database holds data on the trips you have been on. For each field-trip you can enter the date, time, site, weather and notes about the visit.

## 1.10 BirdBase Help: The Lists Database

This table holds your lists. Lists are summaries of your individual sightings. Lists are basically pre-defined reports and as such can be defined for dates, years, sites, counties and species.

## 1.11 BirdBase Help: The Species Database

BirdBase comes with a complete list of British birds. It follows the order of Voous (1977) and is the standard order in which birds are listed in most field guides.

## 1.13 BirdBase Help: Adding a new Field-trip

Adding a new Field-trip

1. Select NEW FIELD-TRIP from the CREATE menu or press Amiga-F.

Today's date will be automatically entered into the date text box but you can change it if you wish.

2. Enter the trip details into the text boxes.

The only text boxes which are compulsary are the date and site. The site must match one of your sites in the Sites database. If it doesn't a requester will warn you.

Entering sightings to your Field-trip

You will notice that there are two lists. The one on the left holds the complete species database and the one on the right holds the list of species for the current Field-trip.

1. Select one of the species from the Species List.

The bird you have just selected will then appear on the Trip List.

2. Repeat step 1 untill you have added all the sightings for the trip and then click on OK.

#### 1.14 BirdBase Help: Adding a new list

Adding a new list

1. Select NEW LIST from the CREATE menu or press Amiga-L.

A requester will come up from which you can define the list.

2. Enter the list name and search criteria and click on OK.

The list requester is identical to the report requester but you must make sure you enter a name for the list.

#### 1.15 BirdBase Help: Adding a new site

Adding a new site

1. Select NEW SITE from the CREATE menu or press Amiga-T.

A requester will come up from which you can enter the site details.

2. Enter the site details and click on OK.

## 1.16 BirdBase Help: Creating new files

Creating new files

1. Select NEW from the PROJECT menu or press Amiga-N.

All the current data will be wiped from memory allowing you to create completely new sites and trip databases.

# 1.17 BirdBase Help: Creating Reports

Creating Reports

1. Select CREATE REPORT from the REPORT menu.

The report requester will come up from which you can enter the search criteria.

2. Enter the search criteria and click on OK.

You can enter a name for the report if you wish but if you don't the search criteria will be used as the name.

#### 1.18 BirdBase Help: Deleting Field-Trips

1. Select FIELD-TRIPS from the WINDOWS menu.

A window will come up with a list of all of your field-trips.

2. Select the trip you wish to delete and click on the DELETE button.

The list requester which you used to enter the trip details will come up.

# 1.24 BirdBase Help: Entering sighting records

Entering sighting records

It is possible to enter details of numbers seen, age and sex. These can be entered while you are creating the filed-trip or added at a later date. To add record details make sure you are on the field-trip edit window.

1. Select the sighting you want to add details to from the trip list.

There are two buttons on the right of the window - Edit and Delete. When you click on a sighting these buttons will become enabled.

2. Click on the EDIT button.

The record requester will come up from which you can enter details of number seen, age and sex.

3. Enter the record details and click on OK.

#### 1.25 BirdBase Help: Importing reports

Select WORD PROCESSOR from the OUTPUT sub-menu on the REPORT menu.

# 1.26 BirdBase Help: Opening files

Opening files

1. Select OPEN from the PROJECT menu or press Amiga-O.

A file requester will come up.

2. Select the file you want to open and click on OK.

#### 1.27 BirdBase Help: Printing

Printing

- 1. Make sure your printer is on-line.
- 2. Select PRINT REPORT from the REPORT menu.

# 1.28 BirdBase Help: Quiting BirdBase

Quiting BirdBase

1. Select QUIT from the PROJECT menu or press Amiga-Q.

A requester will come up asking whether you are sure.

2. Click on YES or NO.

#### 1.29 BirdBase Help: Saving files

Saving files

1. Select SAVE from the PROJECT menu or press Amiga-S.

The Save option will be disabled if you have not already saved your file with the Save As option. Save will just re-save the file under the current name.

#### 1.30 BirdBase Help: Saving files as different names

Saving files as different names

1. Select SAVE AS from the PROJECT menu or press Amiga-A.

A file requester will come up.

2. Enter the name and path of the file and click on OK.

# 1.31 BirdBase Help: Saving reports

1. Select ASCII FILE from the OUTPUT sub-menu on the REPORT menu.

A file requester will come up.

2. Enter the name and path of the file and click on OK.

# 1.32 BirdBase Help: Setting the Word Processor

Setting the Word Processor

The path of the Word Processor to be used for outputting reports to is set by using tool types. If you don't know what tool types are look in the relevant section of your WorkBench manual. Here is a quick run down on how to set tool types.

- 1. Click on the BirdBase icon.
- 2. Select INFORMATION from the ICONS window or press Amiga-I.

A requester will come up showing information on the icon.

 Click on the NEW button and type "WORD=<path of your Word Processor>" and click on OK.

For example: WORD=DH1:APPS/FINALWITER/FINALWRITER

## 1.33 BirdBase Help: Viewing lists

Viewing lists

1. Select LISTS from the WINDOWS menu.

A window will come up with a list of all your lists.

2. Select the list you wish to view.

There are a number of buttons on the right of the window. When you click on a list these buttons will become enabled.

3. Click on the VIEW button.

#### 1.34 BirdBase Help: Hints and Tips

How can I speed up my reports? Create a new file for each year. This will keep the size of your files down to a minimum and will also keep the speed at which reports are created to an acceptable speed. Alternatively buy an accelerator. An 030 can make a lot of difference.

How can I enter different sites for one trip? If you want your reports to be more accurate for individual sites then create a new field-trip for each site visited during the day. If you are not too bothered about your site reports then you could create a site called something like "North Norfolk Coast" and use one field-trip for a day on the North Norfolk Coast.

#### How detailed do the records have to be? This is really up to you. To get the most complete set of records you must create a new field-trip for each site you visit during the day. If you want every sighting to be recorded you would have to enter all the birds you see at each site. So, for instance, if you saw a Blackbird at Cley in the morning and then again in the afternoon at Titchwell, you would enter two records for Blackbird. In practice this is a lot of effort. A good compromise is to enter a record for the first sighting only. So, enter all your records for Cley and then add any additional species you see at

Titchwell.

Exit BirdBase and return to Workbench.

Displays a dialogue box from which you can enter details about a new site.
