

The above limitations may be removed on the next release.

You can ADD and DELETE/UNDELETE a body by pressing the button so labeled.

The buttons located to the right of the ADD button are used to navigate to different bodies.



You can also type in a number in the Record box to jump to a body.

ESig Editor is used to make changes to ESig.ini. This version is limited to 1000 Body entries and 15 lines/header and lines/body. This was due to memory requirements; this will be worked on.

Even though the Editor is limited, ESig/ESig+ is not. If you use the Editor with an ESig.ini that is outside these limits, you do so at your own risk. I've not tested it to see what will happen to the ESig.ini. For safety reasons, ESig.ini is backed up to ESig.old.

The Save button will save changes to ESig.ini and keep the Editor open to make further changes. A copy of ESig.ini is made to ESig.old.
