Filters

To select which cards to view or print:

In the Filters window, the card type is always visible. You can scroll through the list to display the card type you want.

To select an item:

Do one of the following:

Point to a card type and click the mouse button.

Or press the up or down arrow key and press the space bar to select or deselect a card type.

In addition you can select which cards are displayed or printed by doing the following:

Point at one or more of the option buttons and clicking the mouse button.

The option buttons toggle as follows:

- X's include
- Blanks exclude
- Gray means don't care

The options are as follows:

- Wanted
- Tradable
- Quantity greater than zero (0)

Closing Filter:

Do one of the following:

Click the OK button

Or click the Cancel button.

Or Press ESC.

Reports

To choose a Report topic:

Click the green underlined topic you want to view.

Or press TAB to select the topic. Then, press ENTER. When the pointer is over the topic, the pointer changes to a hand icon.

Reports are displayed and printed in the order that is decided by the current index.

Display

This feature displays a scanned card's image. Any scanning software and hardware combination which generates a Windows Bitmap (BMP) file should work. The scanned image needs to be in BMP format with a file size of less than 64k.

To display a card image:

1. Select the card you want to display by pressing the **NEXT** or **PREV** button.
2. Select the Display screen by pressing the **DISPLAY** button.

To add a card image:

1. Select the card you want to display by pressing the **NEXT** or **PREV** buttons.
2. Select the Display screen by pressing the **DISPLAY** button.
3. Add the name of the card's image file in the box under the "Front" or "Back" display areas. The file name should include the BMP file extension. The card's image file should be stored in the directory specified by the Image Directory.

Info

This default screen displays information about a card.

To display a card's information select the INFO button from the display screen.

Value

Displays the current value of your card collection, by either complete sets or partial sets.

A complete set would be one number of each card issued by a particular manufacturer in a particular year, an example, 1972 Topps "set."

Performance

Displays on the screen a report. This report shows the current performance of your collection by complete or partial sets.

A complete set would be one card of each number card issued by a particular manufacturer in a particular year, an example, 1972 Topps "set."

Directories

All the directories are specified with full path names. A full path name includes the drive, root, and any sub directory names.

For example, "C:\DATABASE\" is the full path name of the default Images directory.

Database:

The Database directory is specified by fully qualifying the path where the information about the cards is stored.

Images:

The Images directory is specified by fully qualifying the path where the images of the cards are stored.

Master:

This is where this program and help files are located on your computer.

Important Note:

Changes to the directories take effect when you exit and restart WinCard® 2.01c.

The program name,

Copyright date,

Version number,

Information About Computer:

1. Mode -- Standard, Real or Enhanced
2. Memory Free (in KB)
3. Math Co-Processor: Present or Not

Help on Help

If you are new to Microsoft Help,

choose Help on Help then

choose Help Basics.

Search

This is probably a quicker way of using the Help's Search button. By selecting this option you are placed within Help where the Search dialog box is displayed

To search for a Help topic do the following:

Type the word or phrase you want to locate in the text box.

Select the Show Topics button.

Help displays all the topics that corresponds with the keyword in a list box.

Select the topic you want to look at. If you need to, use the scroll bar to view more topics.

Choose the Go To button.

Add

To add a card:

Do one of the following:

Select a card that is close to the new card you are adding and make the necessary changes

Or select CLEAR from the FILE menu to present a blank card and enter all the necessary changes.

Next do one of the following:

Select "Add" from the File menu

Or the ADD button.

The card is now added to your database.

When adding a new set:

1. Select "Add New Set" from the set combo box.
2. A dialog box will be displayed and allow you to enter the new set name.
3. The new set is now added to your database.

Unregistered User Note: You are limited to adding 50 cards in the unregistered version only.

Update

To update a card:

1. Select the card you want to update by pressing NEXT or PREV
2. Change all the information required for the card,
3. Select "Update" from the File menu.
4. The card that was selected has now been updated on your database.

Delete

To delete a card:

1. Select the card you want to delete by pressing NEXT or PREV buttons.
2. Select "Delete" from the File menu.
3. The card that was selected has been deleted from your system.

