=== What to Try ===

There are potential incompatibilities with QVision 2000 or Dell 864 video drivers and QuickTime for Windows, and there are potential sound problems with QuickTime movies played on some Compaq machines. If you are using any of these configurations, you may have trouble playing movies in Telemark's Guide to Dogs. To determine whether the problem lies with your system configuration or with Telemark's Guide to Dogs, try playing a QuickTime movie with the Movie Player application provided with QuickTime for Windows. If the movie does not play correctly in the Movie Player, the problem is outside the scope of Telemark's Guide to Dogs.

=== Installation Notes for Windows 95 ===

- 1) On Windows 95, we recommend that you do not turn off virtual memory.
- 2) To improve CD-ROM performance on Windows 95, open the window named "My Computer." Open the "Control Panel" icon, then open the "System" icon.

Click the "Performance" tab. Under "Advanced settings," click the "File System" button.

Click the "CD-ROM" tab in the File System window. Set the "Supplemental Cache Size" as large as possible based on your available memory. Set "Optimize Access Pattern" to match the speed of your CD-ROM drive. The CD-ROM drive documentation should tell you the drive's speed.

Click the "OK" button on the File System window, then click the "OK" button in the System window. At this point, Windows 95 will restart, and the changes will take effect.
