We received some responses and inquiries in regards to our review of SoftRam 95 in Issue 103. Most pointed out the controversy over the program being mentioned in various on-line forums that appeared after our evaluation of this wildly popular program appeared. "Syncronys has, however, indicated that a problem exists with the Windows 95 version, the net result of which is that *RAM compression is not being delivered consistently to the operating system*. (italics ours) The company believes that it has identified the solution to this problem, and its development team is working on a new upgrade release that will deliver full RAM compression functionality for Windows 95."

In the same release, Syncronys goes on to say that they will distribute the new upgrade to registered users and make it available through multiple on-line sources. As well, they are offering an immediate, unconditional money-back guarantee. Interested readers should return their product to the place of purchase or contact the company at 800-808-0064.

Readers are reminded that we at WOLR do not have the laboratory, and in most cases, multiple computer scenerios required to wring out products that the mainstream computer publications often employ. We can only communicate our personal adventures and reactions to a particular product in context with our experience. One can only assume that our writer's installation was one that apparently benefited from SoftRam 95, or conclude that he was human, like the rest of us (and many other magazines), and misjudged the product's effects during his evaluation.

Dozens of stories about it, over many months, as though it were something brand-new that had to be constructed. Some analysts, of course, had to wonder whether we could afford it, so suddenly it became a bigger story about how much it would cost.

I tried to tell a local TV reporter about the Internet one day, and he had no idea what I was talking about. But he was sure the "information superhighway" would be a great thing -- when someone built it.

we're all going to plug the "\$500 PC" into the "information superhighway" and we'll live happily ever after.

Well, the old gang is still at the same old uninformed stomping grounds. Now they're writing about something called "the \$500 PC." Given November is Comdex time, the media feels a responsibility to act knowledgeable about such things, so they descend on Las Vegas. Not being able to understand most of what's happening at the various venues, they report how we're all going to plug the "\$500 PC" into the "information superhighway" and we'll live happily ever after.

Poppycock and balderdash. Polysaturated silliness.

First of all, this proposal (from Oracle Corporation's Larry Ellison) isn't for a PC; it's for a terminal that is essentially dumb on its own, until it's plugged into a phone line (or ISDN, or your cable TV connection, or ??? -- take your pick). A PC? Not.

Secondly, Ellison's proposal comes from a firm whose admirable reputation is based on database systems; certainly not hardware. 

SMART VIEW

Another smart Smart program!



Oakley Data Systems has come out with some truly *Smart* stuff in the past, and they kindly present this **freeware** graphics program for your viewing pleasure. **SMTVW10.ZIP** (153K) presents a nice, sizable window, that can **quickly scan a directory and tell you the number of images present** that it can display, so you don't waste time opening thumbnails in a directory in which you're not interested. **Click when you're ready to scan, and image thumbnails appear,** and **click on any to open a secondary window with the image displayed full size.** Optionally, you can **enable any combination of bitmaps, metafiles, and icons,** even looking within files for icons. The toolbar also lets you **copy a chosen file to a directory, to the clipboard, or delete it.** With all options enabled, **it will handle BMP, ICO, WMF, EXE, DLL, CPL, and SCR files.** Thanks, Smart Guys!


Wolly's shareware adventures have left him with many scars and bruises — mostly from misbehaved apps that take bites from files, replace critical DLLs, and make hash of INI and registry entries. Good backups help, fershure, but some uninstall programs Wolly's used have not always been consistently friendly to the environs. Wolly could field-strip and reassemble Win31 blindfolded, but he's not quite as secure with Windows 95 and its System Registry. Here's another tool to add to the arsenal: if you haven't already noticed it, buried deep in your Windows 95 CD ROM's OTHER/MISC/CFGBACK directory is a pair of files, CFGBACK.EXE and HLP. Take Wolly's word for it, add these to your drive and place them in a suitable menu. You can use this honey to store up to nine backups of that delicate System Registry for restoration if needed. It saved Wolly from running into the streets screaming at least twice already, a mercy to everyone potentially exposed to such a horror. If you don't have the CD to snag it from, grab CFGBK.ZIP (49K) and add it to your Swiss Army Knife directory. And use it, frequently. And stay out of those streets.

While you're in that CD ROM neighborhood, take a look inside the /ERU directory, and grab it, too. Wolly would tell you that it's an acronym for Emergency Recovery Utility, but he doesn't want to spoil the surprise.





