



Graphics Gallery

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Introduction

Graphics Gallery is an application designed to help you find, organize, display, and print your picture files.

Multiple picture files are displayed in a re-sizeable gallery which you can organize, sort, delete, and save to a file as a group so you can view them all again.

It can create and save thumbnail size picture files to decrease the time it takes to view lots of images.

You can run a slide show from the gallery or a list of picture files.

It will display many different kinds of picture file types such as TIFF, GIF, JPEG, PICT, PhotoCD, FLF, Raster, Targa, Bitmap, and more.

Quick Start

Overview

To begin using Graphics Gallery double click on the icon in Program Manager created by GGSS SETUP.EXE or double click on GGSS.EXE in File Manager.

To display pictures in the gallery you must select a drive and directory containing the pictures you want to view. First click on the desired drive the picture files are in. Then double click on the directory you wish to show. This will show all files matching the set pattern in the file list box. Then click on the picture names in the file list box using the left mouse button.

You may also select a range of file names by dragging over the file list and holding down the left mouse button or holding down the shift key and clicking the file names with the left mouse button or a scattered selection with the ctrl key and the left mouse button.

You can then click on the show selected pics button or use the select all files button. Both of these options are also available as a menu selection.

This will display a thumbnail of the picture files selected in the file list box along with their file names. You can click on the scroll bar to scroll the slides. Click the top or bottom scroll arrow for a row at a time scroll, or click on the scroll bar for a page scroll.

If you want to save the gallery image group, use the Save option from the File menu. This will save the image names to an .SSG file and image thumbnails so you can display the gallery image group again.

Supported Graphic File Formats

Other Options:

- You can search multiple subdirectories using the Find File option. The Find File List can be transferred to the Gallery list.
- To run a Full Screen Slide Show of the gallery, you can click on the Slide Show Button.
- To see the picture in a graphics viewer application you can double click on the picture in the gallery or use the TOOLS:GRAPHICS VIEWER LINK Menu. This needs to be defined on the GGSS setup form first.
- To see the picture in a graphics editor application you can use the TOOLS:GRAPHICS EDITOR LINK Menu. This needs to be defined on the GGSS setup form first.
- Use the OPTIONS: SETUP Menu to change the number of thumbnails the gallery will display. You can also change the thumbnail size using the GALLERY: THUMBSIZE SETTING Menu.

Tips

1. To show the selected files in the file list box as thumbnails on the gallery you click on the Show Selected or Show All buttons. You can also do this from the OPTIONS menu. You can also show a file in the file select box by double clicking on it or using the right mouse button and drag-drop.

2. You can create Gallery files that save all of the Gallery picture names so you can open them all again. Gallery file menu options include: new, open, close, save, save as, and append. There is also a Gallery File Open button on the Graphics Gallery window.

3. Maximum number of picture files listed in the file select list is 600.

4. Graphics Gallery settings are stored in the GGSS.INI file. Setup options are stored at the first time startup and when you click the OK button on the setup form. Window position settings are stored when you exit GGSS.

5. The Graphics Gallery screen can be moved and resized. The new position and size will be saved when you exit Graphics Gallery. The size will also change when you change the size of the gallery or thumbnails.

6. The default file extension pattern is initially set to all valid picture types.

7. When you double click on a thumbnail in the gallery you will be taken to the graphics viewer program with that picture loaded (if one has been defined). Otherwise, you will be show the selected image as full size.

8. When you single click on a thumbnail image in the gallery you can see the full directory and file name at the bottom of the gallery.

9. Click the right mouse button over the gallery for a pop-up menu.

10. You can activate help at anytime with F1. Help will be displayed for the function you are currently working with. You can also get help from the HELP MENU and HELP toolbar button.

11. When you have highlighted file names in the file list box, you can hold down the right mouse

button and drag the files over the gallery. This will create thumbnails of the selected files in the gallery.

12. To control a Slide Show using the mouse: Left mouse click to end the slide show. Right mouse click to advance one slide.

13. To control a Slide Show using the keyboard: ESC key to end the slide show, Space Bar to advance on slide, F8 to transfer the current slide to the viewer program.

