Simply copy the file `gmake' to somewhere in your path, most likely C:

## 1.6 How to use the package

The user must create a GMakeFile which contains the names and information of the files to compile. These files that are compiled need make no mention of any amigaguide specific text.

To compile simply enter `gmake' on the command line.

Note: gmake understands 2 arguments either the name of the gmakefile or DEBUG. DEBUG requires KCON to be installed, KCON is © by David Larsson and provides history usage on a con: window.

## 1.7 The format of the GMakeFile

The make file comprises of the format:

section\_type: file\_name

For example:

guide: AmigaGuideCompiler.guide

premain: premain

postmain: postmain

author: me

disclaimer: disc

about: about

Usage: usage

---

The guide is the output guide file, this \*MUST\* be mentioned.

PreMain and PostMain go before and after the contents on the main page.

Other standard sections and the order in which they appear are:

Preface Disclaimer About Author Install Usage Bugs History

To include a non standard section add to the gmakefile:

page: filename

title of additional page

See the example within the package for more details.

## 1.8 The C source

The C source is included with this archive:

debug.c extra.c file.c main.c str.c type.c

debug.h info.h main.h standard.h DMakefile

It can be compiled using DICE, but is probably easy to convert (the only amiga specifics are the arg inputs).
