Usage

Adding catalogs:

1. Put the CD/(HD :-) you want to make a catalog of in drive.
2. Select 'ADD Catalog'.
3. Enter name of the catalog
4. Select kind of Catalog
 - 4.1 Index-file : Disks will be scanned recursive and files and their path are saved.
 - 4.2 Description-file : This is a document with the following format:

If there is no space between file and description it is not possible to search this file in index-catalogs. It is also not good to have spaces in the filename. The reason is the same.

5. Choose packmode

- 5.1 Heavy : Only recommended for 040 Amigas(tm) (quota 40-50%)
- 5.2 Medium : Is possible for 030 Boards (quota 30-40%)
- 5.3 Light : Very fast packmode (quota 5-15%)
- 5.4 None : Faster than light packmode (quota 0%)

NOTE : Using a packmode slows down the search of a file very much.
Use this only if you have a fast computer, less space on disk or use Cataloger not very often.

6. If you want more Catalogs go to point 1

Deleting Catalogs:

Select Catalog you want to delete and press 'Del Catalog'

Searching a file:

Add with help of 'Add' and 'Del' catalogs to the Search Catalogs-list and enter a string to search. Now press 'Start Search' and wait.

NOTE: The entered string will be searched as a part of a file.
No wildcards are defined and will be used.

Another possibility to locate a file is by clicking a search-result in the

description area. You will be asked if you want to search this entry in the selected index-catalogs. After scanning these the search-result in the description area will NOT be lost.

You can choose to search only in description-catalogs, only in index-catalogs or in both by clicking the wanted button.

If the 'add to current result' checkbox ist selected new search-results will be added to the current displayed.

'Add All' and 'Del All' adds or deletes all catalogs to/from the Search Catalog-list.

Preferences

Packer List:

New:

Add new Packer with 'New'.

Modify the new entry. Use this format:

.xxx(x)|packer {f}

e.g. ".lha|lha x {f} ram:"

{f} - this point represents the selected entry in the found list.

Del:

Deletes the selected entry.

Checked Check-Boxes show that the ability will be used on found files.

Copy Files to :

Select the path where you want your selected found files be copied.

Texteditor :

Select you favorite Texteditor/viewer that will be used to try to view selected found files.

Save Search-Catalogs:

Saves the current Search-Catalogs List.

Save:

Saves the defined Prefs and all window-positions.

Use:

Use the defined Prefs.

Cancel:

Ignore changes made to Check-Boxes, Copypath and Textviewerpath.

Cataloger saves the Window-positions on exiting.

History of Cataloger

V2.71(18.02.96)

- small bugs in search routine removed
- added search selection
- added menu to search-window

V2.67(29.01.96)

- Fixed problem with ASL-requester(Scanning after index reading now possible without system-crash(happens sometimes))
- After viewing a text-file with path longer than 80 chars some horrible things happend. This is now fixed

V2.65:(25.01.96)

- Starting from CLI is possible.
- Zero-blocks removed
- ASCII-Description-files can now be:
 - copied from other locations(and used)
 - scanned (by clicking on entry file is located in Index-cats)
- Index-Files and description-files can be packed
- Handlewindow opens on file selection
- Usage of other languages now possible
- Ugly assign icon is now removed

V2.14:(21.12.95)

Possible to click on found File and the following things will be tried:

- View File as Text with selected Viewer
- Copy File to selected Path

V1.85: Scrolling with keys in Found-List now possible.

Added some Auto-Activates.
