What are ZIP files anyway

Q: What do you mean by ".ZIP" file?

A: If you've logged onto a BBS or online system you've probably noticed file names that have the filename extension (last three letters of standard DOS filenames) of ".ZIP", for example "WINGAME.ZIP".

Q: What is a ".ZIP" file really?

A: "ZIP" files are actually what are called compressed files. It is usually a group of files that are used together, but they have been compacted into a miniature single "ZIP" file. The utility used to make these small compacted groups of files was developed by PKWare of Wisconsin and is PKZIP.EXE.

Q: Why are ".ZIP" files used?

A: Some time ago online BBS computer systems made available many files that you could download and use together. Sometimes you needed to download many files that had to be used together, but if you made a mistake and missed a needed file, then none of the files you obtained might run properly... The solution was to group these essential files into a single file to simplify the downloading procedure and to make sure you don't miss an essential file! Since ".ZIP" files are also compressed into significantly smaller files they also download alot faster saving phone bills!

Q: How do I make a ".ZIP" file usable?

A: PKWare not only makes PKZIP.EXE, the utility used to make ZIPs, but they make a utility called PKUNZIP.EXE, that is used to breakout all the files compacted into a single ".ZIP" file! So after you download a ".ZIP" file from an online system you can use PKUNZIP.EXE to extract the files so you can then use them!

Q: How do I get the PKWare ZIP Utilities?

A: Most online BBS systems have available a single file called PKZIP204G.EXE. Just download this file and run it. It will self-extract all the ZIP management utilities and documentation onto your disk drive. This is the shareware version of PKWare's utilities.

Q: Are there any other file compression utilities?

A: Yes, there are many others even though most of the time ZIP utilities are used to make these files. Here is a list of other DOS compression utilities:

filename.ext (extension)	utility

Q: Is PKZIP easy to use in Windows?

A: Well, no PKZIP and PKUNZIP are really made for use in MS-DOS. You can, after installing PKZIP on your disk use a menu shell for these utilities to greatly simplify 'zipping' or 'unzipping' groups of files. The most popular menu shell for MS-Windows is WinZip(tm). You can download all these utilities from Win-dy City Windows(tm) Excalibur free in Chicago by calling 708-595-1894. Most local BBS systems will also have these available!

What are GIF files?

What is a GIF?

A GIF file, or a file with the '.GIF' filename extension, is a graphics picture file! Originally this file was developed by CompuServe as a standard "Graphics Interchange Format" (GIF) file format. You can view these picture files when you download them on an Excalibur BBS! Just click the 'View GIF while downloading' in your Terminal setup. After you download these files, you may view them offline with popular shareware utilities. Popular utilities for Windows includes Paint Shop Pro(tm) and for DOS you can use a utility called VPIC.EXE!

- Excalibur enables the viewing of GIFs while you are downloading them! Just click the 'View images while downloading' switch in the Excalibur Terminal System Preferences drop down menu!
- Excalibur permits you to 'Preview' GIF images online! If you click the 'Eye' icon or the 'Preview' button, you will be presented with a miniature (NTSC) black and white image on your screen! This takes a few seconds on the host system, so you will have to wait for the image to appear...
- Excalibur tells you the image's resolution! If you double-click on the GIF file listing you will be given a detail box showing the resolution of the related image. VGA= 640x400
SuperVGA=800x600 or 1024x850...
- Excalibur has thumbnail 'preview' images! If you double-click on the filename the detail box will often present you with a 'thumbnail' size image of the GIF. Note: The SYStem OPerator must 'prebuild' these images, so if this has not been done, you will not see a thumbnail image...

Other Image Filetypes!

Other image type files are .BMP(bitmap), .PCX(Macintosh image), TIF... BMP files are most commonly used as Windows Wallpaper and in Windows PaintBrush files and for Windows Clipboard image transfers, for example into word processor documents..

Utilities for Images!

You can convert and alter the sizes and formats of these image files. We highly recommend the Windows utility PainShopPro(tm) mentioned above for these purposes. This utility is available on most BBS systems as shareware.

Modem Terminology

This is a glossary of terms commonly used by telecommunications enthusiasts, as well as words specific to offline mail reading and Bulletin Board Systems. We hope you find the information useful.

