Setup guides you through the installation of the CorelDRAW software to your hard drive. At different stages in the installation process, you will be prompted to select the applications (CorelDRAW, SHOW, PHOTO-PAINT, etc..) and other options such as the <u>filters</u> and fonts that you want installed. For more detailed installation instructions and troubleshooting information, refer to the *CorelDRAW Installation Guide*.

Should you wish to run CorelDRAW from the CD-ROM, exit this installation program and run SETUP2.exe located on CD #1. With the CD-ROM based installation, only a minimum number of files are copied to your hard drive, conserving disk space.

Note: If you install using SETUP2, CD #1 must be in your CD-ROM drive to run the application(s).

Programs that translate information from one file format to another. CorelDRAW's import filters, for example, allow you to open graphics created in CorelPHOTO-PAINT, Adobe Illustrator and many other applications.

Welcome to CD-ROM Setup

Setup shows you how to install CorelDRAW so that all the applications run exclusively from your CD-ROM. Only the essential files required to run the programs will be copied to your hard drive, ensuring that the least amount of disk space is used.

At different stages in the installation process, you will be prompted to select the applications (CorelDRAW, SHOW, PHOTO-PAINT, etc..) and options such as the fonts and <u>scanner driver</u> that you want installed. For more detailed installation instructions and troubleshooting information, refer to the *CorelDRAW Installation Guide*.

Welcome to the Network Administrator Setup

Setup guides you through the installation of the CorelDRAW software to a local area network (LAN). At different stages in the installation process, you will be prompted to select the applications (CorelDRAW, SHOW, PHOTO-PAINT, etc..) and other options such as the <u>filters</u>, fonts and <u>scanner driver(s)</u> that you want the workstation users to have access to. For more detailed installation instructions and troubleshooting information, refer to the *CorelDRAW Installation Guide* included with your software.

After the main network installation has been completed, each individual workstation must be set up to run the CorelDRAW applications.

Note: Windows 3.1 or higher must be installed and working properly on the network server before installing CorelDRAW.

Welcome to the Network Workstation Setup

Setup shows you how to install the Corel software from the network to your workstation. At different stages in the installation process, you will be prompted to select the applications (CorelDRAW, SHOW, PHOTO-PAINT, etc..) and other options such as the fonts and <u>scanner driver</u> that you want installed. For more detailed installation instructions and troubleshooting information, refer to the *CorelDRAW Installation Guide* included with your software.

Note: Some applications and options may not be available for selection, depending on the parameters set by the Network Administrator.

Customizing Your Corel Applications

Type your name and the software's serial number in the provided list boxes to customize your copy of CorelDRAW. After the installation is complete, this information will appear in the About dialog box (Help menu) within all Corel applications that you install. Then, should you have to contact Customer Support, and they ask for your software's serial number, you will be able to reference it quickly and easily from within the application.

If you want to bypass this option, choose **Continue** to move on to the next dialog box or **Exit** to quit the installation program.

Choosing Installation Options

CorelDRAW Setup offers two installation options: Full and Custom. With both installations, you will be able to select from a variety of import/export <u>filters</u>, True Type fonts, <u>scanner drivers</u>, and <u>animation drivers</u>.

Dialog Box Options

Full Installation

Automatically installs all applications (CorelDRAW, SHOW, PHOTO-PAINT, etc..), sample files, and online help to your hard drive. Approximately 50 Mbs of free disk space is required on your computer for a full installation of the software.

Custom Installation

Automatically installs the minimum number of files required to run the Corel applications. You can, however, select additional files (online help, samples, filters, etc..) or deselect any applications or options. The Custom Installation method also allows you to specify the destination directories where the files and applications you choose will be installed.

Note: Additional files can be installed later on using this option.

Scanner Drivers

Programs that enable scanners to communicate with CorelDRAW. Installing a scanner driver allows you to import scanned images into CorelDRAW where you can edit and include them into your drawing projects.

Choosing a Directory for the Installation

The Directory list box displays the default directory (C:\Corel50) where the files will be installed on your hard drive. If you prefer to install the files to a different directory, type the full path of the alternate directory in the provided list box.

Choosing a Directory for the Installation

The Directory list box currently displays the default directory (C:\Corel50) where the files will be installed on your hard drive. If you prefer to install the files to a different directory, type the full path of the alternate directory in the provided list box.

