Version History

Version 1.6.7

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which prevented submissions from being made via a proxy server
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused submissions to be sent in CDDB test mode (preventing them from being added to the database)

Version 1.6.6

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused the CD Remote Programs file to periodically become corrupted
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused the user selection in the “Multiple Discs Found” dialog box to be ignored
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which prevented users from submitting CD information from behind a firewall or proxy server
- Improved proxy server functionality
- Switched submission engine to use HTTP instead of SMTP
- Increased default memory allocation to 2500K (3100K for PPC version)

- Added a error handling for opening another CD Remote Programs-savvy application after NetCD has been launched
- Changed AppleScript dictionary to better describe the “Pause” command

Version 1.6.5

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused the main window’s zoom state to not be saved
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused information window’s size and position not to be saved
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which prevented some items in the Apple Menu from being properly launched (Thanks Andrew!)
- Fixed an “D’oh!” bug which prevented popup track menu from being updated when CD is stopped
- Made information window display on startup if it was visible when NetCD was last quit
- Made Catalog Mode available at any time
- Added an option to turn off the “No match was found...” dialog warning
- Added highlighting to the currently playing track number
- Added more AppleScript support

Version 1.6

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused panning to be reversed (for real this time!)
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused the active field’s text to be erased when new disc information is displayed
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused NetCD window placement to behave incorrectly in multiple-monitor situations
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which sometimes prevented NetCD from playing a track after user selection through the pop-up menu
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused NetCD to give an error message upon starting Catalog Mode
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused items in the Preferences dialog to display incorrectly when using the Chicago font
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the information icon in the main window to highlight incorrectly
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which prevented the Previous Track button from working properly
- Added AppleScript support
- Added Balloon Help for recently added controls and menu items
- Caused volume and panning sliders to disable when no disc is in the drive
- Added HTVCP support (automatic version checking)
- Added arrow key shortcuts for Volume (up arrow/down arrow) and Track Control (left arrow/right arrow)
- Made disclosure triangle, information, volume and panning icons Appearance Manager compliant
- Updated “About CDDB” dialog

- Fixed a typo in the Preferences dialog contextual help
- Added a table of contents to the documentation

Version 1.5

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused panning to be reversed
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused track information for the last track to display incorrectly
- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which prevented track titles from displaying after inserting a disc while NetCD was running
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused items in the Preferences dialog to display incorrectly when using the Chicago font
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused blank track fields to appear after a disc is ejected
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the volume slider to appear deformed on machines running System 7.6 or earlier
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused asynchronous arrows to overlap the status line in the submission engine
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the main window disclosure triangle to display incorrectly on initial startup
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the Disk Info window to disappear after dismissing the Preferences dialog
- Updated submission engine to comply with the Qmail SMTP client (which does not allow linefeed characters)
- Added support for proxy servers
- Added support to use a local SMTP server as default
- Added Catalog Mode
- Added ability to copy the current track name or the entire CD program
- Added a “Save Changes?” dialog after cancelling the Submit Information dialog
- Reorganized and retitled menus
- Added cursor change to illuminate web links in About NetCD box
- Added information button/indicator to main window
- Added an error message dialog which appears if AppleCD Audio Player is open when NetCD is launched
- Changed track number labels into buttons which cause playback to begin at that track
- Changed panning slider symbol into button which resets panning to center
- Changed volume slider symbol into button which temporarily mutes the CD volume
- Fixed a typo in the Preferences dialog contextual help

Version 1.4.1

- Fixed an “Ay, caramba!” bug which caused the panning slider to gradually “float” to the left or right

