Introduction

XPreview is an application which reads special resources embedded in QuarkXPress documents by the QuarkXPress XTension Preview Editor Lite. XPreview displays the vital statistics of the document, including the page size, number of pages, colors, fonts and imported pictures in the document. Additionally, the application allows the user to view thumbnail previews of each page of the document. The user may even print the information out or save it as a text file for later reference.

Minimum System Requirements

XPreview is network protected and is fully compatible with floppy, RAM, or hard disks.

This manual assumes that you are familiar with standard Macintosh procedures such as basic use of the mouse, clicking, pulling down menus, copying files, and copying disks. If any of these procedures are new to you, please refer to your Macintosh user s manual.

Installing XPreview

The XPreview disk that you have purchased contains a file named XPreview. To install XPreview, drag the file onto the computer s hard drive.

The XPreview disk that you have purchased contains the file Preview Editor Lite. To install Preview Editor Lite, drag the file into the same folder that contains the QuarkXPress application. <u>IMPORTANT</u>: If Preview Editor 2.0 is already present in the folder, do not install Preview Editor Lite. It may cause conflicts

After installing XPreview and Preview Editor Lite, place the original XPreview disk in a safe place.

The XPreview Dialog

XPreview allows the user to view vital information about a QuarkXPress document without opening the document with the QuarkXPress application. The XPreview dialog displays the document information in an organized manner.

The XPreview Dialog

Information shown on the XPreview dialog includes:

- Size Displays the page size of the current XPress document.
- Pages Displays the number of pages included in the current document.
- Colors list Lists the names of the colors used in the current document.
- Fonts list Displays the names of the fonts used in the current document.
- Pictures list Displays the path of all imported pictures in the current document.
- Page thumbnail A thumbnail depicting a page of the current document. If no preview is available for the current page, the page thumbnail display area displays a message indicating no preview is available.



- Page number controls Left and right arrow buttons allow the user to display the different pages of the current document in the page thumbnail display area. The page number of the page being displayed is shown between the left and right arrow buttons.
- Documents popup menu Allows selection from the documents whose preview information is currently loaded into the XPreview application. Selecting a document from the lists replaces the information in the XPreview dialog with the data about the newly selected document.

Opening a Document in XPreview

An XPress document file s preview data may be opened by the XPreview application one of two ways.

Using the Preview Document dialog Dragging a document onto the application

The first method which may be used to open a document s XPreview data requires that the XPreview application be already running. To start XPreview, double-click on the XPreview application icon in the Finder.



XPreview The XPreview icon


Once XPreview is active, select Preview Document from the File menu or enter command-O from the keyboard. A dialog appears, prompting the user to select the desired document. Once the document is selected, click the Open button to display that document s preview data.

The Preview Document dialog

The second way to open a document in XPreview is to drag the document onto the application in the Finder. To do this, click on the desired document and, holding down the mouse button, drag the document onto the XPreview application icon until the icon darkens, then release the mouse button. If the application is not already active, it launches, then the XPreview dialog appears, displaying the information about that document in its fields.


If the user attempts to open a document in XPreview which has not had any preview resources attached to it, XPreview displays an alert informing the user that the preview resources were not found.

Opening Multiple Documents in XPreview

Although the XPreview dialog only displays information about one document at a time, the application can load data about multiple documents into memory to be accessed with the Documents popup menu. The Documents popup menu is found on the right side of the XPreview dialog and allows the user to select from currently loaded documents.

Multiple documents may be loaded into XPreview using the same two methods used to open a single document. Either select Preview Document from the File menu and select additional documents to be previewed or drag one or more documents onto the XPreview application s icon in the finder. XPreview adds each newly loaded document to the Documents popup menu.

To view the document information for any document currently included in the Documents popup menu, click on the menu and drag the mouse to the desired menu item before releasing the mouse button.

Removing an Item from the Documents Popup Menu

XPreview allows the user to remove the currently selected item from the Documents popup menu. To remove the currently displayed document, choose the Remove Document item from the File menu. The currently selected document disappears from the Documents popup menu. If the document removed from the list is the only item, the entire XPreview dialog closes.