ARQ - Automatic Repeat Request. A general term for error control protocols featuring hardware detection and retransmission of defective data. This term is used primarily by US Robotics.

ASCII - American Standard Code for Information Exchange. A 7-bit binary code representation of letters, numbers and special characters. It is universally supported in computer data transfer.

Asynchronous - Data transmission in which the actual data is preceded by a start bit and followed by a stop bit since the time between transmitted characters varies. Compare Synchronous.

Auto Answer - The modem feature which enables detection of a ring and answering without assistance from a program.

Baud Rate - The number of discrete signal events per second occurring on a communications channel. It is often referred to as Bits per second (BPS) which is technically inaccurate but widely accepted.

BBS - Bulletin Board System.

Bit - Binary Digit. A single basic computer signal consisting of a value of 0 or 1, off or on.

Buffer - A memory area used for temporary storage during input/output operations.

Bulletin Board System - A host system, into which callers may dial with their modems to read and send electronic mail, upload and download files, and chat online with other callers.

Byte - A group of Bits acted upon as a group, which may have a readable ASCII value as a letter or number or some other coded meaning to the computer. It is commonly used to refer to 8-bit groups. 1 kilobyte = 1,024 bytes; 64K = 65,536 bytes or characters.

Carrier - A continuous frequency capable of being either modulated or impressed with another information-carrying signal. Carriers are generated and maintained by modems via the transmission lines of the telephone companies.

Conference - An area of public messages on a Bulletin Board System, usually with a particular topic and, often, a conference host or moderator to guide the discussion. Also called Folder, SIG (for "Special Interest Group") or Echo.

CCITT - A French acronym for the International Telephone and Telegraph Consultative Committee. This international organization defines the standards for telephone equipment such as the Bell 212A standard for 1200 baud, CCITT V.22 for 2400 baud and CCITT V.32 for 9600 baud.

CPS - Characters Per Second. A transfer rate estimated from the bit rate and length of each character. If each character is 8 bits long and includes a start and stop bit for Asynchronous transmission, each character needs 10 bits to be sent. At 2400 baud it is transmitted at approximately 240 CPS.

CRC - Cyclical Redundancy Check. An error-detection technique consisting of a cyclic algorithm performed on each "block" of data at the sending and receiving end of the transmission. As each block is received, the CRC value is checked against the CRC value sent along with the block. Many protocols including XMODEM-CRC and ARQ will request a resend until the block is received

correctly.

Download - Receiving a file from a Bulletin Board System, using a terminal program (for example QModem or Excalibur Terminal) and a transfer protocol (for example Zmodem).

DTE - Data Terminal Equipment. The device that is the originator or destination of the data sent by a modem.

DTR - Data Terminal Ready. A signal generated by most modems indicating a connection between the DTE (computer) and the modem. When DTR is "high" the computer is connected.

Data Compression Protocols - Compression of data by the modem allows more information to be transferred in a shorter time frame. Protocols for data compression include CCITT V.42bis and MNP 5,

Data Transmission Protocols - These are standards for modulation and transmission of data at various speeds. The standards are Bell 103 & V.21 for 300bps, Bell 212A & V.22 for 1200bps, V.22bis for 2400bps, V.32 for 9600bps and V.32 bis for 14,400bps. Proprietary protocols are also used extensively for higher baud rates.

Echomail - Public Message Conferences on a Bulletin Board System which are shared and distributed among other Bulletin Boards as part of an Echomail Network.

Expanded Memory - Extra memory (above 640k) on your XT or AT-compatible computer, which is installed with an EMS driver, and may be used by some programs to store data.

Extended Memory - Extra memory (above 640k) on your 80286 or 80386 compatible computer. Not normally usable by DOS applications, but may be configured as a virtual drive or a disk cache on an 80286 computer, or as Expanded Memory on an 80386 computer.

Flow Control - A mechanism that compensates for differences in the flow of data to and output from a modem or computer. Either hardware or software can be used for this control to prevent data loss. Hardware flow control using the modem makes use of a buffer to store data to be sent and data received. Flow control is necessary if the Communications port is locked at a higher rate than the connection rate. This is especially important for high speed modems, like 14,400 bps and above, that should almost always be setup for CTS/RTS hardware flow control.

