What follows are the Healthy People 2000 Objectives that pertain to youth. The Healthy People 2000 project is a governmental project to set up objectives related to health to be attained in the year AD 2000.

I have copied the objectives verbatem from the guide (single copies available free below). The purpose of uploading this is to 1) help increase awareness of these objectives; and 2) solicit information from people who are involved in projects or activities that address (knowingly or unknowingly) some of these objectives, that is, what are you doing out there?? It is my belief that there are a whole lot of great programs and activities being done that no one outside of the local area knows about. We need to smash the communication barriers that exist a) into and out of the health care field; b) between urban vs non-urban areas; c) between geographical areas; and d) between the socioeconomic levels.

The Chinese symbol for crisis consists of two parts: the first means danger, the second means opportunity. I see the current health care 'crisis' as an opportunity to make great inroads into the <u>health</u> care of the people of the U.S. rather than to continue feeding the <u>illness</u> care monster. To do this, people from all walks of life (not just the health care 'experts') are needed to pool their expertice.

If you (or someone you know) have a program or activity that is working in these areas, or even areas that seemed to be overlooked, please upload and share with the rest of us. Your idea may make a world of difference in an area you never considered!!

I would love to have the teachers out there present these to their students and get suggestions from them how to best attain them (after all, this is about them!!).
