INSPIRATION TUTORIAL A 10 Minute Overview of Inspiration

Inspiration is a visual software tool that helps you to clarify your thoughts, then quickly transform your ideas and plans into a variety of effective diagrams, tree charts, presentation visuals, outlines and written documents.

This tutorial is an exploration of some of Inspiration's most exciting capabilities. It provides a quick, but comprehensive overview of how you might apply Inspiration to your professional and personal projects.

Please note that this demo differs from the full Inspiration application in that it 1) contains only a few of the Inspiration symbol libraries (please check the back section of the Idea Book to see all symbols libraries); 2) contains none of Inspiration's extensive Help System; 3) has no ability to save, import or export; 4) produces printed documents with the word Demo printed on them; and 5) omits the 200,000 word Spell Checker.

Enjoy using the Inspiration demo, and now let's "Get Inspired!"

Inspiration is easily installed by using the install program found on the Demonstration disk.

To install the Inspiration 4.1 demonstration on your hard disk:

- 1. Start Microsoft Windows.
- 2. Insert the Inspiration Demonstration disk into the A drive.
- 3. From the Program manager, select the File menu and choose Run.
- 4. Type a:\setup and press ENTER.
- 5. Select a drive to install the Inspiration Demo onto.
- 6. The installation will occur, followed by a dialog box that will offer you two options. **Click** the button **"Run DEMO"** to begin the demo.

You will move to a window of information about Inspiration. (Note: To run the demo again at a later date, you need only double-click on the Inspiration Demo icon in the Window Program Manager.)

7. Now **Click** the "**Start**" button located directly under **Inspiration Demo Version**. (Note: <u>At another time</u>, you may view the tour by running Inspiration again and clicking on the start button located below the words "**Inspiration Tour**") A new Inspiration diagram document is displayed, ready for you to begin.

In this tutorial, you will be creating an example of a planning process improved through the use of Inspiration. There are many flexible ways to work with thoughts and ideas in Inspiration. This one incorporates some, but certainly not all of Inspiration's numerous features.


This tutorial looks at the beginning stages of planning and organizing a business research project. At first, thoughts and ideas about the project are brainstormed. Later, ideas are developed into a more detailed document.

MAIN IDEA SYMBOL

1. **Type** the words **Planning Research Project** (there is no need to click the mouse prior to typing). This will become the main idea for your diagram.

When you are adding text inside a symbol, your words may momentarily move beyond sight, but all words will fully appear after you move out of editing the text.

NOTE: If you happen to scroll away from your diagram, you can return to the Main Idea by simply pressing CTRL+M.




RAPID FIRE


To get your ideas down as fast as you can think of them, use Inspiration's Rapid Fire feature. Using only the keyboard, you add each piece of information, one right after the other, inside the selected symbol. Inspiration automatically breaks your ideas out into separate symbols for you.

To use Rapid Fire (one of Inspiration's brainstorming features):

1. **Press the F9 key**. A small red box appears at the end of the word *project*. This is the marker which separates one idea from the next.



- 2. Type the words Delegate duties.
- 3. Press the F9 key.
- 4. Type the words Enlist support.
- 5. Press the F9 key.
- 6. Type the words Select teams.
- 7. **Press SHIFT+ENTER or Click** anywhere **in the open grid area** to end Rapid Fire entry. The grid is the rectangular background.




UNCONNECTED IDEAS-POINT AND TYPE

When you have a new idea or piece of information that may not fit with your existing ideas, use Inspiration's Point and Type feature. This is just one of the ways to add ideas in Inspiration. Create a symbol using Point and Type:

- 1. Click in the open grid two rows above and three rows to the right of the symbol <u>Planning Research Project</u> (the Main Idea).
- 2. **Type** the words **Timetable approval**. Simply by typing in the selected area, a symbol will form to hold your words.
- 3. Press SHIFT+ENTER or click in any open grid to end text edit.

MOVING SYMBOLS

1. Select the symbol **Delegate duties** by clicking on it once, then simply **dragging it downward one grid space.** You can also move the symbol by pressing the SHIFT+Down Arrow key once to move it down one grid square.



NOTE: If any symbol is too close to another symbol for your preference, you can easily move it to another position at any time.


Inspiration allows you to remove the grid in order to place symbols in

locations beyond those dictated by the grid frame. This exercise will not cover that command, but you may choose to later return to a diagram and experiment with this feature (the Grid Snap Off option located in the Utility Menu).


