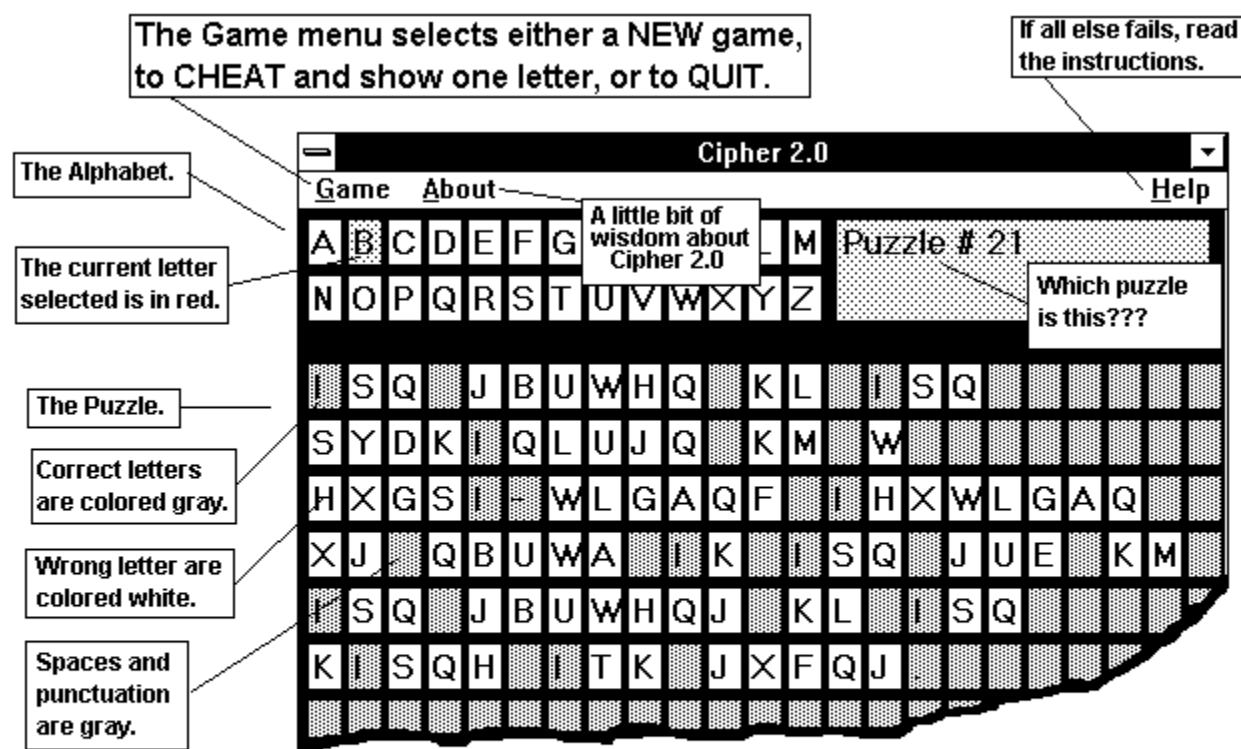


Cipher 2.0

Revision History

Version 2.0 December 1992

... Increased the number of puzzles to 100. If you have played the earlier versions of Cipher you will find that the puzzles are a mix of new and old puzzles.

... Fixed the strange memory error that caused version 1.2 to slowly eat up all the available free memory under Windows 3.1. Oops!

... Added a proper HELP file. (which you are now reading)

... Now stores Cipher20.ini in the Windows directory instead of program's current directory. The Cipher20.ini file is where the program keeps track of which puzzle you are at. This file should be deleted should you ever uninstall Cipher 2.0.

Version 1.2 February 1992

... Increased the number of puzzles to 60.

... Changed the shareware registration from \$\$\$ to a postcard.

... Original version.