14. To uninstall Graphics Gallery you can run the UNINSTAL.BAT file which came with the program. This will delete the GGSS files from your hard drive. You will need to delete the Program Manager icons yourself.

NOTE: If you are using Windows '95 you should not use the UNINSTAL.BAT. It is best to use the Add/Remove Software Wizard on the Control Panel which will install and uninstall software loaded with Windows '95.

Find File

Use Find File from the menu or the GGSS form button to search for your picture or Gallery files. You can designate the directory and pattern to search. All subdirectories will be searched and the files will show in the find list box.

You can select the files from the find list box you want to be transferred to the Graphics Gallery file list box or, if you do not select any, all files will be transferred when you click on the "Use File List" button.

Selections from the find list box can be made by clicking on the file you want or holding down the Ctrl key and clicking the files you want, or holding down the Shift key and clicking the group of files you want.

Slide Show Options

Overview

Slide Show allows you to display images stored in the gallery or file list as full or custom size pictures on your screen; at a pre-set interval, size, and background color.

Slide Show From Gallery: First, you build a gallery of pictures from any directory. While building the gallery make sure the "Keep existing graphics after loaded" from the SETUP form is checked. Also, make sure the "Slide Show From Gallery" option is checked. You can get to Graphics Gallery SETUP from the Options Menu. Put the pictures in the gallery in the same order you want to view them during the slide show.

Slide Show From File List. If you want to show a lot of pictures, this is your best bet since building all the thumbnails may take a while. Use the OPTIONS:SETUP menu and select "Slide Show From File List". Select the directory with the images you wish to view or from Find Files until they display in the file list. Then, when you select slide show, it will run through all the file names in your file list.

You initiate a Slide Show with the Slide Show button on the form, or using the OPTIONS menu.

To end the slide show just press the ESC key or F9.

Setup: Slide Show

Slide Show From

You have the option of using the gallery images or all picture files listed in the file list box for your slide show. Using the files in the list box will save you the time of loading them all into the gallery, but they will not be saved to use again.

Display Size

The size settings allow you to determine how the pictures will show during full screen display or slide show. You can set it to picture size or screen size.

Background Color

You can set the background color that will show during the full screen display or slide show. Click on the Background Color button and a Windows color grid will display. Select a color by clicking on it and then click the OK button. The Background Color button text will display with the currently selected color.

Position/Size

You can set the position and size of the display screen during a slide show. Selecting "Full Screen" will enlarge the background color over the entire display. Selecting "Set Position/Size" allows you to set the upper left hand corner of the display along with the size of the display. These settings are shown below the option. To change the settings, click on the "Custom" button next to this option. This will open a Custom Size Dialog Box.

Custom Settings

You can customize the size of the display by entering the Width and Height on the Custom Settings Dialog Box. These measurements are in screen twips. This starts at 0,0 in the upper left hand corner and goes to your screen size in the lower right hand corner. Your screen size is shown at the bottom of the dialog box.

The position of the display can be set to a pre-set location (centered, upper left, etc...) or you can enter the Top and Left position of the upper left hand corner of the display.

Slide Show Timer

The timer can be used during a slide show for automatic viewing or turned off for manual viewing. You can set the number of seconds delay between showing each picture. Enter the seconds in the input box or slide the control to adjust the time.

The timer can be overridden by the manual controls. See [Gallery Short Cut Keys](#).

Gallery Options

You have control over how the gallery will be displayed. You can set the follow display information:

Clear Gallery

This option will clear the contents of the gallery.

Sort Gallery

You can sort the gallery images in ascending or descending order by file name. These options are located on the Graphics Gallery Menu. You must save the gallery file after sorting to retain the sort order. You can use the gallery sort option to clear out gallery images that have been deleted.

Delete Gallery Picture

This option will delete the currently selected gallery picture from the gallery. You can also do this by clicking on a Gallery picture to selected it and pressing the Delete Key. This option does not delete the file from your system, just from displaying on the Gallery. You must SAVE the .SSG Gallery file for the change to be saved in the current .SSG file.

Title Alignment

Determines how the image file name will be displayed in the gallery.

