Windows and Windows 95 both have a "secret utility" hidden in the SYSTEM directory called SYSEDIT.EXE. This handy utility will allow you to load, view and edit all of your configuration files at one time into one Notepad-like program. These files include AUTOEXEC.BAT, CONFIG.SYS, WIN.INI and SYSTEM.INI, and others too depending on your version of Windows.

You can start this program at any time by clicking **File** from Program Manager (or, in Windows 95, clicking the **Start** button), selecting **Run**, and typing **sysedit** in the **Command line:** box. Naturally, you should not try to edit these files unless you know what you are doing, but there's no harm in looking.
