3. Define and give examples of forest conservation Conservation consists of protecting our forests and using them wisely. Examples can vary.
4. The worst enemy of our forest resources is Clear cutting forests at a non-sustainable rate and the erosion of soil fertility that results.

- 12. How does the Forest Service protect Idaho's forests? The forest service protects forests by controlling and fighting fires. They also manage the cutting of trees to provide for the long-term delivery of multiple resources from our forests. The forest service also provides roads through forests. They also fight insect infestations and diseases that destroy millions of trees every year.