If you haven't noticed, those Windows 3.x icon grabbers don't quite know how to deal with Win95 files. This **freeware** program knows just how to **squeeze the icons out of EXE**, **DLL**, **and DRV files whether they are Win3 or 95.** Just **drag and drop individual or multiple files into the window**, and take a look at the guts, albeit slightly truncated (see in the illustration). You can scroll through the icons within, and **highlight one as Wolly has done to save it as an ICO file.** It will even **view appropriately sized BMP and WMF graphics as well as CUR and ANI cursor files.** Thanks to Mogens Hansen of Copenhagan, Denmark, for **ICOJUICE.ZIP** (34K); he'll send you the source for a fiver if you're interested.



This group of goodies from the folks at Microsoft was out earlier in the year, but were slightly less developed and some had expiration dates. Now, **PWTOY11.ZIP** (126K) is a definite grabbag of goodies, and *not* just for power users. Ed Hoffman highlights a couple in his article, <u>Useful Utilities for Windows 95</u> this month, and for once, he and Wolly agree. Especially handy for Wolly is **QuickRes** in its latest version, 2.1, a utility that allows you to perform that fabled **resolution switch on the fly**, quickly and without fanfare. It lives in the taskbar's tray, ready for action. Hallelujah! says Wolly. Also included is **TweakUI**, an applet that lets you **change menu speed, mouse sensitivity, window animation and sound, shortcut appearance and default names, choose the icons on your desktop, preselect boot parameters, and more. Yet there's more: Fast Folder, a context menu extension, FlexiCD, to improve audio CD handling, CabFile Viewer, so you can get inside those funky CAB files** that are filled with installation files, **Round Clock**, (who cares? Wolly has one on the wall), **Explore From Here, to open a new Explorer folder** from a right-click, along with **ShortCut Target Menu** and **XMouse.** Quite the haul. Brace yourself — these are **freeware** from Microsoft, although they are unsupported.


Wolly must grin and note that he often thought that some of the software he'd bought from Uncle Bill was unsupported as well. However, let's put all the nastiness aside and **thank the Win95 shell team for this great set of utilities.** Wolly can't help but get the image of the guys on the street with that game with the three walnut shells and a pea when he hears, "the Win95 shell team." Sorry, guys, we really do love you for this.



It isn't often that Wolly gets a computer excuse to **break out his rare 1927 vintage** tenor guitar with "The Gibson" painted on the headstock, but he needed to Tune!It. All you need to do is **plug your pickup output or microphone into your sound card, and pick a string** (pun intended). **The resizable display rather quickly zeros in on both the note and its deviation from dead-on,** so you can make the appropriate adjustment. You will probably also enjoy the **spectrum analyzer mode,** so you can **view the distribution of frequencies (harmonics)** produced. Tune! It has settings to restrict the frequency coverage (which is restricted a bit by being unregistered) and more. You can register **TUNIT104.ZIP** (129K) for just **\$18.00.** And actually, Wolly doesn't have perfect pitch — what he does perfectly begins with a "b."

To the rescue comes Ben Goetter of Angry Greycat Designs, a Microsoft Exchange, MAPI, and COM developer who's hard at work writing a book, *Developing Applications for Microsoft Exchange*, due from *Microsoft Press* in the first quarter of 1996. His little freeware DLL adds signature and read font choices to Microsoft Exchange! Grab INETXIDM.ZIP (15K) and use the REG file to enter the program into your system registry, and you, too, can

have **automatic signatures** placed at the end of your message. **A new tab is added with the options** (shown), and another **check-off option is available on the main Format menu,** so you can **disable the option for a particular message.** Thanks for the fine **freeware**, ferocious feline! While Wolly is allergic to developing applications, he wishes you well with your book.

Continuing his cheap streak with **Microsoft Exchange**, Wolly found another **freeware** goodie! **This one places the > mark in front of text to indicate your prior message quotations.** It **adds a new menu item under Format** also (note the "Use Signature" one already added from Internet Idioms in this illustration) that **will plug the quote mark in front of every line in a reply**, prior to your beginning to key in your response.. In <u>WOLR 101</u> I described three bibliographic programs for Windows. The facts about two of them--**Citation** and **EndNote Plus**--have changed with new releases. (The third, **ProCite**, also promises some significant improvements soon; we'll keep you posted!)