DRAWING LINKS

Draw a link from one symbol to another symbol. The symbol <u>Delegate</u> <u>duties</u> is already selected.

- 1. Position the pointer on the North/Top diamond-shaped handle (handles located North, South, East and West on the symbol). Click the left mouse button on the diamond to start the link.
- 2. Hold down the left mouse button and drag the link to the symbol <u>Timetable approval</u>. You will see a line being drawn continuously from the handle to the pointer. Continue to drag the line until the symbol which you are dragging it to is darkened. The darkening means the new symbol has grabbed the link. Release the mouse while the symbol is still darkened. If you release the mouse before the symbol has grabbed the link, no link is created.



NOTE: When you want to order your ideas or show connections between ideas or information, use links. You do not need to be precise when you draw your links. Inspiration adjusts the link to the edge of the symbol for you whenever you are drawing a link or moving a symbol. Symbols can have as many links as you want leading to or from them.



Moving a symbol to a new location, or linking symbols, often allows us to see a new relationship between ideas. Visual positioning (as well as color, shape and size) effects how we interpret the meaning of our ideas.

ZOOM OPTION

1. Click the Zoom Out icon at the bottom of the palette.

This reduces your diagram to 3:4 Zoom (75%) view. This is just one of many perspectives available with Inspiration. When you have zoomed out, it may be difficult to read symbols and link text. Inspiration's Magnified Text feature solves this problem by letting you see your text at the bottom of the screen. Simply move the pointer over the symbol or link and the text will be displayed in the Magnified Text area.

2. Choose Zoom In from the View Menu (or press CTRL+=) to zoom back to 100% view.

MULTIPLE SELECTION and CHANGE SYMBOL SHAPES

 Select the symbols <u>Timetable approval</u> and <u>Delegate duties</u>. To shift select multiple symbols, click on the first item, then hold down the Shift key while clicking on the other items.

Let's change some symbol shapes.

2. Choose Basic Shapes in the Symbol Menu, then choose the rounded rectangle shape from the submenu.

NOTE: Changing shapes does not alter the words typed inside the symbol and you may change symbol shapes as many times as you wish. The symbol shape menus on the palette (located just left of your diagram) and in the Symbol menu are the same. They are used to create symbols and to change symbol shapes.

The interpretation of thoughts and ideas expressed in diagrams are greatly affected by the kind of symbols that hold them. Selecting the appropriate "package" (symbol) to house your words can express as much about your idea as the words themselves.

OUTLINE VIEW

The Inspiration outliner makes it a snap to add, revise and rearrange information. You can use it to organize a project or report, arrange priorities or manage lists of information. Easily expand your outline structure into a complete document using Inspiration's seamless Notes text.

1. Choose Outline from the View Menu.

You will move to an outline which corresponds directly to your diagram.

ADD TOPICS

1. Position the cursor and click to the left of the main topic, <u>Planning</u> <u>Research Project</u>.

When a topic is selected in this way, a rectangle appears around it.

+ Planning Research Project


Now let's add a new topic.

2. Choose Insert Topic from the Outline Menu.

A new blank topic, directly below the main topic, is created. The topic is selected, ready for you to add text.

3. Type the words Project budget.

This additional topic will also be automatically represented in the Diagram view as a symbol.



INSERT SUBTOPIC

Let's add some subtopics underneath the topic Select teams. Subtopics are ideas or pieces of information that are subordinate or supplemental to a higher-level or main topic.

To add subtopics:

- 1. Select the topic <u>Select teams</u> by clicking to the left of the prefix.
- 2. Choose Insert Subtopic from the Outline Menu (or press CTRL+K).
- 3. Type the words Determine resources, then press F9.

4. Next type the words Consult with M.K.

NOTE: Inspiration has many other powerful organizing commands not covered in the sampler (For example: Discontinuous Topic Selection, Collect and Move, Promote, and Split Topic).

NOTES TEXT (Outline View)


Topics are helpful for jotting down a quick concept or a couple of sentences, but when you want to develop your outline into a complete document, use Inspiration's Notes capabilities.

To add Notes text:

- 1. Select the topic **Project budget**, placing the cursor after the last word.
- 2. Press the Enter key.

You are now ready to begin typing a note below the topic.

