### 1.2 Important

--->> IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING RELEASE 5.0 VERSION 37.9 <<---

MachV and SetMachV require version 37.9 of the mach.library. Before running this version, you must remove any earlier version and flush the old library. You can do this by:

1. Copy the new library to libs:.. "Copy df0:mach.library libs:"
2. Copy the new MachV and SetMachV over your old ones.
3. Removing MachV. (Click on the clock and press Ctrl-C, or run MachV again.)
4. Type "avail flush" in the shell, or do a reset to remove the old version from memory.
5. Run the new MachV.

MachV will read your existing MachIV.prefs file from the directory ENVARC:MachIV. However, it will read ENVARC:MachV/MachV.prefs if that exists. There are some minor changes that you may need to make in your macros. This is described in the file Update50.doc.

## 1.3 Highlights

- \* The mach.library gives programmers access to most of MachV. SetMachV is written using this library and the global data area.
- \* Environment variables are completely supported.
- \* The clock is now an "AppWindow". You can drop icons into it which will set the environment variable "MachVar" which may then be used in macros.
- \* The clock can be set to pick which screens it can go to. ~(Final Copy#?)
- \* Most mouse features like SunMouse and ClickToFront will have the ability to pick and choose which windows they operate on by using wildcards.
- \* ARexx commands can be sent directly to ARexx ports.
- \* Function name completion is now provided. When entering a function in the macro string gadget, pressing <Alt-Tab> will complete the entry for you. "Msc\_Bl" will expand to "Msc\_Blank\_Screen".
- \* There are language catalogs for Danish now, as well as for German and French.

## 1.5 Registering

MachV is shareware. You may register it for \$15.00 and receive a version without the startup window and unlimited macros. You will also receive MachV.020 optimized for 68020 and later CPU's. Send \$15.00 cash or check (payable to Brian Moats) to the address below.
