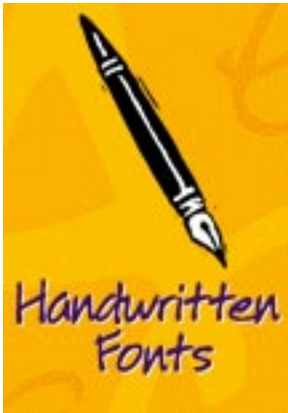

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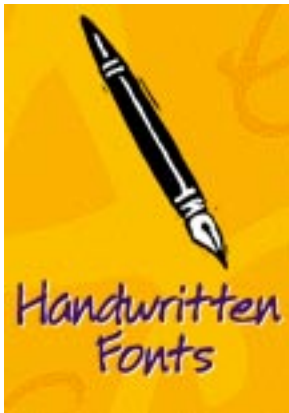
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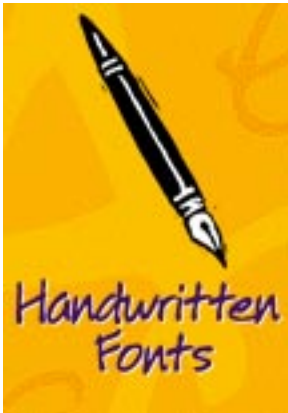
Understanding Font Terminology

The language of Type, as well as type technology itself, is undergoing change. The art and science of typography has been deeply rooted in tradition, first with scribes, then with moveable type & printers. As desktop and electronic publishing terminology gains widespread use, the meanings of the terms themselves have begun to change.

This is a brief description of the terms that we use in this ClickArt electronic document and in the manuals that ship with ClickArt Font products.

Font

Font technology today makes every font scalable, so for the purposes of this document, the word font refers to the particular style of a particular typeface; i.e: Alor Condensed, Alor Extended, Alor Thin, Alor Wide. Historical sidenote: In the days of metal type, a font



referred to a unique size and style that can be found within a particular font family. For example, in the Alor family there are many unique fonts: Alor Bold 12pt, Alor Bold 14pt, Alor BoldItalic 4pt, Alor Italic 28pt, Alor Normal 60 pt, each in a unique size and style. Each of these is considered a different font in metal type.

Typeface family

A typeface family consists of an entire collection of like fonts with a common basic design. For example, the Alor typeface family consists of all styles, weights and sizes of all the different permutations of Alor, i.e.: the Alor family includes:

Alor Normal
Alor Bold
Alor Bold Italic

A shorthand way to refer to the above family is "the Alor typeface." Generally, the terms font families and typeface families are interchangeable.

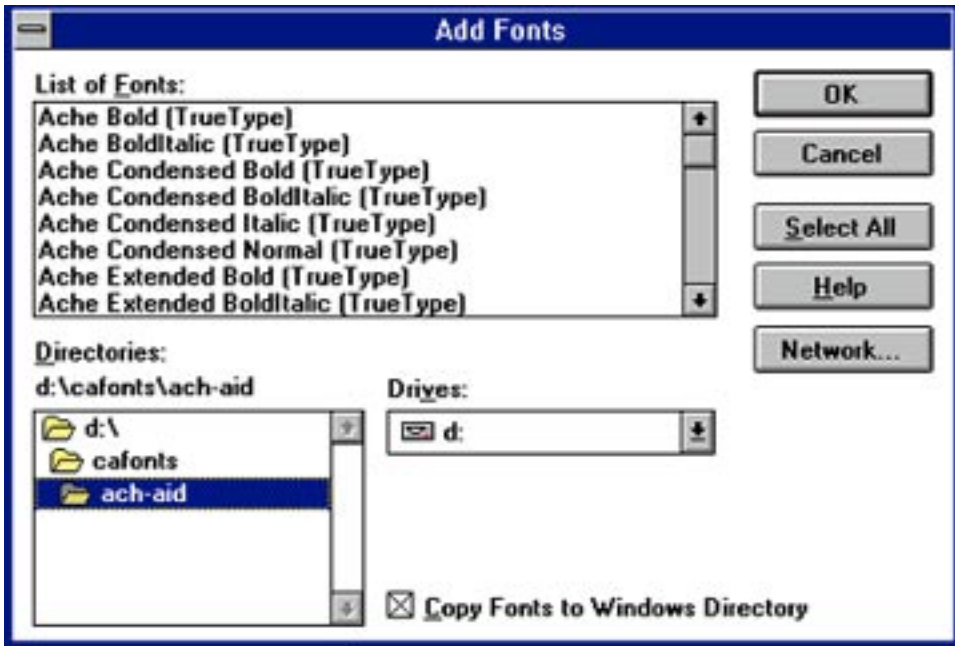
Installing TrueType Fonts in Microsoft Windows 3.1

