Quick march is the order.

WILSON:

I'm very sorry, sir. Quick march. (by this time, Frazer has already entered the office) FRAZER: There's no point, I'm already here. Enrolment is wrapped up after Hodges makes his debut telling Mainwaring to clear the hall, he's got a lecture in five minutes. The first day of the Walmington's LDV ends up with an inspection and lecture on German tanks. The expected delivery of uniforms only brings LDV armbands. Six weeks to go before the uniforms arrive and the platoons arsenal comprises of a shotgun, 15 carving knives. Jones' assegai and Bracewell's number three iron. But when a letter arrives instructing the bank to close the account of the Peabody Museum of Historic Army Weapons for the duration, Mainwaring and Wilson have an idea. At 1800 hours Operation Gun Grab begins. The aim - to requisition any firearms of use in the platoon's fight against the Nazis.

The trouble is they've got to outwit the crusty 88-year-old caretaker who turns out to be Jones' father. After numerous attempts Frazer, disguised as an ARP warden, exploits the caretaker's predilection for booze. While he's outside the museum swigging down whisky, the platoon seizes a Chinese Rocket Gun. Mainwaring, who's not particularly enthused by their new weapon, is forced to eat his words when the gun goes off and he ends up sheltering under a table.

When the platoon fall in, Mainwaring tells Pike off for wearing a muffler on parade. But he's got a note from his mother.

MAINWARING: (reading the note)

"Frank is starting with his chest again, he ought to be in bed. If he can't wear his muffler he's to come home or he will catch his death".

(turning to Wilson).

We can't have him wearing that thing on parade, makes the whole platoon look ludicrous.

WILSON:

Perhaps he could wear it on patrol, sir? (turning to Pike). What time do you go on?

PIKE:

Ten till twelve, sir.

WILSON:

It'll be dark by then, sir, anyway.

MAINWARING:

Oh, very well.

The dearth of weapons causes low morale in the platoon. At the bank the following day a visit from an old campaigner Colonel Square, leaves Mainwaring in a predicament. Square wants to take over the platoon and in doing so will allow them the use of his 20 rifles. That evening, after much cogitating, Mainwaring announces that he's placing the platoon under Square's command. But at Marsham Hall, Square's home, Mainwaring swiftly reverses his decision after discovering the crackpot plans to turn them into cavalry with circus horses and antiquarian muskets. Back under Mainwaring's command their supply of guns arrive before the day's out.

Not taking any chances, they arrest the man and plan an interrogation until he convinces them he's a Polish captain serving with GHQ - he's there simply to inform them of the £10 reward for every Nazi arrested. On night patrol, Jones' section captures two German pilots.

While being held at the church hall, Godfrey credulously lets them escape. But the Polish captain recaptures them and escorts the pilots back to the hall. When military police collect the prisoners, the Polish captain is mistakenly arrested as well, rewarding the platoon by a total of £30.

Mainwaring's platoon, the first to be formed in the area, is selected to provide the guard of honour for the Prime Minister's impending visit. Eventually Wilson and Pike decide to make for the cottage, which is being guarded by the rest of the platoon.

When Jones nips off to the outside toilet, Wilson and Pike mistake him for a German and begin shooting. But when Godfrey's sister, oblivious to all the pandemonium, waves her tea cloth out of the window, Wilson and Pike take it as a sign of surrender and move towards the cottage, only to find their supposed enemies are none other than their own men.

Confusion reigns and when Wilson eventually confides in Mainwaring, he sees no alternative, Wilson will have to marry her.

The platoon is to provide the guard of honour at the wedding, but as Wilson practices the ceremonial march with Jones substituting for Mrs. Pike, Mavis brings little Arthur into the church hall and introduces him to Wilson. Confusion cleared, Wilson breathes a sign of relief.

The men begin to dislike Frazer's brash attitudes and overpowering desire to impress, particularly when he presents charge sheets containing Pike's name for deserting his post and cowardice in the face of the enemy, and Walker for mutiny. After Jones is added to the list, action is required: Frazer quickly falls out of contention for promotion.

Mainwaring and his men arrest the suspect, a Mr. Murphy, who claims he's a British citizen even though he was born in Austria. Back at the church hall, an incendiary device lands and causes a fire that the platoon struggles to control.

It's Mrs. Pike who extinguishes the fire by smothering it with sandbags. At the same time she vouches for Mr. Murphy, he was married to her Auntie Ethel's cousin.

GHQ orders the platoon to work closer with the ARP. The new chief warden is to discuss suggestions as to how this can be achieved - but who is the new warden, asks Mainwaring.

MAINWARING:

You mean to say they've made him chief warden?

WILSON:

Yes, they have.

MAINWARING:

He's a greengrocer!

WILSON:

Yes, I know that, sir, because of his dirty fingernails.

As soon as Hodges arrives, the foundations of his friction-based relationship with Mainwaring are laid. Walker persuades Jones into loaning his delivery van, which is converted to gas for fuel economy, to the platoon, primarily because he wants to use it for his own black market dealings. The delivery van takes on a new role as an ambulance during Hodges' air raid practice, with the platoon becoming stretcherbearers.

After taking four hours to reach the camp from the station, from just a mile away, the platoon's hunger pains deepen when they discover they've missed supper. After oversleeping and missing breakfast too, they set out to capture Captain Rodrigues' base. Upon discovering a secret tunnel leading straight into the HQ, Mainwaring tells the platoon they'll capture the base at nightfall.

After dialling the wrong number he speaks to the cashier at the Plaza Cinema and gets confused upon hearing her say the films title is "One Of Our Aircraft Is Missing", and Eric Portman and Googie Withers are in it.

Back at the reservoir Hodges and Lt. Hope Bruce arrive, but it's Walker who has used his initiative. After a word with the reservoir official, the sluices are opened and the Germans swim for their lives.

MRS. PIKE:

'Ere, have you washed your face?

PIKE:

No, I've only just got back from shooting at aeroplanes.

MRS. PIKE:

Well, it's a disgrace. You're going to come straight home with me and I'll give it a good go with a flannel, come on.

PIKE:

I can't, I've got to boil my rifle out.

MRS. PIKE:

I'll soon see about that. (turning to Mainwaring). Mr. Mainwaring, my Frank's coming home with me. It's a perfect disgrace you keeping him out all night like this with a dirty face.

A Court of Inquiry is held, upon Mainwaring's insistence, into the use of 75 rounds of ammo. But proceedings are farcical and peppered with constant interruptions, especially when Jones brings the ceiling down.

An air raid interrupts the discussion, and they return to find the bank has taken a direct hit. Both Mainwaring and Wilson fall down a gaping hole in the office and end up clutching an unexploded bomb in the banks strongroom.

WILSON:

Sir, if you could possibly lower your end just a little bit.

MAINWARING:

Don't do that, the slightest movement could set this thing off.

WILSON:

Well we can't sit here all day holding it like this, sir, for heavens

sake.

MAINWARING:

If you don't stop jogging your end, we'll be sitting on a cloud holding a harp!

While Mainwaring and Wilson sweat buckets, Captain Rogers, bomb disposal, arrives but does little to help confidence when announcing the bomb is a trembler. While he rushes off to get the right tools, the trusty platoon members take matters into their own hands.