Error Control Protocols - These are various modem-based techniques which check the reliability of characters or blocks of data at a hardware level. Examples include MNP 2-4, V.42

Freeware - Computer software which may be distributed on Bulletin Board Systems, and for which the author requests no license fee or registration fee.

Full Duplex - Signal flow in both directions at the same time. It is sometimes used to refer to the suppression of online LOCAL ECHO and allowing the remote system to provide a REMOTE ECHO.

Half Duplex - Signal flow in both directions, but only one way at a time. It is sometimes used to refer to activation of LOCAL ECHO which causes a copy of sent data to be displayed on the sending display.

Host System - Another name for a Bulletin Board System (BBS)

Internet - A worldwide network of computer systems originally founded for the US Defense Department but is now privatized and in use by some BBS systems for message and file transfers on a global scale.

Local Area Network (LAN) - A group of computers joined with cables and software, allowing hard disks and other devices to be shared among many users.

Mail Door - A subsection of a Bulletin Board System which creates .QWK mail packets for downloading and reading messages offline. Then .REP (reply) packets can be created offline and then uploaded saving online telephone connection costs!

MNP - Microcom Networking Protocol. A set of hardware error protection protocols (MNP levels 1 - 4) and data compression techniques (MNP level 5) developed by Microcom, now in the public domain. It makes use of CRC and retransmission of defective blocks by checking performed within the modem.

Netmail - Private electronic mail which is transmitted by a user calling one Bulletin Board System to another user calling a different Bulletin Board System.

NRAM - Nonvolatile Random Access memory. A user-programmable memory chip whose data is retained when power to the chip is turned off. NRAM is used in many modems to store default settings.

ON/OFF Hook - A descriptive term referring to manually lifting a telephone receiver (taking it OFF Hook) and replacing it (going ON Hook). OFF Hook produces a busy signal on the phone line.

Packer - A program to compress multiple files into a single file, such as PKZIP, ARC or LHARC

Packet - A mail packet (with a .QWK extension) from a host system

Parity - An error detection method used in both communications and computer memory checking to determine character validity. Communications now makes use of more efficient "block" checking although parity must still be matched in a communication session for transfer to take place correctly. Host communication in the BBS environment omits parity checking (no parity).

Protocol - A system of rules and procedures governing communications between two devices. File transfer protocols in your communications program refer to a set of rules governing how error checking will be performed on blocks of data.

Public Domain - Computer software on which no copyright exists (usually by a specific statement to that effect by the author), and which may be freely used and distributed.

Remote Echo - A copy of the data being received is returned to the sending system for display on the screen. See Full/Half duplex.

Shareware - Computer software which is distributed on the "Honor System", which may be freely copied and distributed, but for which a registration fee or payment is required for continued use beyond an initial evaluation period.

SysOp - The SYStem OPerator of a Bulletin Board System. The person responsible for setting up and maintaining the BBS. (CoSysop usually helps the SysOP...)

Thread - A group of BBS messages and replies linked and sorted by topic.

Unpacker - A program to uncompress a file from a Packer like PKUNZIP, UNARC...etc.

Upload - To transfer a file from your computer to another computer, using your terminal program (for example Qmodem) and a transfer protocol (for example Zmodem)

V.21 - CCITT standard for modem communications at 300bps. Modems made in the US follow the

Bell 103 standard.

V.22 - CCITT standard for modem communications at 1200bps, compatible with the Bell 212A standard used in the US and Canada.

V.22 bis - CCITT standard for modem communications at 2400bps. It includes automatic fallback to 1200bps and compatibility with Bell 212A and V.22 modems.

V.23 - CCITT standard for modem communications at 1200bps with a 75bps back channel. It is used in the United Kingdom.

V.32 - CCITT standard for modem communications at 4800 and 9600bps. It includes automatic fallback to 4800 when line quality is poor.

V.32 bis - CCITT standard for modem communications at 14400bps with automatic fallback to 12000, 9600, 7200 and 4800bps. As line quality improves communications speed can also be increased to the next higher rate.