Oberon Resources has recently released **Citation 7.0**, and with that release has forced me to eat my words. "**Citation** is, and always has been, a WordPerfect add-on," I said in my last review, implying that it always would be a WordPerfect add-on, world without end. Even as I wrote they were proving me wrong: this new version works directly with Word 6.0 (but not Word 7.0, yet) as well as WordPerfect 6.x. And it can also now scan, insert citations into, and create a bibliography for files saved to disk as WordPerfect or Rich Text Format (*.RTF) files--which means that it can now be used with *any* Windows word-processor. In my earlier review, I said that **Citation** was miles ahead of the other bibliography programs in the flexibility and accuracy of the in-text and footnote citations it creates, and it still is. It still also is comparatively primitive in its interface, allowing you to view only one entry at a time. As the product has cut itself loose from WordPerfect, it now saves its files as ASCII text files rather than WordPerfect merge-format files. This means that you can manipulate them directly, and it includes conversion utilities for reading **Endnote** and **ProCite** files.

EndNote Plus 2 has not released a new version, but its most recent update is now fully compatible with WordPerfect 5.0-6.x and AmiPro 3.0 files. It is also the first bibliography program to support Word 7.0.

One more comment. In the review, I signaled that there was no one bibliography program that did well everything such a program should. That is still the case--EndNote offers far more sophisticated and flexible database functions, while Citation is the formatting champion. But the excellent EndNote filter now included with Citation makes it possible to use the two programs together, and in fact that is what I now do: I use the former as my research database, and the latter to format my citations.

Cheers! Finally someone has actually produced what may prove to be the height of practicality and flexibility in HTML authoring tools. **WebMania! 1.1** by Q&D Development incorporates a very healthy blend of friendly assistance and user configurability that was previously unavailable in this realm.

Anyone having even "half an eye" on the explosive growth of the World Wide Web cannot help noticing the speed at which new capabilities and features are being added. Threedimensionality, sound, video, frames, Hot Java, Fountain, VRML, new CGI capabilities -- you name it! are being implemented at a pace that, at the very least, is hard to keep up with. All of these new features necessarily carry specific new sets of instructions that must be followed -- new syntax that must be employed in an HTML document -- in order for them to work.

When executed correctly, the viewed end product is delivered in straightforward fashion. All of these features simply "appear" on the page when it loads into the browser. That is exactly how it *should* be; the actual process should be transparent to the user. This simplicity, however, belies the tediousness required to produce such a smooth effect. The creation of a single page sometimes takes hours and hours of fine-tuning so that it *can* be delivered in that fashion.

Those who wear the hat of "HTML Author" understandably find themselves hard-pressed to settle on construction tools that won't need to be updated the day after tomorrow in order to keep up with the changes. Inevitably, by the time you have worked with an authoring tool long enough to feel comfortable and reached a level of proficiency and speed that just might be able to make you a couple of bucks, the proverbial rug gets pulled from beneath you. Forces over which you have no control suddenly change the rules, or add important features that your chosen authoring tool simply cannot handle. Under these volatile conditions, what can you do?

The most effective HTML tools are designed to alleviate repetitive drudgery and preclude the need to attend to every detail. After all, there has to be some room in here for creativity! **WebMania! 1.1** is an elegant answer to that prayer. Pictured below is a screen capture of the main interface:

The most striking feature of the interface is the incredible number of blank buttons. (In the above graphic, button labels with an underscore are ones that I configured in my copy.) This is the key to its flexibility. Each button can be configured to create the HTML tags of your choice, and can be organized in any order you wish. When it comes to speed of execution, a single mouse click beats drop-down menu selection hands down! Not only does this facilitate speed and ease of function, but it also provides loads of room to accommodate tags that have yet to be invented. Because it can so easily adapt, it is quite possible that you may never need another authoring tool for text based HTML.

Configuring the buttons is a snap. Click your right mouse button with the cursor positioned over the button of your choice, and a dialogue box like the one on the right will appear. It's a simple matter to fill in the blanks, click "OK" and move on to the next button. The preconfigured, hard-coded buttons address well-established functions that are used commonly. They abound with similar handy dialogue boxes that prompt you for required or desired

particulars to help you get it right the first time. **WebMania** contains thorough on-line help, including a brief tutorial.

The relatively recent advent of forms and tables, though not yet standardized, has been a welcome addition to the HTML armamentarium. These structures are being implemented in novel ways to enhance function and appearance all across the Web, adding quite a bit to the users' enjoyment. The downside of these features for an author is the additional detailing necessary to customize the display. This contributes unfortunately to a lengthening of the creative process.

WebMania! comes to the rescue here in a very big way. A step-by-step interface for constructing forms is built right into the application. This arm of the program completely incorporates another popular shareware HTML authoring application known as **WebForms**, written by the same authors.