Cell Spacing

Determines how far apart the images will be displayed in the gallery.

Determines how the image borders will be displayed in the gallery.

- Simple Frame
- None

Show Scrollbar

When you display more than the viewable number of images in the gallery, you need to use the gallery scrollbars to navigate between thumbnails. Usually you just need the horizontal scrollbar. It is possible to set up the gallery to display hidden thumbnails to the right instead of the bottom of the gallery. In this case you need the Vertical scrollbar.

Thumbsize Setting

Determines how large the thumbnail image will be displayed in the gallery. After a thumbsize change, you may need to adjust the number of viewable thumbnails using the Gallery Size option of Setup.

Gallery Save

You can save the current gallery picture group to a file using the Graphics Gallery FILE:SAVE menu. A list of the current Gallery pictures will be saved to a file with the extension .SSG. This file can be opened again and the Gallery will display all pictures in the file list.

Gallery set options include: new, open, close, save, save as, and append.

Gallery Printing

You have three options when printing the Gallery. You can print all pictures in the Gallery as thumbnail images. You can print all pictures in the Gallery full size, one per page. Or you can print the entire Graphics Gallery form, which will include the file select box and path information with the displayed gallery pictures. You can select these options from the Graphics Gallery FILE menu.

Print Gallery Dialog

The Print Gallery Dialog is displayed when you select Print Gallery from the Graphics Gallery Menu. It allows you to define how you want the gallery images to print. .

Number of Thumbnails

- The user can define how many pictures you want to show Vertically and Horizontally on the page.

Size

- The user can define the size of each thumbnail either in inches or a percentage.

Printer

- Shows you your Windows default printer name. You can change this using the Windows control panel.

Halftone

- TYPE - Angle Dot should be the default for standard printing. The other halftone types will create special effects during printing.
 - Angle Dot
 - Flat Dot
 - Angle Line
 - Horz Line
 - Vert Line
 - Error Diffusion
 - Threshold
 - Printer Halftone
- SCREEN SIZE
 - This option will show a number ending with lpi (lines per inch). The numbers will vary depending on the graphic resolutions supported by your printer. The higher the number, the better the resolution.

Screen Saver

The Graphics Gallery Screen Saver option allows you to run the currently selected Windows screen saver from the Graphics Gallery program. To run, click on the OPTIONS: RUN WINDOWS SCREEN SAVER menu in Graphics Gallery.

Setup

The Graphics Gallery Program Settings Dialog allows you to control how some program functions will work. These settings are saved in the GGSS.INI file. They will be used each time you run one of the applications.



Set Windows Wallpaper

From Graphics Gallery you can set your Windows Wallpaper.

First you bring up the .BMP file you wish to make your Windows Wallpaper. If you have a picture in another format, you would need to convert it to a palette/.BMP format (which is required for Windows wallpaper) using software like [Graphics VP Deluxe](#) from SkiSoft Shareware. Next you select the thumbnail on the Gallery and click on the OPTIONS: SET WINDOWS WALLPAPER menu in Graphics Gallery.

Graphics Viewer

This menu option allows you to jump to the graphics viewer program of your choice using the currently selected picture in the gallery.

If this is left blank, then selecting this option from the menu or double clicking on an image in the gallery will display the image full size using a full size screen.

To define the directory and file name of the viewer program, use the Graphics Gallery OPTION:SETUP Menu. Your Graphics Viewer program must accept a file name as a passed parameter for this to work.

SkiSoft Shareware sells two viewer products made to work with Graphics Gallery. Graphics View/Print or Graphics VP Deluxe are available to download as shareware from CompuServe or America Online. If you do not have access to these services, we will be happy to mail a copy to you.

Jumping back to Graphics Gallery

When you jump back to Graphics Gallery from Graphics View/Print or Graphics VP Deluxe, it will bring back into focus the current running GGSS application if it exists. Otherwise it will open a new copy of GGSS.

Graphics Editor

This menu option allows you to jump to the graphics editor program of your choice using the currently selected picture in the gallery. You need to define the directory and file name of the editor using the Graphics Gallery OPTION:SETUP Menu. Your Graphics Editor program must accept a file name as a passed parameter for this to work.