Selecting CorelDRAW Options

Choose which application files you want installed to your hard drive by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the file names. Selecting Animation Drivers

Select the <u>animation drivers</u> that you want installed by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the driver names.

Note: If you have a more recent version of any of the listed drivers on your system, the program will not overwrite it.

Animation Drivers

Programs that enable CorelMOVE and SHOW to play video files saved in file formats such as AVI (Video for Windows).

Selecting Ventura Gallery Groups

Select the Ventura Gallery Groups that you want installed by checking or clearing the check boxes next to the group names. Each group represents a series of pre-defined <u>templates</u> that you can use to design the format and layout of your documents.

To choose individual templates from any of the unselected groups, click the Selection check box and the Ventura Gallery Selection Window will open.

Selecting Ventura Templates

Moves all names to the Do Not Install list box.

Selecting Applications to Install

Lists the applications you can choose to install and the default directories where the files will be copied to on your hard drive. For each selected application, the amount of disk space required is listed in the right-hand column. The total amount of disk <u>space required</u> for all currently selected applications and the amount of space available on your hard drive are listed at the bottom left of the dialog box.

Dialog Box Options

Application Check Boxes

Select the applications you want to install by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the application names.

Customize Buttons

Opens a dialog box where you can custom select files associated with each application, such as online help and sample files.

Directory List Boxes

Shows the default directories where the files for each application will be copied to. You can enter a different directory, by typing the full path name in the list box.

Continue

Finalizes the selections and proceeds with the installation.

Back

Returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Space Required

The total space required value is a measure of how many kilobytes of space the selected applications and options will take up on your hard drive. Included in this calculation are extra files required to run the applications.

Selecting Applications and Options to Install

Lists the applications and options you can choose to install. For each selected item, the amount of disk space required is listed in the right-hand column. The total amount of disk space required for all currently selected applications/options and the amount of space available on your hard drive are listed at the bottom left of the dialog box.

Dialog Box Options

Application and Option Check Boxes

Select the applications and options you want to install by checking or clearing the associated check boxes.

Customize Buttons

Opens a dialog box where you can select or deselect particular files (<u>animation drivers</u>, symbol libraries, etc.) that are associated with the application. To conserve disk space, only select the files you require.

Continue

Finalizes the selections and proceeds with the installation.

Back

Returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Selecting Symbol Libraries

Choose which symbol libraries you want installed by adding or deleting library names to and from the Install list box. Use the function buttons to move names from one list to the other. For more information, click on Image next to the name.

Shows the default directories where the files for each application will be copied to. You have the option of entering a different destination directory for the scanner driver and fonts in the associated list boxes. The filters and <u>animation drivers</u> destination directories, however, are not editable.

Finalizes the selections and proceeds with the installation.

Returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Selecting File Options

Lists the file options (<u>filters</u>, fonts, etc..) that you can choose to install and the default directories where the files will be copied to on your hard drive. For each selected option, the amount of disk space required is listed in the right-hand column. The total amount of disk <u>space required</u> for all currently selected options and the amount of space available on your hard drive are listed at the bottom left of the dialog box.

Note: These files can be used by several CorelDRAW applications.

Option Check Boxes

Select the options you want to install by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the option names. The scanner drivers check box has three states that can be accessed by clicking the check box in succession (scanner drivers selected, all scanner drivers selected, scanner drivers deselected).

Customize Buttons

Opens a dialog box where you can custom select files associated with each option, such as online help and sample files.

Directory List Boxes

Shows the default directories where the files for each application will be copied to. You have the option of entering a different destination directory for the scanner driver and fonts in the associated list boxes. The filters and <u>animation drivers</u> destination directories, however, are not editable.

Finalizes the selections and proceeds with the installation.

Exit

Selecting Import/Export Filters

Filters translate information from one file format to another, making it possible for you to open a drawing created in CorelPHOTO-PAINT or Adobe Illustrator in CorelDRAW, as well as to open a drawing created in CorelDRAW in other graphics applications. Choose which import and export filters you want installed by adding or deleting filter names to and from the Install list box. Use the function buttons to move names from one list to the other. For more information, click on \blacksquare next to the name.

Tip: Double-click on a name to move it to the opposite list box.