1. From Microsoft™ Windows 3.1 Program Manager, open the Windows Control Panel (located in the folder called “Main”) and double-click on “Fonts.” The Fonts dialog box appears.



2. Click the Add button. The Add Fonts dialog box appears.
3. Put the ClickArt fonts floppy disk or CD-ROM disc in its respective drive.
4. In the Add Fonts dialog, click the scroll bar to right of the “Drives” list box and select the appropriate drive for the ClickArt disk.

- Using the Directories list box, navigate to the location of the fonts (usually in a folder called CAFonts). The fonts that can be added will appear in the List of Fonts box.



- Select the fonts you want to add. To select multiple fonts from the list hold down the Control key (CTRL) and click on the individual fonts. To select all the fonts, click the Select All button.

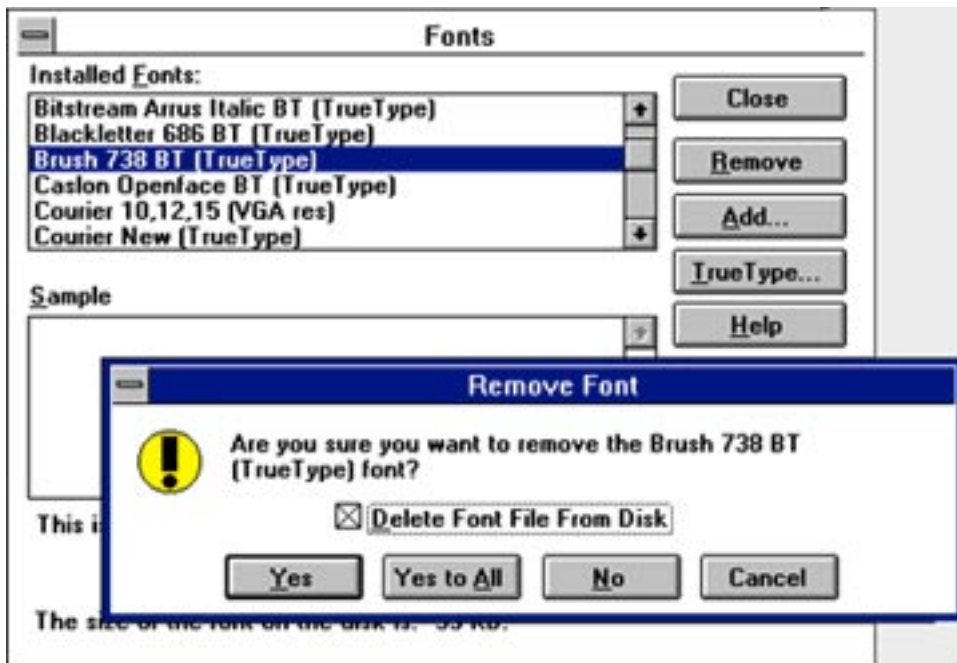
Warning: We recommend that you do not install all of the fonts at once. Installing too many fonts can cause problems with your Windows software, including memory errors and loss of performance. Only install the fonts you use frequently and remove those fonts you no longer use. For more intricate fonts, like cursive or old gothic styles, you should only install them while working on a particular document and when finished remove them from the font list.

7. Click Close to Exit the Fonts dialog box.
8. To use the fonts in your Windows applications, you may need to reselect your printer in Printer Setup in the applications's Files menu. Your application user manual should be able to answer any questions in this regard.

Removing TrueType Fonts from Microsoft Windows 3.1

1. From Microsoft™ Windows 3.1, open the Windows Control Panel (located in the folder called "Main" on your desktop) and double-click on "Fonts." The Fonts dialog box appears.