A good default editor program is Paint Brush, which comes with Windows 3.x. For example you would enter: `c:\windows\pbrush.exe` in the Graphics Editor text box on the Graphics Gallery setup dialog.

Menu: File

NEW GALLERY .SSG FILE

This will clear the existing Gallery pictures and set up a new "untitled" Gallery file.

OPEN GALLERY .SSG FILE

Use to open an existing Gallery file with the extension .SSG.

CLOSE GALLERY .SSG FILE

This will close the existing Gallery file. Changes will be lost if you do not save first.

SAVE GALLERY .SSG FILE

Use to save the gallery images to an existing Gallery .SSG file name. If the name is still "untitled" you will be prompted to give it a name. Thumbnail files will be created as specified in Gallery Setup.

SAVE GALLERY .SSG FILE AS

Use to save the gallery images to a new Gallery .SSG file or change the name of an existing one. Thumbnail files will be created as specified in Gallery Setup.

APPEND GALLERY .SSG FILE

This will append the images in a Gallery .SSG file to the existing gallery images.

PRINT GALLERY AS THUMBNAILS

Prints all pictures in the gallery in their thumbnail size. A print dialog shows first in order to make the printing settings.

PRINT GALLERY FULL SIZE

Prints all pictures shown in the gallery on separate pages. You are given the choice of seeing the print setup dialog for each picture or once where the setup options will apply to each picture.

PRINT FORM

Prints the entire Graphics Gallery form. This gives you a print of the file directory along with the thumbnails.

PRINTER SETUP

Use to select the printer and printer options before printing gallery images.

EXIT

Exits the Graphics Gallery (GGSS) application.

Menu: Options

SETUP

Displays a tabbed dialog box which allows you to set GGSS options. Screen Settings, Slide Show, Gallery Size, Graphics Links.

SHOW SELECTED

Will display the selected files in the file list box as thumbnails in the gallery. A Show Selected button is also available on the Graphics Gallery Window.

SHOW ALL FILES

Will display all of the files in the file list box as thumbnails in the gallery. A Show All button is also available on the Graphics Gallery Window.

FULL SCREEN SLIDE SHOW

Turns on the full screen slide show which displays the pictures in the gallery one after the other based on settings from Graphics Gallery Setup.

FIND FILES

Brings up a find file dialog you can use to search for graphic files in more than one subdirectory. These can be selected and transferred to the Graphics Gallery file list.

SET WINDOWS WALLPAPER

Uses the currently selected gallery image as Windows Wallpaper. This is a permanent change.

RUN WINDOWS SCREEN SAVER

Runs the currently setup Windows Screen Saver.

Menu: Gallery

CLEAR GALLERY

Use to clear all pictures from the Gallery.

SORT GALLERY DESCENDING

Re-arrange the gallery pictures in descending order based on file name.

SORT GALLERY ASCENDING

Re-arrange the gallery pictures in ascending order based on file name.

DELETE GALLERY PICTURE

Use to remove the selected gallery picture from the gallery. You can also use the Delete Key. Use Sort Gallery or Save to eliminate no picture symbol from gallery display.

TITLE ALIGNMENT

Changes how the thumbnail filenames are displayed in the gallery. You can choose from; Top or Bottom left, centered, or right alignments.

CELL SPACING

Changes how the thumbnails are spaced apart in the gallery. You can choose from; 0, 1, 5, 10, or 20.

CELL STYLE

Changes how the thumbnails look in the gallery. You can choose from gray 3D in, gray 3D out, simple frame, or none.

SHOW SCROLLBAR

Changes scrollbars on the Gallery. Choose from none, horizontal, vertical, or both.

THUMBSIZE SETTING

Changes the size of the thumbnails in the Gallery. Choose from small, medium, and large.

Menu: Tools

GRAPHICS VIEWER LINK

Allows you to jump to your favorite graphics viewer program using the selected image in the Graphics Gallery. SkiSoft sells two companion products for Graphics Gallery called [Graphics View/Print](#) and [Graphics VP Deluxe](#).