V.42 - CCITT standard for modem communications that defines negotiation for LAPM error control. V.42 also includes support for MNP error correction protocol levels 1 - 4.

V.42 bis - CCITT extension of V.42 that adds data compression to the V.42 correction protocols.

Troubleshooting Windows Tips

Here are a few tips on troubleshooting your Terminal setup:

MODEM TIPS:

High-speed modem communications can sometimes prove a real challenge.
.. particularly if you just installed a new modem.

Here is a short list of other suggestions that should help you make
and keep a good connection. The following files mentioned are available
on windows techknow(tm) at 708-729-2902.

- (1) If you are running Windows for Workgroups 3.11, there is a bug
in your Serial.386 driver that seriously hampers high-speed
communications under Windows. In the Excalibur Support library
is the new Microsoft Driver. (SERIAL.EXE)
- (2) If you are using a computer with AMI BIOS dated 11-92 or earlier,
there is a bug in the BIOS when using high-speed modems on COM3
or higher. There is a fix for this as well in Excalibur Support.
(AMIFIX.ZIP)
- (3) If you are using a modem with a 16550 chip (use MSD.EXE in your
Windows DIRectory to check) then you need to replace the COMM.DRV
in your SYSTEM.INI with CYBERCOM.DRV. It allows high speed
communications under Windows. It is also located in the Support
Library, and it works on ALL Windows ver3.1 & up. (CYBER.ZIP)
The 16550 port utilizes special buffers to significantly improve
hispeed communications.
- (4) And, because of the way that Windows multitasks, it is possible
that it is ignoring your modem just enough to force you to drop
carrier. Check your modems manual for exact register (some are
different), but I have found that by setting S10=60 or higher I
have VERY reliable communications, even at 28.8K. The S10
Register on my modem is the "Delay between carrier loss and hang
up". If you make the equivalent adjustment to your modems INIT
string, you will see similar results under Windows (I hope!)
- (5) One of the most common sources of line noise is never addressed.
Bad cables and jacks oxidized for years can be a major source of
noise. In addition tangled power cords and phone lines can cause
low frequency noise to be induced into telephone line cables, so
it's always a good idea to seperate your power cables from signal
cables... low frequency 'hum' (60 Hertz or cycle) is in the same
audio range of audio circuits.
- (6) If you are using call-waiting the 'click' will always disconnect
you! Add to your dialing string or to the beginning of every
number in your dialing directory '*70\P' (no quote marks) and
this will temporarily turn off call-waiting. (in Ameritech or
Illinois areas) (\P is a pause, do not use commas in Excalibur
Terminal)

Ameritech in Illinois offers 'Line Backer' service to assure
quality phone lines. If you pick up your telephone receiver
and listen and hear static or background voices, that's a
problem. The line should be 'quiet', have your telephone
company troubleshoot your line!

The above driver upgrades are available fast online. Just click the 'Modem' button in the opening screen, and then the appropriate button to get the free driver upgrades from windows techknow(tm). We'll do all we can to make quality connections with your modem and to our system at 708-729-2902!

Windows 3.1, 3.11, and WFW 3.11 Tips: (not for NT or Windows95)

NOTES:

1. Make a backup copy of CONFIG.SYS, AUTOEXEC.BAT, WIN.INI, and SYSTEM.INI BEFORE you make any changes.
2. Add all new WIN.INI and SYSTEM.INI lines to the end of the section. This will prevent the variable from being overwritten later in the INI file.

CONFIG.SYS

1. DEVICE=C:\DOS\HIMEM.SYS /TESTMEM:off
 - The HIMEM.SYS line should be the first line in the CONFIG.SYS file.
 - This eliminates memory testing on system startup.
2. SHELL=C:\DOS\COMMAND.COM C:\DOS\ /e:1024 /p
 - Improves DOS application stability under Windows by providing more environment space.
3. FILES=60
 - Improves DOS application stability under Windows.
4. BUFFERS=10
 - Optimally, the buffers should be between 10 and 20.
 - This setting impacts SMARTDrive's performance.
5. STACKS=9,256
 - Not needed if you only run Windows programs.
 - Helps DOS applications process interrupts.

