## 1.3 Improvements

Improvements Since Volume One

Yes, we have been all through our registration returns and taken into consideration your thoughts on our CD.

Ok, to start with, most of you asked for Volume Two, so here it is! That request is obvious cos you've bought the CD already.

James Watson asked us if we could support new icons, this isn't an easy task, because the majority of Amiga users haven't even heard of New Icons, yet alone being able to run them. This is something we were unable to do, we do have a few New Icons in the 'Icons+' drawer, but it is very difficult to get hold of large amounts of them.

We have taken great consideration over a top suggestion by Mr P Bryan, he suggested we should take more consideration over CD32 owners as well as those that use CDTV/CD32 link up with an A1200/4000. If you look in the 'Useful' drawer, you will find Sernet and Parnet programs. We did contact Amiga Technologies (Germany) about registering the boot block for auto booting on a CD32, but we didn't have much luck, maybe next time!

We also had a complaint from Joseph Cox who pointed out problems with some of the icons Default Tools, these are sorted and thoroughly checked. Also people who owned a Squirrel interface had problems with the 'iconx' tool,

basically they didn't own one, so we have completed the default tools paths to find iconx on the CD and not their boot disk or hard drive.

Also those who own a Squirrel interface and NO hard drive, we have created boot disks for you, these are found in the 'Useful' drawer. All you have to do is unpack the correct boot disk to floppy and boot with that instead of your usual Squirrel boot disk.

Steven McLean asked for more programs running straight from the CD, you got it, we have cut down on DMS files to the very limit!

One of the main requests was more control over DMS unpacking, a lot of you asked for the option to unpack to harddrive or Ram, well it's actually impossible to unpack to hard drive, but we have created an icon in the 'Useful' drawer called 'RAD-DMS', this create a RAD drawer in which will automatically act as DF0: so you can unpack to RAM/RAD.

Oliver Bohan asked for faster dms unpacking, so we have taken out the Verify command.

We have decreased the amount of Sub-Directories due to Chris Horne (Hornesoft PD) complaint, so, there you go Chris. Although we did agree with him, because it slowed down multi-tasking when loads of windows are open.

Refering back to Steven McLean request for more software ready to run, R Sibley asked for less DMS files which basically is the same thing but I thought we would stress the point a bit more.

Andrew Douthwaite asked for more games, sorted. We have also installed a working version of Klondike with 10 new cardsets ready to use. We apologise for the problems with Klondike and Vol One.

Also people did complain about some demos not working with there machine, this is not our fault, it is incompatible programming, but we have included a degrader called 'TUDE, which again can be found in the 'Useful' drawer.

...And we did notice the spelling mistake for SAdENESS on the side and back of the CD pointed out to us by Erik Rudling.

If anyone has anymore complaints, suggestions or improvements we can consider, just return your registration slips with some top suggestions.

Please Note: This CD was designed with Workbench 3.0+ in mind, it will work on WB2.0 or higher, but with some restrictions. This CD does not support WB1.3 or lower.

After the amazing reception for the first "AGA Experience", we started work on this eagerly awaited follow-up. Even though the first review scores were very high (AUI - 90%, AF - Format GOLD, CU Amiga - 90%, Amiga Computing - 8/10), we were still not satisfied with the CD. We strive for perfection. We have listened to the minor criticisms and comments, and have made this disc EVEN BETTER! Here's how.

IMPROVEMENTS / CHANGES TO THE FIRST AGA EXPERIENCE:

FASTER DMS's - The DMS files now unpack more quickly, so you can get at the files you want even quicker!

MORE READY-TO-RUN SOFTWARE - Now there is a lot more software ready to run straight from the CD. There are less troublesome DMS files than before!

MORE FLOPPY DRIVE FRIENDLY - Users without Hard Drives will find this CD works better than the first one. We have even included boot-disks for most of the popular A1200 CDROM drives!

LESS 'BABE' SLIDESHOWS AND PICTURES - We have not included any of the boring and unoriginal swimsuit slideshows that you will find on other inferior CDs. These are really just padding, and we would rather use the space on this CD to bring you only THE BEST software around!

A SELECTION OF UN-DMS PROGRAMS - We have placed every program we could find to decompress DMS files on the CD. This makes it a piece of cake to get at the DMS files - either through double-clicking in Workbench or the interface of your choice. It's so easy!

MORE CD32 FRIENDLY - Due to some bugs in the Amiga operating system, the first AGA Experience did not work perfectly on a networked CD32 - we have hopefully worked around these problems, and the result is a real treat for CD32 owners!

ALL NEW AGA-ONLY SOFTWARE - Since the release of the AGA Experience Vol 1, there has been a massive amount of new, top-quality AGA software. Virtually nothing has been repeated on this CD from the first one. We now have many new sources of software, to ensure a constant stream of quality titles.

NEW USEFUL UTILITIES - After hearing some of the comments from the magazine reviewers, we decided to create a drawer containing useful tools. Inside the 'Useful' drawer, you will find an icon to copy DMS files to RAD: instead of DF0: (speeding it up enormously), TUDE (to make more demos/games run on 030+), and some boot disks for this CD! Something for everyone...

PLUS MUCH, MUCH MORE!! - Like exclusive game demos from the Amiga's top publishers, Exclusive version of AWeb for HTML Web page-like docs, More detailed contents listings, compatibility details on the AGA demos etc. etc.

We decided from the start that we wanted to have as much of the contents as possible ready to run straight from the CD. Some CDs have everything compressed which is in my opinion is really defeating the object of CD. Why

shouldn't you be able to use as much as possible straight from the CD? Due to this, we have also stayed away from confusing menu systems, and have opted for the approach most people should be happy with - a Magic Workbench front-end with virtually everything accessible through a standard double-click with the mouse button. With most things ready to run, this CD holds slightly less than some other CDs, but I think for most people having well over 900 meg (decompressed) is enough!

We are very proud to bring you this 2nd AGA-Only CD. We have again worked very hard on it for many months now, and have done our very best to ensure it is of the very highest quality.

We hope you enjoy using it, as much as we enjoyed creating it.

1.5 System Requirements

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

Most of the programs in this compilation were designed for use on an Amiga computer which is running a minimum of Workbench 3.0 or higher. A lot of the programs on this CD also require the AGA chipset, which at the time of writing includes A1200s and A4000s. Some of the programs on this CD will also run on the CD32 but may require hardware that is not available on the stock CD32 console.

If a program does not run as expected, please check that you have run the 'ClickMe!' icon first. If you have, it may be due to a lack of memory or an incompatibility with an upgrade you own.

Minimum Requirements

WB 2.04+
2 meg RAM.
CDROM drive (duh - really???)
Amiga (double duh!)
68000 processor.
ECS Chipset.

Recommended Requirements

WB 3.0+
2 meg RAM (or more - preferably some FAST RAM).
Double Speed CDROM drive (or faster).
Hard Drive (HIGHLY RECOMMENDED!!!)
Amiga 1200 (or higher).
68020 processor (or higher).
AGA Chipset (or Graphics card).

To fully utilize the programs on the disc, using the CD32 system, you may need to add the optional keyboard, mouse, floppy drive, and RGB

monitor. Some of the files in this collection may be stored in compressed formats and need to be decompressed to a floppy or hard disk to run. Due to the fact that this CD is NOT BOOTABLE, if you wish to use it on a standard CD32, you will have to use some sort of file transfer program in conjunction with a bootable CD. If you are not sure about this, we would be pleased to advise.

1.6 Loading Instructions

LOADING INSTRUCTIONS:

The following assumes you have already loaded Workbench (or you wouldn't be reading this! or would you??..... ;-)

- 1) FIRST OF ALL, DOUBLE-CLICK THE 'CLICKME!' ICON. THIS MAKES CERTAIN ESSENTIAL ASSIGNS.
- 2) MAKE SURE YOU ARE USING A SCREENMODE WITH AT LEAST 8 COLOURS. YOU CAN CHANGE THE SCREENMODE BY USING THE SCREENMODE PROGRAM IN THE PREFS DRAWER OF YOUR BOOT DISK (WORKBENCH). OR LOAD THE SCREENMODE.PREFS ICON. THIS WILL MAKE THE SCREEN FLICKER ON SOME MONITORS.
- 2) IF YOU ARE NOT ALREADY USING MAGIC WB, THEN THE COLOUR SCHEME WILL BE WRONG. TO CORRECT THIS, DOUBLE-CLICK THE 'CLICKFORCOLOURS ICON'.
- 3) IF YOU ARE USING A SCREENMODE OF 16 COLOURS OR MORE, SOME OF THE ICONS MAY LOOK ODD. TO CORRECT THIS, LOAD THE MAGICCOLORS PROGRAM.
- 4) IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO CHANGE YOUR FONTS FOR SOME THAT ARE IN MY OPINION MORE READABLE, LOAD THE 'CHANGEFONTS' ICON.
- 5) THAT'S IT!

You do not HAVE to do any of the steps except STEP 1. If you intend to use this CD through Shell or a Directory Manager (like Directory Opus), you do not even have to do this!

I would advise that if you are planning to use this CD a lot (and why not??), then you could make some of the above changes permanent. This will save you having to do all the above everytime you want to use the CD. Firstly, you should save your screenmode preferences for at least 8 colours. You should then save your palette prefs to keep the MagicWB palette. If you intend to use a screenmode of 16 colours or more, you should also put the MagicColors program into your WBStartup drawer. If you do these things, you only have to load the 'ClickMe!' icon each time, and the ChangeFonts if you want to change your fonts. (One easy way to make your Workbench permanantly MagicWB-ised is to install the MagicWB1.2 package in the AGA_Uutilities/MagicWB/MagicWB1.2p directory)

NOTE: If you have any problems following these instructions, then please read the Amiga Workbench/AmigaDOS manuals first. These will help you a great deal when using your Amiga in general. If you still don't have a clue, you can

contact us.

1.7 Floppy Boot-Disks

FLOPPY BOOT DISKS

Unlike some other companies, we understand that there are still some Amiga owners without a Hard Drive. Most other CDs either don't work, or are very limited when used on a floppy-only system. We have decided that this is not good enough, and have created special boot disks for these users. These disks allow you to simply insert a floppy, and it automatically mounts your CDROM drive, sets up the colours/icons and assigns etc. It makes using the CD an absolute joy.

Below is a selection of different boot disks for some of the most popular Amiga 1200 CDROM drives. Obviously, A4000 owners won't need a boot disk as they already have a Hard Drive.

SQUIRREL BOOT DISK

If you have a Squirrel SCSI CDROM drive, you can use the boot disk below. NOTE: This boot disk will assume that your CDROM drive is using SCSI UNIT 2. If not, you will either have to alter your drive to UNIT 2, or you will have to alter the CD0 file in devs/dosdrivers to use the unit of your drive. You can alter this file with any standard text editor (such as ED, which comes with Workbench). If you have any problems, please get in touch.

1.8 Useful?

That 'Useful' Drawer...

In the main CD directory, you will find a drawer entitled 'Useful'. Inside this directory, you will find several things.

First of all, is an icon called 'RAD-DMS'. Loading this icon will copy all DMS files to RAD: instead of DF0: Because they are copied to an area in RAM instead of slow floppy drive, they copy MUCH more quickly! You can then either try the program from RAD:, or reset your Amiga to boot from RAD: IMPORTANT NOTE: Due to the way that the RAD: drive works, you will need 3 MEG+ RAM to use this feature. This is because using RAD: takes away about 880K RAM, and most software requires 2 MEG min. to run.

There are icons to unpack Boot Disks for this CD in this drawer as well. Please read the 'Boot Disks' page for more details.

Lastly, there is a program called 'TUDE'. This can degrade your Amiga in an attempt to make it more compatible with some Demos/Games. This is only required for users with 68030+ processors and/or FAST RAM.

In the Extras drawer you will find a program called ARQ, we recommend that you run ARQ if you are running the demos. ARQ centres the requesters instead of placing them at the top left of the screen. It also shows a small animation.

There is also a program called dtack which makes the A4000 more compatible with some demos

NOTE: Only run ARQ if you have 4 meg of Ram or more.

1.9 AGA Utilities

AGA Utilities

On this CD there are over 100 meg of the best Amiga utilities. Most of them require a minimum of WB3, but some others require WB2.04+ There is an index in the drawer that lists the contents, and there are separate directories containing the files in order to keep the clutter down.

During the compilation of this CD, we have tried to update the programs as new versions appeared. Hopefully none of the programs will be too out-of-date by the time you see this CD.

There is no serious software repeated from the first AGA Experience, except when an updated version of a good program has appeared in the mean time.

1.10 AGA Demos

AGA Demos

On this CD there are over 150 meg of the best demos specifically for the AGA Amiga, ie, 1200/4000. Most of which are ready to run. The only demos which are not ready to run, are not Dos Disks.

DMS Files

Not many this time, only those that are not readable, to access these, double click on the icon you require, a prompt will then instruct you to insert a blank disk into drive DF0: Once you've done that, simply press return and the disk you require will unpack onto your disk ready to boot.

Ready To Run

Every readable disk we could find has been put onto the CD ready to run. To run these demos, simply double click on the icon and the demo will then run. Some demos will NOT allow you to exit back to Workbench, so at this point you will have to reset your machine. We've tried our best to ensure all ready to run demos run efficiently.

1.11 AGA Slideshows

AGA Slideshows

We know much people are getting pissed off with so-called babe slideshows, well, you won't find one on here. They are now forbidden! Good news for over-protective mothers isn't it mums?

There are ready to run slideshows and dms slideshows, again those of which are readable, are either put in the pictures drawer or will run a programmed interface to view the pictures.

To unpack a slideshow, simply double-click on the icon. Multidisk slideshows are in their own directory so you need to unpack all the disks for the required slideshow to run.

1.12 AGA Games

AGA Games

We have selected the very best AGA games released since the AGA Experience Volume 1 for this CD.

DMS Files

Any game which will not load via Workbench has been supplied in DMS format. These DMS's must be unpacked for you to be able to run them. To unpack them simply double click on the icon you require and insert a blank disk

into drive df0: the game will then be unpacked onto the disk ready to boot from floppy.

Note: some games will require a hard drive to run them, so obviously they will not boot.

Ready To Run Games

We have concentrated on loads of games this time, because of the shortage on the last CD, stacks of the damn things!

To run these games just simply click into the requested drawer and double click onto the games main icon.

Klondike users will be dissapointed this time round. Klondike is on the CD, ready to run, but we have inly included 10 card sets ready to use with Klondike, there are just too many, and like babe slideshows, people are starting to get pissed off with them.

Note: During testing some of the titles did not run on our accelerated Amiga 4000/040, but we are confident they should run on an Amiga 1200 but obviously we cannot be certain of this. Please let us know if you find any programs which do not run on your Amiga.

1.13 AGA Pictures

AGA Pictures

This time we have gone for original and unseen artwork all ready for you to view at your pleasure.

To view a picture simply double-click on the icon you require. The picture will then automatically be viewed.

If you are running this CD on an A1200, please allow time for the JPEGS to load, they are very slow at loading on a 1200, but please be patient.

1.14 AGA Texts

Misc Texts

Misc texts can now be found in the 'Diskmags' drawer, in here you will find miscellaneous texts files relating to ...miscellaneous topics, such a reviews, news, and articles.

1.15 Mods and Samples

Mods and Samples

We have selected the very best music modules we could find for your entertainment. On other CD's you tend to get a lot of mods repeated,

on this CD we have tried to get them from original sources.

To run a music module, simply double click on the icon you require.

If the selected module will not play, this means you have'nt got enough memory to play it. The mods on this CD are quite large, so if you haven't got much memory, you will probably find that a lot of them will not play.

Also in this drawer there is a selection of sound samples and some music utilities for the musical people out there.

NOTE: We now have some top new house mods from BabyDee.

1.16 Disk Mags

On this CD are the best Amiga disk mags released since AGA 1. These include the continued collection of the Amiga Report online magazine since vol 1, and many other varied releases from the past few months.

If you want to hear all the latest Amiga news and views, you've come to the right place!

1.17 Icons

Loads of new icons. This CD contains all the latest icon collections, backdrop collections and icon packs since the first CD.

1.18 Note

PLEASE NOTE:

In order to make most of the contents of this CD easy to use and ready to run without any troublesome decompression, we have in some cases changed the 'Tool Types' of some of the PD/Shareware titles on this disc. This was necessary because there isn't any standard file/picture/text viewer used, and this causes problems for the programs locating text viewers etc. In the documentation of some titles, it states that the files should not be altered. I don't believe that changing some tool types is in breach of this request, but if any author objects to this very small change (Surely not!), then just contact us, and we will take your program off the CD in the next release. Some programs that did not originally have icons, have had them added. This is to make them easier to use for beginners. I can't see anyone objecting ;-)

I really do wish all of this was not necessary. I know exactly how annoying it is when trying to read docs only to get 'Unable to open your tool XXX'! For beginners this can be enough to completely fox them, and I don't think I could

advise them to simply use the program without reading any instructions :-)
Also, occasionally some icon images have been changed in order to fit in with the MagicWB colour scheme. Just a reminder - if you like and use any of the shareware programs on this disc - consider PAYING THE SHAREWARE FEE!!!

HINT:

If you move some of the programs off this disc, and onto your Hard Drive for example you may find that when you try to read the docs, it says please insert volume aga. To get round this, simply click the icon once, then select 'Information' in the Icons menu. Change the line 'AGA:C/ppmore' to 'SYS:C/PPmore'. Then make sure you have 'PPmore' in the C directory of the disk you boot from. ('PPmore' can be found in the C directory of this CD.) This should solve all the problems.

Note: Some games/demos on this CD contain graphic sequences that may affect people with photo-sensitive epilepsy or similar conditions. If you have been advised to avoid strobe-lights or similar, you should avoid using these games/demos, or if you do view them, proceed with caution. Please contact your physician for further advise.

Other demos may contain language unsuitable for young children, although we have removed all the programs we have found containing offensive language. Some slideshows also contain pictures which many would find unsuitable for children, or those who find nudity offensive. As far as is possible, the individual descriptions should note this.
