

CUSTOM SIGNATURE TRUETYPE FONTS

Rhode Island Soft Systems, Inc. is pleased to offer a new service: Custom Signature Fonts. We can take your personal signature and turn it into a TrueType Font!

With a signature font, you will be able to press a key in your word processor, and have your signature placed right into the document!

Most "productivity" software takes longer to figure out than if the job were just done by hand. A TrueType signature font, however, is the one TRUE productivity tool we've ever seen: just plug it in, press a key, and stop signing individual letters!

Here are some of the time-saving benefits:

- * Add signature(s) and/or initials to memos and print them directly to the printer eliminating the need to sign the document later and fumble with the copy machine if more than one copy is required.
- * Add signature right into a document so that it can be directly faxed from the computer, without the need to print it down and sign it.
- * Add signature directly to a document and print multiple copies (especially when performing large mail-merges), without need to sign 200 letters.
- * No need to cut and paste signatures to the bottom of documents before making copies -- each document has a "fresh" signature.
- * If the boss gives his/her signature font to the secretary, he/she can insert signature without requiring intervention from boss, to sign routine, dictated memos, etc.

The base price for a signature TrueType font is \$75. Add \$20 for initials also. Quantity discounts are available if several persons at your location want their own signature fonts. Call for special volume discounts. 401-767-3106.

To get your own signature in a TrueType font, sign your name on a plain white piece of blank paper. The font will be scalable to any size, but please sign at least one inch high (a little on the large side) and use a dark pen or felt tip marker so that the signature scans well.

Your TrueType font will be mailed back to you on a diskette, complete with an easy to use installation/setup program!