Note: If you are not certain which filters to install, you may want to install them all. Total disk space required for all filters is approximately 3.5 Mbs.

Selecting True Type Fonts

Choose which fonts you want installed by adding or deleting font names to and from the Install list box. Consult the *Corel Libraries Catalog* for a complete visual list of the supported fonts. Use the function buttons to move names from one list to the other. For more information, click on In ext to the name.

Selecting a Scanner Driver

To use a scanner with Corel software, you must first install the appropriate <u>scanner driver</u>. The current settings are displayed on the right-hand side of the dialog box. Pertinent installation information and tips relating to the selected scanner are displayed in the Notes section.

Dialog Box Options

Scanner List Box

Click the down arrow to the right of the Scanners list box and select a scanner name.

Settings

Choose settings for your scanner in the options and value drop-down list boxes.

OK

Finalizes the scanner selection and returns to the previous dialog box.

Cancel

Clears any selections and returns to the previous dialog box.

Starting the Installation

This is the last step before the installation process begins. If you choose Install, all the applications, files and options that you selected will be unarchived and loaded onto your hard drive.

Throughout the installation process, CorelDRAW will display a dialog box showing the percentage of the installation that has been completed, as well as a running list of the files being copied. A new program group and icons representing the major Corel applications will automatically be created in the Program Manager. If you have any problems or questions about the installation, consult the *CorelDRAW Installation Guide*.

Note: Users can run Setup from the Setup directory to install the applications to their workstations.

Updating the Autoexec.bat File

For your scanner to work with the Corel software, the autoexec.bat file in the root directory of your hard drive must be updated with the new <u>scanner driver</u> information.

Dialog Box Options

Update

Incorporates scanner driver information into the autoexec.bat file. A backup file called autoexec.cor is created before any changes are made.

Don't Update

Leaves the autoexec.bat file as it is but creates a new file (autoexec.cor) that incorporates the scanner driver information.

Updating the Config.sys File

For your scanner to work with the Corel software, the config.sys file in the root directory of your hard drive must be updated with the new <u>scanner driver</u> information.

Dialog Box Options

Update

Incorporates scanner driver information into the config.sys file. A backup file called config.cor is created before any changes are made.

Don't Update

Leaves the config.sys file as it is but creates a new file (config.cor) that incorporates the scanner driver information.

Selecting True Type Font Groups

Select the Font Groups that you want installed by checking or clearing the check boxes next to the group names. Each group name (Basic, Technical, Formal, etc..) represents a series of individual fonts of a particular style. The installation program pre-selects four essential fonts that will be required to use the Corel applications.

To choose individual fonts from the unselected groups as well as various other specialty fonts, click the Assorted check box. A dialog box will open where you can make your selections.

Finalizes your selections and returns to the previous dialog box (Choose Which Applications to Install).

Cancel

Clears any selections and returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Selecting Ventura Options

Choose which application files you want installed to your hard drive by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the file names. Deselecting file options will reduce the amount of disk space required for the application, but will limit the functionality of the software. For instance, if the online help files are not installed, pressing F1 to bring up help information, or clicking the Help button in a dialog box will have no effect.

Hyphenation

Select the primary and secondary hyphenation dictionaries for Ventura by clicking on the down arrow and selecting an option.

Select the primary and secondary hyphenation dictionaries for Ventura by clicking on the down arrow and selecting an option.

Continue

Finalizes your selections and returns to the previous dialog box (Choose Which Applications to Install).

Cancel

Clears any selections made and returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Template

A template is the empty shell of a CorelVENTURA document into which you can load new text and graphics files.

Templates are useful when you plan to use a structure repeatedly, only changing its contents, as with newsletters or magazines.

Choosing a Temporary File Location

Choose one or more of the possible locations for your <u>temporary files</u> by checking or clearing the check boxes to the left of the path names. The free disk space currently available on each hard drive is listed in the right-hand column.

Note: If you don't select a temporary file location, the program will assign one for you on the C drive.

Dialog Box Options

Proceeds with the installation.

Back

Returns to the previous dialog box.

Exit

Temporary Files

A temporary storage area where data can be placed when your system runs out of memory. If, for instance, you are working on a large graphics file in CorelDRAW that exceeds the capabilities of your RAM, your system will automatically transfer some of the data to temporary files on your hard drive.
