Extensis ships CyberViewer for Netscape Navigator

Innovative Web utility adds convenience and functionality to Web browser

December 3. CyberViewer is a freeware utility that adds functionality to the Netscape Navigator Web browser by maintaining a comprehensive visual history of locations users have visited on the World Wide Web. After visiting pages on the World Wide Web, users can conveniently drag the thumbnail images from the CyberViewer palette to the Netscape Navigator Bookmark Window to bookmark specific Web pages. In addition, images can be dragged from CyberViewer to the Finder to create files which launch Netscape Navigator and display the selected Web page.

Fetch 1.5 for PowerPC Ships

Popular media database application gets performance boost, new drag-and-drop capabilities and support for additional file formats

November 26. Extensis has shipped Fetch 1.5, an upgrade to its industry-standard media database application. Extensis recently acquired Fetch 1.2 from Adobe Systems, Inc. and rebranded the product as Extensis Fetch 1.2 on August 1, 1996. The new version, Fetch 1.5, addresses the primary requests of users by providing significant performance increases on Power Macs, new drag-and-drop features, support for additional file formats and improved searching and keyword capabilities. For instance, users can drag files from Fetch into QuarkXPress and other applications that support drag-and-drop, such as PageMaker 6.5 and ClarisWorks.

Extensis Fetch 1.5 will be available in November of 1996 for an estimated street price of \$99.95. Upgrades from Adobe Fetch 1.2 will be \$29.95, or free for users who purchased Extensis Fetch 1.2 on or after August 1, 1996. The Content Publisher's Toolkit, which enables digital stock publishers to provide image catalogs with a read-only version of Fetch, will be available for \$495.00 annually, for an unlimited number of titles.

PhotoTools 1.0 for Adobe Photoshop

New collection of plug-ins combines productivity tools with useful special effects

September 16. Extensis Corporation has shipped PhotoTools 1.0, the most comprehensive collection of productivity tools and useful special effects for Adobe Photoshop users. PhotoTools has been awarded the Computer Artist Best of Year Award and has been nominated for a MacUser Eddy award. While some of the components represent major improvements over existing products, other features are completely new to the Photoshop market. PhotoText, for example, enables users to create and format text with WYSIWYG control within Photoshop. The other seven components in PhotoTools 1.0 include: PhotoShadow, PhotoGlow, PhotoEmboss, PhotoBevel, Intellihance Lite, PhotoBars and PhotoTips.

Extensis Tips of the Day!

The following are tips for the leading graphics applications written by industry gurus:

QuarkXPress: Keep Document Settings - by David Blatner

When you open a document, QuarkXPress sometimes asks you if you want to keep a document's preference settings or use the current QuarkXPress settings. You can press Keep Document Settings by typing command-period.

Photoshop: Temporary Wand - by Deke McClelland

You can temporarily access the wand tool when the lasso or marquee tool is active by pressing and holding the control key. This means you can quickly add a range of similarly colored pixels by shift-control-clicking, or subtract pixels by command-control-clicking.

Illustrator: The Vanishing Palette - by Ted Alspach

If you would like a palette to go away after you've entered text within it, hold down the command key and press return. This only works when either the text field is highlighted or if there is a blinking cursor inside of it.

PageMaker: Palette Shortcuts - by Olav Kvern

Hold down Command (Macintosh) or Control (Windows) as you click on an item in any of these 3 palettes (Style, Color or Script) to edit that item. To create a new style, hold down Command (Macintosh) or Control (Windows) and click "No Style." To create a new color, hold the key down and click "Black," or "Registration" in the Colors palette.

CyberPress: Easily add content - by Glenn Fleishman

You can add information to your CyberPress page without affecting the look of your QuarkXPress document. Simply create a text or picture box on the document's pasteboard and add it to the CyberPress Content List.

Fetch 1.5: Assigning Keywords - by Sandee Cohen

Many people don't realize that you can assign keywords to multiple items at the same time in Fetch. Using the shift key, you can select a range of items; in combination with the command key, you can select noncontiguous elements. Bringing up the keyword dialog allows you to enter one or more keywords; click apply, and they're assigned to all the images and documents selected. And now, with Extensis Fetch 1.5, you can delete keywords from multiple items in a catalog as well.