GRAPHICS EDITOR LINK

Allows you to jump to your favorite graphics editor program using the selected image in the Graphics Gallery. The default program is Paint Brush which comes with Windows.

HELP CONTENTS

This will take you to Help Contents for Graphics Gallery.

SEARCH FOR HELP ON...

This will take you to Help Search for Graphics Gallery.

SHORT CUT KEYS

This will take you to Help on Graphics Gallery short cut keys.

ABOUT GRAPHICS GALLERY

This will take you to the Graphics Gallery About dialog box.

Converting Old SSG Files

If you created .SSG gallery files with Graphics Gallery versions 2.1 or previous, you will need to convert them to the new version 3 format before they will be recognized by new versions of Graphics Gallery.

Version 2.1 and Earlier

Graphics Gallery .SSG files previous to version 2.2 & 3.0 contained just the path and file name of the gallery image.

Example:

```
"c:\mypics\fish.jpg"  
"c:\mypics\goat.jpg"
```

New Versions 3.0 or 2.2 and Later

Graphics Gallery .SSG files for newer versions contained "ver3" in the first line of the file and the following lines will contain the path and filename of the thumbnail image seperated by a comma, then the path and file name of the gallery image.

Example:

```
"ver3"  
"c:\gvpd\thumbs\fish.gif", "c:\mypics\fish.jpg"  
"c:\gvpd\thumbs\goat.gif", "c:\mypics\goat.jpg"
```

Conversion

There are three ways you can convert older SSG files:

- 1 The easist way is to run the "Graphics Gallery .SSG Conversion Utility" which should have come with the new version of Graphics Gallery. Run the SSGCONV.EXE program, load your old .SSG files, and it will convert them.
- 2 You can edit the .SSG files manually. Just follow the new version example format above. In place of the thumbnail file name (since it does not exist yet) just enter "".

Example:

```
"" , "c:\mypics\fish.jpg"
```

- 3 Or you can load up the new version Graphics Gallery with your images and use the Save or Save As option under the File menu and it will create .SSG files using the new format.

Setup: Gallery Size

Thumbnails Displayed

You can control how many rows and columns of thumbnails will be displayed in the Gallery.

- Columns Across - controls how many thumbnails will be loaded (not viewed) across.
- Columns Viewed - controls how many thumbnails you actually see across.
- Rows Down - is automatically set based on the other three settings.
- Rows Viewed - controls how many thumbnails you see going down the screen.

Keep Existing Graphics After Loaded

You can set the "Keep Existing Graphics After Loaded" box which will allow you to load up the gallery with picture files from different directories before starting the slide show. Otherwise it will be cleared each time you load a file or group of files to the gallery.

Display 'Save Gallery Before Exit' Warning Message

Before you exit a gallery group, you are prompted to save it. You can turn this prompt off by not checking this setup check box.

Setup: Graphics Link

Since Graphics Gallery does not offer all possible graphics viewing and editing features, you can specify the path and name of your graphics viewer or editor program. Graphics Gallery will take the currently selected gallery image and start up your graphics program with it.

Graphics Viewer Program

The default viewer may already be set to a SkiSoft viewer program like Graphics VP Deluxe. You can specify any executable program name here.

Graphics Editor Program

The default editor program may already be set to Windows Paintbrush. Paintbrush will only display pictures in the .BMP, .PCX, and .DIB formats. You can specify any executable program name here.

Setup: Thumbnails

Thumbnail Settings

Do Not Save Thumbnails - Select this option if you do not want Graphics Gallery to save gallery images as separate thumbnail files for faster loading of .SSG files.

Save Thumbnails In Image Directory - Select this option if you want Graphics Gallery to save gallery images as separate thumbnail files and you want these files to be stored in the same directory as the image file resides. Thumbnail files are only created with the gallery is saved to an .SSG file. NOTE: If the image comes from a disk or CD that is non-writable, you will get errors.

Save Thumbnails in One Directory - Select this option if you want Graphics Gallery to save gallery images as separate thumbnail files and you want these files to be stored in the directory you choose. Thumbnail files are only created with the gallery is saved to an .SSG file.
