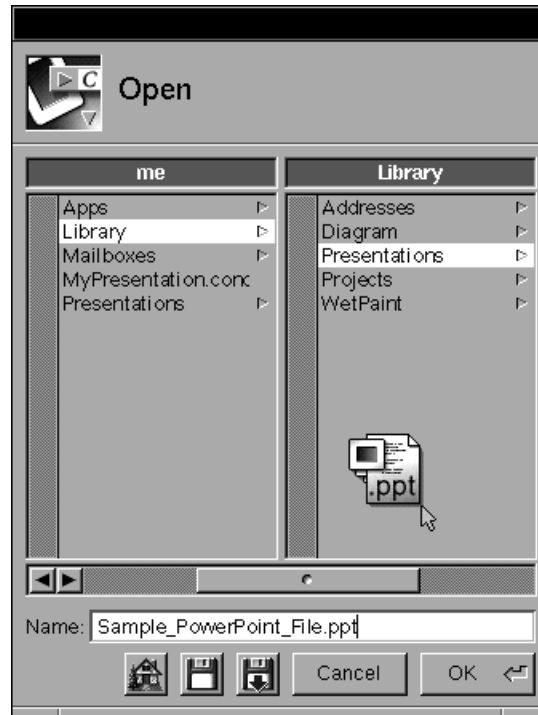
In early versions of Concurrency 2.0, only files created in PowerPoint for the Macintosh are recognized. In later releases, we will be adding compatibility for other presentation applications, including those for the Windows version of PowerPoint.

How to Convert Files

1. Append the file extension “.ppt” to any files you wish to import into Concurrency.
2. Simply raise the Open panel, select the file you wish to convert, then click OK.

That's all it takes!

4. Click OK.

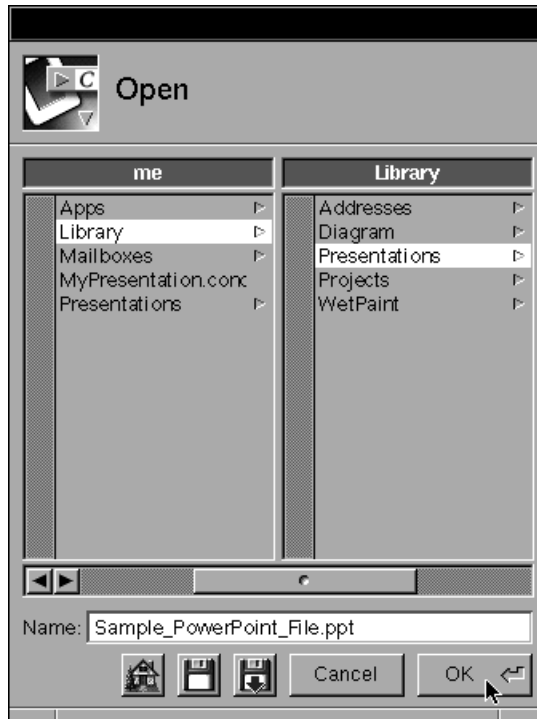
Note that the Concurrence converter will be launched (if it's not already running). The icon for this conversion application (which is also used to convert files from Concurrence version 1.0 into version 2.0) looks like this:



After the conversion is complete, the file will be opened in Concurrence. That's all it takes. The important concepts are listed below for handy reference.

2. Return to Concurrency, and choose Open from the main menu.

This will raise Concurrency's Open panel.



3. Drag the file entitled Sample_PowerPoint_File from the workspace into the Concurrency Open panel.

Appendix A

Importing Files

This appendix describes the general method to import files into Concurrency that were created and saved in other applications. Over time, we will be adding a significant array of compatible applications, from both the Macintosh and PC. The approach, described below, will remain consistent, however.

File Compatibility

Concurrency's Open panel recognizes more than just files created in Concurrency. In release 2.0 of Concurrency, files created in the Apple Macintosh version of Microsoft's PowerPoint presentation application with a ".ppt" file extension will also be recognized, converted, and opened by Concurrency.

Let's see how this works.

1. Select Samples from the Info menu item.

This will raise a Workspace browser displaying all available sample files.