To delete an unused set:

1. Select the Set you want to delete.
2. Select "Delete Set" from the set combo box.
3. The selected set has been removed from your database.

Clear

To clear a card:

Select "Clear" from the File menu. This clears all information from a card.

Note: This does not delete the card you were viewing when you selected "Clear."

Reset Scan

Reset Scan will display the first card based on the index you selected.

To reset the scan:

Select "Reset Scan" from the File menu.

Cards will now be viewed in order you specified starting with the first card based on your index selection.

Change Index

Changing the index allows you to change the order in which the cards are viewed. Then when pressing the NEXT or PREV buttons the cards are ordered by your index selection.

To change the index:

1. Select "Change Index" from the File menu.

2. The indexes that you can choose from are:

Common Player Name

Or Number

Or Grade

Or Current Price

3. To complete your index selection:

Select the "OK" button to change the index.

Or select the "Cancel" to keep the current index.

Totals

To display totals:

Select "Totals" from the File menu.

The totals are then displayed.

The totals consist of:

- total number of cards in your collection including duplicates

- total number of cards that are unique in your collection

- total number of sets currently within your collection.

When you are done viewing the totals in your collection, press the OK button.

Print

To print report:

1. Select "Print" from the File menu.
2. The report will then be printed on the default print as defined by your system.

Note: If "Print" selection is currently dimmed you need to first select a report to print.

Exit

To exit the program:

1. Select "Exit" from the File menu.
2. You are now at the program manager.

Grade

The grade is decided by:

MT (Mint)

The card is:

perfect
the photo, drawing or printed information is centered
borders appear parallel borders to the naked eye
all four corners of the card are sharp and square
there are no:

creases
edge dents
surface scratches
paper flaws
loss of luster
yellowing or fading
all of the above despite the age

NR MT (Near Mint)

The card is:

nearly perfect card
at first glance, appears perfect, but upon closer examination, a minor flaw is discovered
well-centered card will have three of the four corners must be perfectly sharp
only one corner showing minor flaw upon close inspection
slightly off centered card with one or more borders being clearly unequal

EX (Excellent)

The card is:

has all the corners reasonably sharp with only moderate wear
borders may be off centered
has no creases
may have very minor gum, wax or product stains, front or back
surfaces may show slight loss of luster from rubbing across other cards.

VG (Very Good)

The card is:

shows visible handling
corners are rounded
the card may show minor creases
the surface of the card may show a loss of luster
all the printing is intact
may show major gum, wax or other packaging stains
has no major creases, tape marks or extraneous markings or writing
generally, the card shows honest wear.

G (Good)

The card is:

- well-worn
- shows no intentional damage or abuse
- may have major or multiple creases
- corners are rounded well beyond the boarder

F (Fair)

The card is:

- displays excessive ware
- may show damage or abuse
- has all the characteristics of a Good card
- may show signs of tape, paste, or holes
- may have small tears around the edges
- may have creases that it breaks the cardboard
- the back may have pencil or pen marks
- the back may have small sections missing
- generally, the card is intact

P (Poor)

The card is:

- dead
- extremely not breathing
- if you are squeamish do not look

Note: There are several intermediate grades. These cards sometimes have the characteristics of a lower grade but have enough good qualities of the higher grade.

The Number

This is the number that the manufacturer assigned to a card. This was to simplify collecting of complete sets. However, not every set bears card numbers.

Common Player Name

Placing a player's full name on the front of the card has been a common practice since the 1920's. Before that, the player's last name and team were the means of identifying the player.

Quantity

The number of cards you own or would like to own.

Grade

The condition of the card you own or would like to own.

Current Price Each

This is the dollar amount you may receive if you sold this card today.

Purchase Price

This is the actual price you paid for this card.

Gain/Loss

This is the difference between what you bought the card for and the dollar amount you might get if you sold this card today.

Set Name

This is the name that the manufacturer assigned to a set. This was to simplify collecting and identifying complete sets.

To Date Return As A Percentage

This return shows the total percentage of return on your investment while you owned the card.

Annualized Return

The annualized return shows the average annual total return on your investment while you owned the card. This may be helpful in comparing to other investments also.