Printing XPreview Information

In addition to allowing the user to save XPreview information to a text file, the application also lets the user print out the same information. To print the XPreview information for all documents our rently listed in the Document popup menu, select Print from the File menu. Set the print options, then click the Print button.

The document which is output contains the same information XPreview saves to a text file: Each document s data is listed separately in the order the documents appear in the Documents popup menu. For a sample of how the printout will appear, see the next section, Saving XPreview Information to a Text File.

Saving XPreview Information to a Text File

The XPreview information for all currently loaded documents may be saved to a text file for later reference. To save the data, select Save from the File menu or press command-S. A dialog appears, prompting the user to enter a name for the text file and the location the file should be saved.

When the name has been entered for the file, click the Save button to save the text file to the indicated folder. The XPreview information is saved for all of the documents which currently appear in the Documents popup menu. Each documents information is listed separately, and the documents are listed in the order they appear in the Documents popup menu. An example of an XPreview data text file follows:

Picture Previews

XPreview can use picture previews which are applied to documents several ways. The previews which XPreview can interpret include:

Page previews created using the Preview Editor Lite Create Thumbnails preference or using the Preview Editor Create Thumbnails for Each Page feature. This creates page previews of each page of the XPress document.

Previews created by the Preview Editor XTension s Append Preview preference while the Create Thumbnails for Each Page feature is turned of f. This creates a preview of one select ed page of the document.

A page preview created using the Include Preview option found on the Save As dialog in QuarkXPress version 3.2. This creates a preview of the first page of the document.

If one of these methods is not used to create a page preview for the page currently being dis-

played in the XPreview dialog, the page thumbnail display area displays a message to indicate that no preview is available.



The No Preview Available message


XPreview Notes:

XPreview will only display previews for XPress documents that contain picture previews. The picture previews can be created by either Preview Editor or by checking the Include Preview check box in the QuarkXPress 3.2 Save File As dialog.

Preview Editor Lite

Preview Editor Lite adds information to the document s resource fork so that XPreview can display the document spages and vital information about the document such as colors, fonts and imported graphics used in the document. The Preview Editor Lite XTension works in the background, adding data to documents whenever the files are opened or saved.

The Preview Editor Lite preferences dialog allows the user to set the attributes of previews which are automatically added to each document created or saved while Preview Editor is loaded in QuarkXPress. To activate the Preview Editor preferences dialog, select Preview Editor from the Preferences hierarchical menu found under the Edit menu.

The settings of the controls on the Preview Editor Lite preferences dialog affect each document which is opened or created with XPress while the XTension is loaded, so make sure the preferences are set as desired. The controls found on the dialog include:

- Resolve Outdated Previews check box If this box is checked, Preview editor updates a document s preview information if it is outdated whenever the document is closed, even when the document is not saved. This helps ensure that a document which was altered on a computer which did not have Preview Editor installed has its PICT preview kept current.
- Create Finder Icon check box If this box is checked, Preview Editor Lite adds an icon to the XPress document so that when it is viewed in Finder, the icon displays a miniature of the document sfirst page.
- Add XPreview Information check box Checking this box causes Preview Editor Lite to add XPreview data to the resource fork of the document which includes the colors and fonts used in the document as well as the imported pictures in the document.
- Create Thumbnails check box This check box causes Preview Editor Lite to create a thumbnail-size preview for each page of the document. XPreview allows the user to display these thumbnails one at a time in the XPreview dialog.

Thumbnail Width and Length fields These fields allow the user to define the size of the thumbnails created by Preview Editor Lite. The thumbnail size is defined by the width and height of the thumbnail in units of pixels.

XPreview Notes:

Preview Editor Lite stores its information using the pnot resource. The pnot resource is standard for document preview information proposed by Apple Computer. The pnot data may be edited or created using resource editing applications such as ResEdit. The pnot resource format is available from Apple Computer.

The Create Thumbnails option set in the Preview Editor Lite Preferences dialog can significantly add to the time it takes to save a document. It is recommended the Create Thumbnails For Each Page check box be left unchecked unless the user plans to use XPreview on the documents being created or edited. Turning this option of f saves both time and storage space, since the thumbnails add to the size of the XPress document. It is <u>not</u> necessary to check the Create Thumbnails for Each Page check box to generate a finder icon.
