"I don't use Macs. I just happen to like my taskbar docked at the top of the screen!"

Purpose

This little utility fixes a "bug" in Windows 95 that has bothered me and some friends since the early beta. The bug appears when the taskbar is docked on the top of the screen (like a Mac) instead of the bottom. I've never used a Mac, but I like having my menus drop down instead of pop up (that way the taskbar is near the caption bars and all my system functions are close to each other.) The problem is that new application windows sometimes appear underneath the taskbar so you can't click their caption bar. Since you can't click their caption bar, you can't easily move the window to correct this bug yourself.

The problem seems to vex some applications more than others (something about how they remember their location, I guess.) Microsoft Word is one. LView is another.

Shovelt fixes the problem by watching for windows that are created with obscured captions and moving them so they're visible. It can be set to automatically do this (every 5 seconds) or only on command. The tolerance can also be adjusted so that Shovelt either moves all windows which slip under the taskbar or only those windows whose captions are mostly obscured.

Installing Shovelt

Unzip all the files in the Shovelt ZIP file. Right-click on the Shovelt.INF file in the directory you unzipped to and select "Install" from the popup context menu. Shovelt will be added to your startup group and accessories group, and copied to appropriate directories. You can delete the extracted files after installing it.

Uninstalling Shovelt

In the control panel (Start->Settings->Control panel) click on Add/Remove programs. Then select Shovelt in the programs list and click the Add/Remove button.

Using Shovelt

You can manually adjust all windows positions by left-clicking the Shovelt icon in the taskbar notification tray (next to your clock).

You can change program settings by right-clicking the icon. This brings up a dialog that lets you change two settings:

Auto-Shovelt: When checked, windows will be automatically adjusted every 5 seconds Zero tolerance: Controls what windows Shovelt thinks need adjusting (try it)

If you click on **Ok**, the dialog will go away. If you click on **Quit**, the program will exit.

Distributing Shovelt

Technically Shovelt is freeware. It is freely distributable. You can give it away to your friends, put it on a CD, sell it for fun and profit (as long as you leave this README file intact), whatever. But I like to think of it as Praiseware. If you use Shovelt and think it's useful, send me a note telling me so. (If you hate it, you can write to tell me that, too.) Notes

Shovelt doesn't affect windows whose captions are not hidden by a taskbar or off the edge of the screen.

Shovelt won't affect windows which are AlwaysOnTop, Maximized or Hidden.

Shovelt now fixes problems caused by application bars other than the System Taskbar.

Shovelt's "splash screen" is now gone. I wanted it this way in the beginning, but I couldn't do it the obvious way because of the way Windows handles dialog box creation. I found **another** way to do it and did.