3. Type in the following thoughts which elaborate on this topic: This would be a good opportunity to work with Sharon Clark, the consultant referred by Sam Tanaka of Applied Dynamics.



RETURN TO DIAGRAM VIEW

In the planning process, it is now an advantageous time to again visually develop ideas. When returning to the Diagram view, you will notice that new symbols have appeared corresponding to new topics you created in the Outline view. The notes will be hidden, but they can easily be viewed and edited in the Diagram view.

To return to the Diagram view:

- 1. Choose Diagram from the View Menu.
- 2. You may receive a dialog box that will ask you about symbols overlapping. If so, simply click the button **Rearrange**.

NOTES TEXT (Diagram View)

To add Notes text:

1. **Select** the topic **<u>Project budget</u>** if it is not already selected. The small box in the upper left hand corner is filled signifying that there are hidden


notes connected to this symbol.

- 2. Double click on the now filled, small box in the upper left hand corner of the selected symbol (or Press Control+Y). This opens the Notes text. You will see the notes that you began in the Outline view.
- 3. Click at the end of the existing text and type: I should clear this with Wes Kramer first.
- 4. **Double-click the Control-menu box** in the upper left corner of the notes text window document to close it.

DRAW, GROUP & INSTALL SYMBOLS

To create and install a symbol with the draw tools, first turn on the Draw palette:

- 1. Choose Symbol Palette in the Utility Menu, then choose Draw Palette from the submenu. The rulers will appear automatically.
- 2. Click the Rectangle tool on the palette. Then position the crosshairs in an open grid area to the left of your diagram. This is where you will start drawing the rectangle.
- 3. **Drag down and to the right to create a small rectangle.** To adjust the size or shape of your rectangle, click on the edge of the rectangle to select it, then drag any one of its four handles.
- 4. Choose Copy from the Edit menu to copy the already selected rectangle. Then, click in an empty grid and choose Paste from the Edit menu. This creates a duplicate rectangle.
- 5. Position the pointer right on the edge of the just pasted rectangle and drag it over the original rectangle as pictured below.
- 6. Select the text area tool (with the icon "A" located on the left side of the draw pallette) and draw a text area box in the middle of the two rectangles.



- 7. Shift-select the two rectangles and the text area box to select all of them. (To Shift-select, hold down the Shift key while clicking on each object you wish to select).
- 8. Choose Group from the Symbol Menu (or press CTRL-G). The rectangles and text box have now become one object.
- 9. Choose Install User Symbol from the Utility Menu. This will place the created symbol in the User 1 Symbol Menu. This symbol can now be used again like any other symbol.

USING INSTALLED SYMBOLS

- 1. Select the symbol **<u>Timetable approval</u>**.
- 2. Choose the User 1 symbol menu on the palette, then choose the newly created double rectangle symbol from the submenu. This changes the symbol to the new double rectangle shape. This symbol will now signify the delegation of duties. You would use it in other parts of this diagram or other diagrams to show delegation.

3. Select the grouped rectangles and the text area that remain alone on the screen where you first created them and choose Clear from the Edit Menu to remove your leftover drawing.

NOTE: In addition to user installed, predefined symbols and strip symbols, you can use symbols from Inspiration's symbol libraries and also import graphics through the clipboard.

LEVELING YOUR DOCUMENTS

Sometimes if you are working on a large diagram or want to detail many components in a project, you may wish to layer your document. The top layer would be the master view or family head. You could create a child diagram or outline that provides further detail of a symbol's idea.

The family is stored as one document, not separately. When you save a document that has family members, the entire family is saved.

Each family member is opened as a separate window, each with its own name. The name includes one bullet character for each level down it is in the hierarchy, as well as the name of the associated symbol or topic.

To open a child:

- 1. Select the symbol **Delegate duties**.
- 2. Choose Family from the File Menu, then choose Open Child from the submenu (or Press F6). You now have a child diagram begun with Delegate duties as its main idea.

NOTE: This has not altered the appearance of your original diagram in any way, but has added another separate, but connected layer. The child diagram or outline can become as large and varied as the parent diagram or outline. You may choose to experiment in this child diagram by developing the idea of delegating duties.

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3. When you are ready to return to your original diagram, Close the child by double-clicking in the Control menu box in the upper left corner of the document window.

You have successfully completed the Demo Tutorial!

QUIT

1. Choose Exit from the File Menu (or press CTRL+Q).

You will be presented with two consecutive windows of information about Inspiration.
