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Copying the Program

“The Sound-Trecker” is a shareware product. You are allowed and encouraged to copy the program freely to anyone, provided the program is copied entirely, including this licence agreement, the documentation, and the source codes. You are not allowed to modify the program in any way (if you discover bugs, please tell me to fix them).

Using the Program

If you want to use “The Sound-Trecker” in a non-commercial way, please pay \$30,- (or more, of course) to the author (address as shown above). If you can't afford it, pay \$20,-. If this is *still* too much, then just pay nothing, but send me a souvenir of yourself or your home town, for example

- a local newspaper (please only in German or English)
- an autograph plus photo of yourself (in case you are a V.I.P.)
- an autograph plus photo of a local politician (e.g. the mayor)
- a map and tourist information of your home town
- a prospectus of your university (if you're a student)
- a McDonald's credit bill
- a disk with many many new sound tracks (.MOD format)
- etc. (well, think of something yourself)

In case of a commercial use of the program, pay \$50,-.

Using the Sound-Trecker Routines in Your Own Software

The object code contained in the 'PSyn' and the 'STri' resources, as well as the source code of the example program “Simple Trecker”, may be used only in public domain software under the following conditions:

- the use in public domain software is free of charge;
- a commercial use is allowed *only* with my explicit written agreement;
- a public domain program using the code, as well as its documentation, must contain a copyright note about the two resources, including my address (as shown above);

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- a copy of the program has to be sent to me;
- a modification of the code is not allowed.

Translation

The Sound-Trecker is currently available in German and English. A translation into another language is easily possible by using ResEdit. Translation is allowed under the following conditions:

- the translation must be free of charge;
- it must be complete; all dialogs and alerts ('DITL'), all error messages ('STR#'), all other resources ('vers', 'BNDL' etc.), the documentation and the licence agreement have to be translated;
- a copy has to be sent to me.

You are not allowed to make any modifications of the contents or the object code.
