Introduction

The ADI MPEG Audio **PLAY**er (**AMAPLAY**) is a full featured, high quality 32 bit MPEG audio player for use with Windows 95 and NT. AMAPLAY will not run under Windows 3.1 even with win32s (AMAPLAY is a very CPU intensive 32 bit application). Unlike other software players available on the net, AMAPLAY was optimized for MPEG sound quality, not CPU cycles. If you want to enjoy MPEG audio at its best, then AMAPLAY is for you.

AMAPLAY is representative of the audio quality that is used in the APOGEE Series of MPEG ASICs soon to be available from ADI. A unique capability of AMAPLAY is the re-synchronization of MPEG bit streams that may have corrupt header information. In addition, fast forward and rewind are supported while the bit stream is being decoded. In fact, you can move the slide bar both forward and reverse while a bit stream is being decoded!

Features

Supports full stereo playback.

Decodes and plays MPEG1, MPEG2, layer1 and layer2 audio files.

Auto re-sync on corrupt MPEG audio streams.

Supports fast forward and rewind.

Slide bar can be dragged forward or reverse, even while player is decoding.

Hardware

Requires a minimum of a Pentium-60 with 16 megabytes of memory for Windows 95 and 32 megabytes of memory for NT. In addition, a Sound Blaster 16 or compatible 16-bit sound card is required.

Installation

Simply unzip amaplay.zip in a empty directory of your choice and run the exe file amaplay. To remove AMAPLAY from your computer (why would you do that?), delete all the files in the directory you unzipped amaplay.zip in.

The amaplay.zip file contains the following files:

amaplay.exe	The 32 bit executable.
amaplay.hlp	The help file.

amaplay.cnt	The content file.
register.doc	The form to fill out and send to ADI.
test.mp2	MPEG audio test file at 44.1kHz, 384 kbit/s.

When amaplay.exe is run for the first time, it creates a file in \windows called amaplay.ini.
