## To All REC Users:

Here at last is the long awaited release of Beta-K. While a couple of nasty little bugs were discovered and fixed with this release, most of the release was either tuning or enhancement. There are required changes to the configuration file that you must make. If you do not, REC most likely will still run although not in the way you expect.

The major change in this release is multiple echo-lists per echohub. This will affect REC's security routines so please read the Beta-K release notes carefully. To help you resolve problems in this and other areas quickly and easily, the Dump Report (/V option) now shows complete security information for each echo. You most likely will wish to produce at least one of these reports and read it when you upgrade to this beta. You might be surprised at what you find out.

The beta release notes (BETA-K.PRN) have full details on what has changed, and need to be read even if you have been following the support echo. You will only earn problems for yourself if you do not.

Please get any problems with this beta reported back to me as soon as possible, so I can get them resolved quickly. I'd like to put Beta-L out within a month and the live release within of month of that release. To do this I need your help.

Thanks for using Remote Echo Control. To those of you who have registered, I also say thank you. To those that haven't registered, please do so. The cost of a net-mail message to my system is a pretty cheap registration fee, especially with full FidoNet net-mail routing.