Version 1.4

- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the server timeout field in the preferences dialog to display “0” when NetCD is started for the first time
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which, when user preference is to download information for all discs, reverts to “Only for Unknown Discs” upon opening the Preferences window
- Added Volume and Panning controls
- Rearranged the top portion of the main window
- Added sanity checking of track offsets to submission engine
- Added HTTP access for server list, disc query and category list connections
- Changed “Show Information” window so that it displays information for the currently playing track (or disc if no track is playing)
- Changed the Zoom Button to a Disclosure Triangle
- Changed initialization routines to retrieve the CD database file name from resource fork (stored in the first item of ‘STR#’ 8078)
- Rearranged the preferences window
- Added an audio CD autoplay option
- Changed “Only for Unknown Discs,” “Always” and “Save Downloaded Titles” to “For Unknown Discs,” “For All Discs” and “Save Titles after Download”
- Changed database engine to save information to the local database immediately after editing and—if “Save Titles after Download” is checked—immediately after a CDDB session
- Changed behavior of “Connect” button in main window to be inactive only when “Never” is selected as the connection preference
- Changed database engine to title ‘STR#’ and ‘ProG’ resources in local database file with CD artist and title
- Changed About boxes so that clicking on the web or e-mail addresses starts the user’s web browser or e-mail client
- Added ability to switch between display time formats by clicking on the time display
- Updated documentation

Version 1.3.2

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which prevented CD information from being stored when the user ejected the CD

Version 1.3.1

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused NetCD-created CD Remote Programs files to be misread by AppleCD Audio Player

Version 1.3

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused CDDB control characters to be interpreted incorrectly
- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused tracks titles to be erased when the window was collapsed
- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused international characters loaded from the CDDB to be displayed incorrectly

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused information to sometimes not be written to the CD Remote Programs file
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the CD Remote Programs file to remain open after NetCD quits
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused track number labels to display incorrectly in the Submit Dialog
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which caused the connection retry message in the server selection dialog to overlap the cool little asynchronous arrows
- Changed file format of NetCD Extra Data file to allow data larger than 255 characters
- Gave CD console buttons a new and improved appearance
- Added user selection of connection timeout period to Preferences dialog
- Added manual offline selection of CDDDB server (by pressing the option key while selecting “Select Server...” in Preferences dialog)

Version 1.2

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which displayed extra track information offset by one track
- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which prevented user-entered extra information from being saved to the local database
- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug in the CDDDB disc identification algorithm which caused the creation of inaccurate (but nearly correct) ID numbers
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which placed the cursor in the time display field when the user clicked the field with the control key to initiate a contextual menu
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which disregarded changes to the current track title field when the scroll bar was changed
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which prevented changes in the title edit field from being immediately reflected in the top title field
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which prevented the “Connect” button from changing to “Cancel” when a CDDDB session was initiated
- Added CDDDB submission capability
- Cleaned up and reorganized code
- Changed previous button to begin playback from the currently playing track if more than three seconds have elapsed on that track (thanks to Guillaume Grenier)
- Added a server timeout feature which makes NetCD retry server connections after 10 seconds of inactivity
- Added asynchronous arrows to display connection status
- Switched method of time display to reduce flickering (thanks to Guillaume Grenier)
- Increased height of time field to prevent “bouncing text” during zooming
- Changed “Show/Hide Information” menu to “Show/Hide Disc Information”
- Changed Information window title to “Disc Information”
- Changed “About NetCD...” window to reflect new web site and e-mail address

Version 1.1

- Fixed an “Ay, carumba!” bug which caused NetCD to crash if the CD Remote Programs file was not present in the preferences folder
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which allowed the user to select and change text in the help field of the preferences screen

- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which prevented the user from entering the title field when pressing the tab key
- Fixed a “D’oh!” bug which displayed the main window and zoom button incorrectly if there was no prefs file at startup
- Added support for CDDDB extra disc and track information
- Added support for NetCD Extra Data, a local database for extra disc and track information
- Added resize box to main window to allow user to change width
- Made top title field truncation smarter
- Increased height of title and track fields to better show descenders
- Made error messages more useful and added appropriate alert box icons
- Reconstructed and updated documentation (after discovering that all my copies of it were corrupt!)
- Separated Future Versions and Version History into a separate documentation file