2. Select the fonts you want to remove in the Installed Fonts box. To select multiple fonts from the list hold down the Control key (CTRL) and click on the individual fonts.



Warning: The font MS® Sans Serif is used in most Windows dialog boxes. You should not remove this font, otherwise the text in the dialog boxes will be difficult to read.

3. Click the Remove button. A message appears, asking you to confirm your decision to remove the font(s).
4. If you want to remove the font completely from your hard drive, click the “Delete Font File From Disk” check box.
5. Click Yes. If you selected several fonts, click Yes to All.
6. Click Close to exit the Fonts dialog box.

Troubleshooting

If you have a problem using the TrueType fonts from ClickArt:

- Review this section to make sure that you followed all steps correctly and adhered to all warnings.
- Review the sections on TrueType fonts in the Microsoft Windows 3.1 user’s guide and in Windows on-line help.

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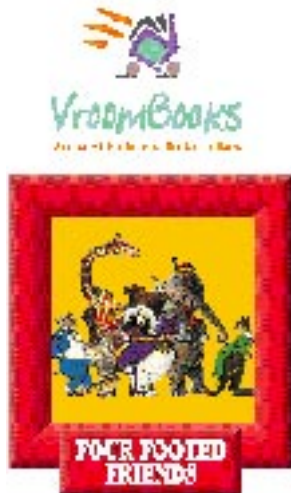

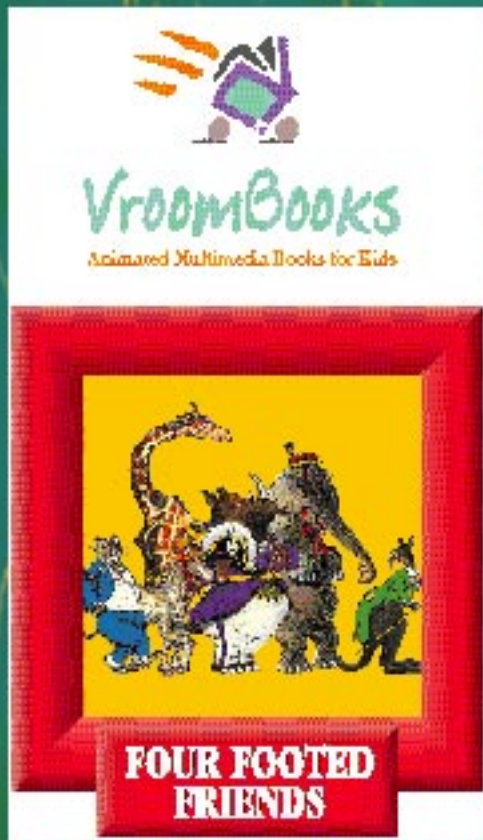

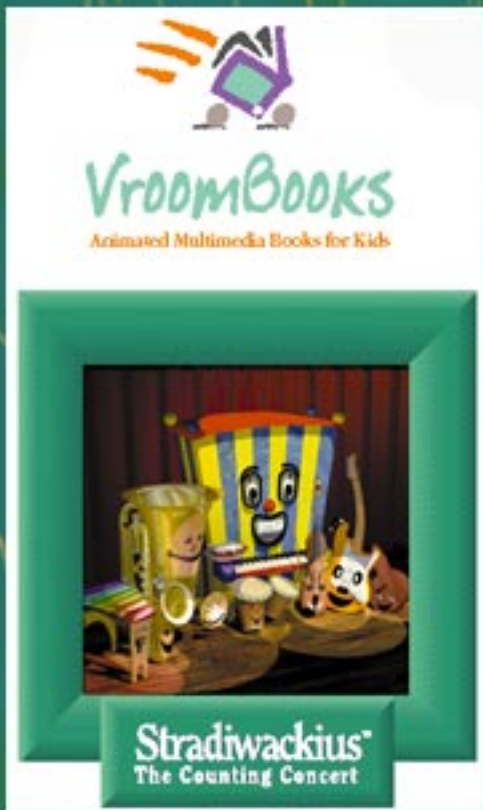


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
