Accounting for Delphi

Accounting for Delphi is a series of general accounting modules for Delphi, from ColumbuSoft, based in Ohio, USA. The package includes General Ledger, Accounts Payable, Accounts Receivable, Order Entry, Inventory/Purchasing, Fixed Assets, Payroll, Job Costing, Contact Management and Point Of Sale modules, with full source code included and no royalties to pay. Each module can be used alone or in combination with others.

The Point-Of-Sale module is new and includes support for an unlimited number of registers per store, completely mouse-less operation (for speed of data entry) and support for scanners, cash drawers and receipt printers.

The source code includes many utility functions that can be used in other apps, including a reusable report printer with preview.

Graphics Server 5.1

Bits Per Second have released version 5.1 of its Graphics Server charting library. The new release includes PNG file support (which

avoids the licensing problems of GIF) and a Delphi 3 package. There are a number of Active Server Page (asp) examples which illustrate how graphing and charting serverside applications can be created using Graphics Server and Visual Basic, plus enhanced multithreading capabilities for Windows NT C++ applications.

Chief's Installer Pro 4.01

The African Chief (email him at: laa12@cc.keele.ac.uk) has a new version of his award-winning installation package for Windows 3.1x. Windows 95 and NT.

New and updated features include an improved IDE, fully automated BDE installation, creation of self-extracting EXEs, a built-in ZIP compression engine, OCX and DLL registration, CD-ROM drive identification, desktop shortcuts under Windows 95 and NT 4.x, support for conditional defines and "autoexec" batch/ script files.

There are also substantial extensions to the batch language which enable those so inclined to wield control over the minutest details of an installation. The focus has been on ease of use, and the new IDE means that most installations can be created without any scripting.

DotHLP 1.1d Upgrade

This Help authoring tool from Auric Visions, written in Delphi and reviewed in the Launch Issue of Developers Review (check www.itecuk.com for an online copy of the review), has now been updated. In the Professional version, the import facility (which allows you to bring existing Help files into DotHLP) is much improved. Also, the facility to export Help projects to Rich Text Format (RTF) files has been enhanced. Auric Visions claim you can now produce a manual with embedded graphics in one RTF file,

with a table of contents and index, from your Help files.

ViCiouS Pro 1.00.00

Originally unveiled to the world in an article by "Dr.Bob" Swart in *The Delphi Magazine*, June 1996, the first commercial version of this version control system (VCS) has now been released by SureHand. The authors claim it is one of the few VCSs for Delphi and C++Builder that is able to recognize the relationship between a .DFM form and a .PAS unit file, using a concept called "File Families." You can obtain a trial version of ViCiouS Pro at www.surehand.com for 30 day evaluation.

Abbrevia Compression Components

TurboPower Software have released their native Delphi ZIP data compression components, which can create and use PKZIP 2.0 compatible files. You can use either the provided API for a codebased solution, or work with the visual components, depending on your requirement. Advanced features such as disk spanning, long filenames, passwords and comments are included. In the UK, Grey Matter (Tel: 01364 654100) will sell you Abbrevia for £117 plus VAT. There are no royalties.

Luxent Apollo 4.0

Recently formed component developers Luxent Software have released a new version of their database engine which supports Delphi 3 and C++Builder. As well as eliminating the BDE, Apollo adds support for FoxPro, Clipper and HiPer-SIx tables, memos, and index formats. Only 200Kb of distributable files are required. It also supports the native Delphi/C++Builder data-aware components as well as 3rd-party data-aware components. The new release includes Delphi 3 support, is 100% thread-safe (say the developers) and has support for user-defined functions (UDFs) within index/query expressions.