SYSTEM.INI

1. In the [386Enh] section, change NoEmmDriver=ON.
 - Use this unless you have DOS applications that require expanded memory.
 - This turns off the expanded memory manager.
 - Will improve Windows performance.
 - Do not do if using QEMM 7.xx.
2. In the [386Enh] section, add DMABufferSize=64.
 - This is the communications buffer between hardware and Windows.
 - The default size is 16K.
 - This will stabilize sound boards and will also boost tape drive performance.
3. In the [386Enh] section, remove CGAxxxx.FON and EGAxxxx.FON. Not useful since you can't run Windows under CGA or EGA.
4. Get WINSSENSE software.
 - This software is an encyclopedia of Windows INI files. It explains all the various switches and settings.
 - This software will optimize INI files based on a user survey.
5. In the [386Enh] section, set WinExclusive=Yes. For Windows applications, gives them nearly 100% of the CPU.
6. In the [386Enh] section, add XlatBufferSize=128.
 - This will increase the DOS communication buffer size from the default, 8K, for Windows applications (communications buffer between Windows, DOS, and BIOS).
 - This may hurt DOS application performance under Windows.
7. In the [386Enh] section, set KeyBoostTime=.005. This increases keyboard responsiveness by giving more CPU to the keyboard.
8. In the [386Enh] section, set PageOverCommit=1.
 - This redefines the default swap file recommendation from four times physical memory to one times physical memory.
 - Useful for technical support and Windows installers.
9. In the [386Enh] section, set MinUserDiskSpace=5000.
 - Changes the default from 500K.
 - When the user, goes below 5MB of disk space, Windows will warn and prohibit use until disk space is freed up.
10. In the [386Enh] section, add PageBuffers=32.
 - Use this technique, if you have 4MB of RAM or more.
 - This increases the default size from 4 (which takes 16k) of extended memory.
 - 32 page buffers takes 128K of extended memory.
 - This improves Windows' performance by eliminating a bottleneck.
11. In the [386Enh] section, add MaxBPs=768.
 - Reduces general protection faults (GPFs),

- application errors and lockups up to 90%.
- Every user should have this!
- Increases Windows application breakpoints from the default of 200. Windows itself takes about 150 to load.
- The default error message when breakpoints exceeded is a GPF.
- This technique adds 400 more breakpoints.
- 12. In the [386Enh] section, set Com1Buffer=512.
 - Changes the default from 128.
 - This is essential for high-speed modems.
- 13. In the [386Enh] section, set ComBoostTime=20.
 - Increases default from 2 milliseconds to 20 milliseconds.
 - Stabilizes transfer rate on high speed communications (9600+).
- 14. In the [386Enh] section, set Com1AutoAssign=-1.
 - Prompts user before another application is allowed to use the same port.
- 15. In the [386Enh] section, set FileSysChange=Off.
 - This prevents updates being sent to the file manager every time a file is added, changed, or deleted.
 - Use F5 key to update the File Manager window.
- 16. In the [386Enh] section, set ScreenLines=50.
 - Increases the number of lines visible in the DOS application.

WIN.INI

1. Clean up unused sections.
 - This is usually a major problem for Windows' users.
 - A smaller, condensed WIN.INI will improve Windows performance.
 - The WIN.INI file is limited to 64K - all else is truncated!
2. Reduce number of True Type fonts.
 - Every font is initialized when Windows starts.
 - Fonts consume system resources which may slow system performance.
 - Excessive True Type fonts contribute to Application Errors.
 - 250 fonts can consume 5-20% of the system resources.
 - FontMinder software allows you to load and unload fonts as needed.
 - 10 or less fonts are ideal.
 - Do not remove Arial or Times New Roman fonts
 - Windows requires these two fonts for operation.
3. In the [WINDOWS] section, add DefaultQueueSize=16.
 - Use this technique if your system has 4MB or more of RAM.
 - The default size is 8K.
 - This is a communication queue between Windows and Windows' applications.
 - Increases throughput, performance.
4. To change icon title font characteristics, go to the [DESKTOP] section and make these changes.
 - Add IconTitleFaceName=Arial (San Serif is the default font)
 - Add IconTitleSize=10
 - Add IconTitleStyle=1 (1 for bold, 0 for normal)

