How to Play

Uncover all 100 pictures (icons). Icons are uncovered a pair at a time. When the pairs match, they stay uncovered. If they do not match, they are recovered. Either 1 or 2 people may play.

1 Person

When one person plays, a timer is displayed. The object is to *beat the clock*! The top 5 times are maintained. After you have uncovered all 50 pairs, the top 5 times are displayed. If your time is among the top 5, you will be asked to provide your name. You may then press the **New Game** button to start another game, or you may press the **Quit** button to quit.

2 People

When two people play, turns are taken at uncovering pairs of icons. If a player uncovers a pair, then that player may continue playing. If the player does not uncover a pair, play passes to the other player. After all 50 pairs have been uncovered, the winner will be announced. You may then press the **New Game** button to start another game, or you may press the **Quit** button to quit.

Configuring Match Up

You can the conditions for a new game and save those settings so that they take effect the next time you start Match Up.

In the **Puzzle** group of radiobuttons, select 1 of the three puzzles. Each puzzle represents 50 different pairs of pictures.

In the **Players** group of radiobuttons, select either 1 player or 2 players.

Check the **Sound** box to turn on sounds. It is advised that you turn this on only if your PC has a sound board installed.

The following describes the buttons and their functions:
