MacLayers v1.30 User Documentation 17 May, 1993

Introduction

MacLayers is a VT-100 terminal emulator that allows multiple VT-100 windows to be opened on a UNIX[™] host simultaneously over a single serial connection. The remote host computer must be a UNIX system which supports sockets. Each MacLayers' window may be associated with a shell, login to a different host, or an individual command. Complete facilities are available for controlling the window and the associated host processes attached thereto.

MacLayers is free for all to use, but is not in the public domain. You may not sell MacLayers or any program derived from it.

Quick Start for MacLayers Experts

Here is the minimum information that users of MacLayers 1.20 need in order to upgrade:

1. MacLayers no longer uses the startup logfile to store its settings. Instead, user preferences are now stored in dedicated settings documents, which also function as startup documents. Support for the old logfile-style for storing settings has been abandoned.

2. New Finder icons for MacLayers have been introduced. You may have to rebuild your desktop in order to see these icons.

3. Keyboard support has been improved from previous versions., and as a result the MacLayers Keyboard resource has changed. Under System 7, users should drag the MacLayers Keyboard

file into their System folder.

4. Although it is possible to use MacLayers v1.30 with older versions of the UNIX-side layers program, to take advantage of some of the new features described later in this documentation,

you will need to compile and install v1.30 of the UNIX side. The README file distributed with the UNIX side describes how to recompile on the various systems that MacLayers now supports. The new version also compiles on many more platforms than previous versions, and includes a few minor bugfixes. It is recommended that all users upgrade to the new UNIX side.

The major improvements in 1.30 are support for a .layersrc file to store layers-mode

startup shells and window positions, reorganized keyboard remapping, more complete settings storage, support for mapping mouse-clicks to cursor positions under emacs (as well as vi), and compatibility with many more UNIX platforms.
