1.2 Introduction

Ever wanted to freq a node but didn't know the FQFA number?? Well help is here now!

FindPhone searches through the nodelist for nodes whose phonenumber matches a wildcard.

1.3 Installation

To install simply follow the steps below (clicking on the button will automatically do the action!)

1. Copy FindPhone to MAIL:bin
2. Copy FindPhone.guide to MAIL:docs

1.4 Usage

FindPhone can only be run from the Shell. It accepts arguments which match the following template:

```
PATTERN/M/A, START/K, FULL/S, VERBATIM/S, STRIPDASHES/S, BUFSIZE/K/N, NODELIST/K
```

PATTERN -- Wildcard to search the nodelist for. All standard Amiga wildcards are supported. The search is case-insensitive. At least one pattern must be given but you can supply more.

START --- Node to start the search from. For example "START=2:" would start the search at zone 2, skipping zone 1. If not given the search starts at the front of the nodelist.

FULL --- Specifies the output mode. If this switch is not specified then for each node found only 1 line of information is display. However if it is specified then more data is displayed.

VERBATIM --- Specifies that the wildcard should act on the phonenumbers as they appear in the nodelist. The numbers will not be subject to the DIAL

STRIPDASHES --- Specifies that the search should be made on the phonenumbers after the dashes in them have been removed. For example the imagine the phone number of a node is "1-604-589-8562" then the comparison will be between "16045898562" the the wildcard.

BUFSIZE --- Size of the nodelist scanning buffer (in records). Values below 32 will use the default buffer size.

NODELIST --- Directory where the nodelist files are kept. Defaults to "NodeList:"
