# **English WebWare's CacheViewer**

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If you use this software you are agreeing to the conditions in the "About" section of the programme.

## A Brief Description of CacheViewer

CacheViewer allows the user to select some or all of the text files and images in a folder and then cycle through each file displaying it while allowing easy filing in new folders.

These folders can be changed during the run time. CacheViewer can file with the old file name or allow a new name, and can either copy the file or move it.

This program is particularly suited to web browsing, as you can browse through your cache offline, making decisions as to where to file all the neat pictures that you have downloaded. The default folders can be accessed by simply clicking on the appropriate panel, and the image is stored automatically and the next one displayed.

Thus, for example you can take a cache of images and pick out all the pictures of ships that you like and put them into a file for later use. (Should you like ships) or you can delete those while keeping the rather nice pictures of bumblebees that you thought were fascinating at 2 a.m. last Monday morning.

The shareware version has limits; e.g. it will pick up very small images which in practice you may not want. The programme is time limited to 31 days usage. In the full version you will be able set minimum and maximum file sizes. There will also be the ability to rename the image, use the trash button and the programme will not be time limited.

#### **Removing CacheViewer**

In Windows 3.x simply delete the CacheViewer Folder. The process for Windows 95 and NT4 is slightly more complex. To start, Right Hand Mouse Click the Task Bar. Left Click on "Properties" Left Click on "Start Menu Programs" Left Click on "Remove" Left Click on "CacheViewer32" Left Click on "Remove" NT4 Only Left Click "Yes" to the "Are you sure..." question Left Click "Close" Left Click "Close" Left Click "OK" Finally, from the "Explorer" or "My Computer" locate the CacheViewer32 Directory. You can also locate this using find. Left Click on it and press the delete key to remove it.

# **Installation Instructions**

Simply unzip the file into a tempory folder. This will creat final characters and a file called setup.exe. From windows and follow the instructions.

This will create a list of files with undescore  $(_)$  From windows simply double click on setup.exe

# Setting up CacheViewer

Upon first starting up CacheViewer you will be asked to register your name. This will be used to create as your unique program ID. This name will be displayed in the Defaults and the about menu from now on, and will be needed if you choose to purchase the full product.

# **Registration**

## The Panels

Once downloaded you need to personalise your copy. Along the bottom are six 'boxes' or panels. These are shortcuts to folders in which you can place images you wish to keep. By double clicking on each panel the CacheViewer Panel Manager appears in which you may rename your panel and create a folder to place the images related to this 'box'. The name should be a handy mnemonic for you; it will not affect the folder name at all.

E.G. Path name -C:/Program Files/CacheViewer/Naval Ships Panel 1 Alias: Ships

This creates the panel 'Ships' linked to the new folder called Naval Ships. Now by clicking on this panel the image currently being displayed will be stored in the folder.

Repeat this for each panel, until you have all the panels set up, as you require. There is also a trash box already set up. Should you not need to use all of the panels then either ignore them, in which case they will point to the root directory, C: or point them to an already existing directory.

## **Load Path**

The 'path' is the source of images to be sorted. Commonly this would be images from the Internet but it could be any other source of images you choose. Simply progress through your drive until the correct folder is displayed. Double click on the chosen folder. All compatible images will then be displayed, allowing you to select which images for CacheViewer(c) to sort through. You can do this by holding the shift key down to define the start and end files, or "picking" individual files by holding down the CTRL key.

Alternatively click on Select All, and all images in this folder will be selected

You will find the graphics and text files that you have downloaded in folders called (generically) the cache. In Netscape Navigator, it is sufficient to click on the cache folder - however for Internet Explorer these files are hidden in the folder "Temporary Internet Files". To make them accessible either manually change the properties of the folders via "My Computer" so that they are neither read only nor hidden, or simply open up the folder "Temporary Internet Files" and click on the show hidden button.

You should ensure that you do not breach the copyright laws by copying files or pictures that you do not have permission to copy. Some file formats are also copyrighted and may not be used without the owners permission.

## Defaults

Defaults control the basic working of CacheViewer.

Most of the values here can not be changed in the shareware version. They are fully customisable in the Registered version.

#### File Sizes.

These can be set for each panel. Minimum and maximum values may be displayed. Most web pages are made up of a collection of little pictures as well as the HTML text. As you will quickly find, they simply take up space without being useful. By setting a filter of 5 to 10,000 bytes then no pictures of those sizes or smaller will be displayed. It is easy to forget that you have set a minimum picture size and wonder why so few pictures have been displayed! This particularly applies to the unregistered version where only files of 45,000 bytes or less can be displayed. It also particularly applies to the author (Simon Norburn) who spent 2 days trying to find out why his great piece of software had stopped working!

The maximum sizes can also be set. This is useful if you are short of disk space or wish to save to floppies. If you have plenty of space then simply set it to 1000000 or some other ridiculously large figure.

DO NOT set up a panel to point to your recycle bin or trash bin. This could damage it.

#### **Default locations**

Clicking on the work area with the left-hand mouse button sends all images to the appropriate default location. So if you wish all GIF files can be stored in one folder. These folders will need to be set up in File Manager or My Computer.

#### Rename

Select (tick) if you wish to rename the saved images (disabled in the Shareware version).

#### **Copy Files / Move Files**

These allow you to choose between the above (disabled in the Shareware version).

#### Warn Overwrite

Informs if you want a warning when you are going to overwrite an existing file.

#### **Product ID**

This is needed when ordering a full copy of CacheViewer

#### **Delay Time**

This is the interval between each image cycling through the viewer. It can be set here or in the main program, <u>Using CacheViewer</u>

#### **Using CacheViewer**

#### The Trash Button

A left hand click of this button destroys the file. It does NOT send it to the recycle bin, and the image can not be retrieved again. Use this button cautiously. A right hand click simply cycles to the next image, leaving the old file untouched in the cache. This button is disabled in the shareware version.

#### Delay

On the right hand side is a sliding column that determines the time in seconds between each new image being displayed (1 -300 sec's). HINT set to a high number. You should now have CacheViewer(c) set up to run now. Panels set up; Path loaded and any files unhidden. When you are ready to use CacheViewer(c) click on **Start**.

#### The Click Through Method:

The mouse is set up to enable you to quickly sort through your images. By simply clicking on a panel the picture or file displayed will be stored in the appropriate folder and the next image automatically displayed. Instead, a left-hand mouse button click on the image will store the image in an appropriate default folder. If you do not wish to delete the picture then a Right Hand Mouse click on the image or text will leave it in the cache, and load the next picture.

#### Alternatively:

Set delay to about 10 sec's. Only click on images that you wish to save. As before left hand mouse click to Default location or click on Panel required.

#### The Right-hand Mouse Button

The Right-hand mouse button will load the next picture, whilst doing nothing with the previous picture. It will stay in the cache and will neither be moved nor copied. This allows you to ignore a picture. (It could well be that you were sorting out pictures of planes, and this was a ship just shift click and ignore it). This will work if you click on either the picture or the trash button.

#### The "Fit image" Button

If the Image is too large for the viewing area then clicking on this button will force the image to fit into the available area. If the image is too small it will expand it to fit the available area. This frequently distorts the image and so this is automatically switched off when the next picture is loaded.
