Introduction:

The Juker is a versatile MIDI jukebox. Songs can be queued to play at a sequential or random order. Songs queued in one session can be saved to play automatically at the next session. The Juker saves its settings and windows location on exit to use them for the next session.

Brief Description:

Song queue box:

You can add songs to be queued for playing by simply dragging them into the Juker's window or icon (if iconified). Clicking on any song in the queue starts playing it.

Check boxes:

Continuous Loop starts playing the first song when the last one in the queue finishes playing (continuous play).

Random Order plays the songs in random rather than sequential order. This also effectively yields continuous play.

Save Queue on Exit saves the current song queue on exit, so it starts playing the same songs in the next session.

Buttons:

Pretty self-descriptive.

System Menu:

Ditto.