GENERAL

1. Use the semicolon (;) to disable INI file lines during testing. This allows you to quickly recover by removing the semicolon.
2. Reduce the video colors to 16 for performance improvement.
3. Eliminate complex wallpaper for performance improvement.
 - Windows redraws on every application close.
 - Fastest wallpaper is plain.
4. Eliminate complex screensavers (like After Dark).
 - Unnecessarily consumes systems resources and clock cycles.
 - This will improve Windows performance.
5. Defrag with /Windows as the first directory.
 - Moves Windows closer to the FAT and will allow faster loading.
 - Load your most frequently used applications 2nd, 3rd, etc....
6. Don't use disk compression (DoubleSpace, DriveSpace, or Stacker).
 - Use of disk compression can significantly reduce Windows performance.
 - If you must use disk compression, leave about 50MB or more uncompressed. Load Windows, and your most frequently used applications, on the uncompressed drive.
7. Optimum SMARTDrive size depends on the user.
 - Launch DOS 6.x's SMARTMON.EXE while in Windows. This will monitor the cache hit rate. The goal is a hit rate of 90% or greater.
 - Let SMARTMON work for about 4 hours, then look at hit rate. If the hit rate is less than 90%, increase the Windows cache size and rerun SMARTMON.
 - 1MB is usually ideal. 4MB if dealing with large files.
8. Should you replace SMARTDrive?
 - Adding a third party disk caching program, increases system maintenance complexity.
 - Some disk caching software can significantly improve Windows performance (e.g., Lightning for Windows).
9. Determine if write-behind disk caching is for you
 - /X parameter passed to SMARTDrive (DOS 6 only), enables it
 - Affects the File/Save function
 - Can contribute to FAT and/or file corruption if system is shutdown before writing to the disk is complete
 - Write-behind caching is a performance boost for files greater than 1MB
10. Use the /L parameter with SMARTDrive
 - By default, SMARTDrive loads itself high (27K), but it steps on video memory areas
 - /L parameter loads SMARTDrive in conventional memory

- This will improve Windows stability
11. Determining the optimum swap file settings
 - Permanent swap file is faster than a temporary swap file.
 - Ignore the swap file default settings - try 1MB.
 - A smaller swap file is faster.
 - When two-thirds of physical memory is used, then Windows begins using the swap file.
 - If the swap file is large, Windows will swap more.
 - To check out the swap file, click once on a program in the task list. Then watch the hard disk light.
 12. Use SCANDISK /ALL /CUSTOM before starting Windows (DOS 6.xx).
 - Or use CHKDSK /F (DOS 5 or lower).
 - Gathers lost clusters, eliminates cross-linked files, thereby providing more contiguous disk space.
 - Helps to reduce GPFs.
 13. Verify that the /TEMP directory exists and it has space to reduce GPFs.
 14. Do not select NONE (Do not turn off the swap file).
 - Turning off the swap file, disables all of Windows memory management, not just the swap file.
 15. Troubleshooting Tips
 - For video problems, use the Windows VGA driver. It is the most stable video driver.
 - Call the video manufacturer to obtain the latest video driver.
 - General troubleshooting: try these as needed
 - Turn off the 32-bit disk access
 - Clean up CONFIG.SYS and AUTOEXEC.BAT, enable drivers one by one until problem identified.
 - Upgrade to Windows 3.11 (standalone).
 - Use WIN /? to determine switch settings
 - WIN/D:X Excludes 640K to 1MB, loads the 16K translation buffer into conventional memory.
 - WIN/D:F Turns off 32-bit disk access for the current session.
 - WIN/D:V For troubleshooting hard drives (to make permanent, add VirtualHDIRQ=Off to the [386Enh] section of SYSTEM.INI.
 - WIN/B Creates a Bootlog.Txt file in the Windows directory
 - Shows status of all Windows' drivers loaded
 - Look for "LOADFAIL" - indicates the driver is either missing or corrupted.
 - Typically, TrueType fonts will be corrupted.

- Technical Support should consider periodically running this to detect problems before they occur.
16. Printing Tips
- Don't use print manager unless sharing printers with other users.
 - Try LPT1.DOS port, this port is managed by DOS (this solves many printing problems).
 - Turn off Fast Printing Direct to Port (will increase printing by 50-100%).
 - Use Adobe Type Manager (ATM) 2.6 or later
17. Don't let system resources fall below 20%.
- Go to Help About to check system resources available.
 - System resources is the #1 bottleneck in Windows.
 - If system resources fall below 20%, GPFs, lock-ups and application errors will dramatically increase.
 - Manages the graphical resources in Windows.
 - Two 64K heaps are the limitation (until Win NT or Windows 95).
 - Close applications when not in use.
 - Watch for "resource holders" - Excel 4.0 and 5.0, CorelDraw.
 - Exit Windows every night to free up memory and resources.
 - Use "Super Resource Monitor" software - monitors system resources and generates alarms and warnings at user-defined levels.
 - Upgrade your software to the latest maintenance release.
 - Limit the number of active TrueType fonts.
18. Windows Startup
- To bypass all programs in the startup group, start Windows and hold the SHIFT key until the Program Manager appears. This will NOT bypass "LOAD=" and "RUN=" lines in the WIN.INI file.
 - To bypass the Windows logo on startup, create a batch file as follows:
 - Type COPY CON nowinlgo.bat [Enter]
 - Type WIN and press F7 (you'll see WIN ^@)
 - Press F6 to end file creation
19. To recreate Windows groups - Main, Games, and Accessories
- Type SETUP /P and press Enter.
 - Information used to recreate the groups is found in the \WINDOWS\SYSTEM directory in the file SETUP.INF.
20. Control Panel Settings
- To keep items from loading, open the CONTROL.INF file with Notepad (or other text file editor). Then add a [DON'T LOAD] section to the end of the file. After the [DON'T LOAD] header, add [ITEM]=1 (e.g., Color=1).

- To launch a Control Panel item quickly, create an icon with the command line CONTROL PRINTERS (the item name is as it appears in the Control Panel).
21. To prevent users from arranging, moving, or deleting icons and groups, change all .GRP files to read only (in the \WINDOWS directory).
22. PIF Settings
- Every DOS application should have a PIF under Windows.
 - If not, will use the _DEFAULT.PIF settings.
 - Use the PIF Editor to make changes.
 - Select Video = Text for faster performance (the program will use low and high graphics if needed).
 - Set KB Desired to -1 unless other applications need memory (this is useful if you run one DOS application at a time).
 - Set EMS KB Limit to -1 (requires the EMM386 driver to be loaded).
 - Don't set the XMS KB Limit to -1 (this will degrade Windows performance).
 - Set the Execution Background to OFF unless you need multitasking.
 - Set Execution Exclusive to OFF. Use the Foreground=10000 (provides application with 10000 CPU cycles in each time slice).
 - PIFs Advanced Screen
 - Set Uses High Memory to Off, unless your DOS application requires HMA.
 - Set Lock Application memory to Off, unless the application crashes.
 - Set Monitor Ports - All to Off, unless garbled screen.
 - Set Retain Video Memory to Off, unless you run out of memory when switching to graphics mode.
 - Set Allow Fast Paste to On, unless pasting doesn't work (to allow pasting between DOS applications and Windows).
 - Set Reserve Shortcut Key to On, you may want to reserve the PrintScreen key to allow print screens within applications.
23. DOS Applications
- Run in full screen mode, Alt + Enter, will be 20% faster.
 - Run Windows in Standard mode for fastest performance (50%).
 - In the SYSTEM.INI file's [386Enh] section, set FileSysChange=Off. This prevents updates being sent to the file manager every time a file is added, changed, or deleted.
Use F5 key to update the File Manager window.
 - Change Control Panel's Time Slice in the 386 Enhanced Icon to 5. The default is 20.
24. Limit the number of other applications running at the

same time.

- Each DOS application receives a time slot.
- Each Windows application shares a time slot.
- This is a significant performance issue - it is preferable to run only one DOS application at a time.

24. Using MSD - Microsoft Diagnostics

- Useful to determine which memory areas to exclude from Windows' use.