You can see that there are plenty of manipulable variables that must be attended to. The General Tab (pictured in the foreground) permits easy entry of title, customized appearance details and importantly, invisibly coded email destinations for the completed form. For browsers that are not forms-capable, there is an allowance to provide the user with an email address for manual submissions. 'Submit' and 'Reset' buttons may optionally be retitled, and are automatically placed at the end of the form. This marvelous Form Window transforms an otherwise grueling task into a relative "fill-in-the-blank" lark. An equally simple interface is provided for table creation (pictured below). To accomplish your purpose, you do not have to be an HTML expert!

There is one other exceptionally nice feature I'd like to point out. The dialogue box provided to choose background and text colors permits the user to simply click on the desired color in a familiar color box. It then automatically translates the choice into the required RGB hexadecimal notation and places this into the tag. You will also find this feature in **WebMania's** popup for document 'Body' characteristics encountered during regular page creation. I have found this to be a great time saver, and an easy way to experiment with different "looks."

WebMania can be registered in two flavors: Standard or Professional. The distributed shareware version contains all of the functionality that is active in the Professional version. Whenever you happen to use a feature that is unique to the Professional version, a popup appears to inform you of same. My compliments to the authors for a.) including all of the available features in this distribution, thereby permitting a potential registrant the opportunity to decide which level he/she wishes to register based on hands-on experience; and b.) going to great lengths to differentiate, thus ensuring that the user is not misled into believing that all features are included in the Standard version.

Because I am in the business of HTML creation, I am constantly on the lookout for new and better tools to assist me. Accuracy, time-saving ease of operation, flexibility and extensibility are the critical elements I watch for. As of this writing, **WebMania 1.1** fills the bill better than any authoring tool I've yet encountered. It also happens to be an excellent example of the programming power of Visual Basic 3.0.

You certainly do not have to take my word for any of this. **WebMania** is freely distributed as shareware and can be downloaded from the Windows OnLine BBS as well as many others. I encourage you to grab it and try it out. You won't be disappointed.

Leading Text is a text string which appears in a a Form's heading. It will appear appear above any Text Inserts or controls you place in the Form.

Text Inserts are text strings placed within a form. Place as many Text Inserts into a form as you like. Order of appearance may be designated at Form Completion.

Text Fields are simply fields in which users may enter text. Typical uses include Name, Address, and Phone Number. A **Comment Box** is used to allow users to respond to your form at length.

Radio Buttons are like Check Boxes except that users can select *only* one item from the group.

Check Boxes permit users to select more than one item from the group.

List Boxes in are controls which present a list of items from which only one may be chosen.

Graphics are included in a form simply by entering the path and filename of the graphics file. You may also indicate "Bottom", "Top", and "Middle" alignments.

Hypertext Links are easily inserted into a form.

Trailing Text will appear at the bottom of your form, just above the 'Submit' and 'Reset' buttons.

The **Completion** tab is the last stop on your way to completing the creation (or modification) of a form.

FONTSPEC PRO

a review by Ted Tatmai


I admit it. I'm a font junkie. Give me a CD-ROM full of cool True Type fonts and a booklet that shows me what they look like, and I'm a happy boy for hours. I love checking out the various utilities to view and print out typeface samples. But, if you're a font fancier like me, when you upgrade to Windows 95 you find out that many True Type font utility programs no longer function properly. The main reason is that Win95 puts all your TTF (True Type Font) files in their own directory, WINDOWS\FONTS, whereas Windows 3.x dumps them all in the WINDOWS\SYSTEM directory. Those bothersome FOT files are no longer necessary, so many of the font utilities written for Windows 3.1x get very confused.

I was happy to see that one of my favorite font utilities, **FontSpec Pro**, now works with Win95, as well as Windows 3.x and Windows NT. During the install, it detects where your version of Windows says your TTF files are and adjusts itself accordingly. The latest version (7.0) has been completely rewritten; it was formerly compiled in Visual Basic and has been redone in Delphi. When you first start it up, you'll immediately notice its snazzy new tabbed notebook interface, complete with a digital clock that even shows the seconds (Why didn't Microsoft build this into the Win95 clock?) and a status indicator of system memory and resources. They're nice extras in a program that has so much going for it.



Basically, **FontSpec Pro** does three main things well: the viewing, printing, and managing of your fonts. It works with both the True Type and Postscript (ATM) variety, plus Windows screen fonts. You can display your installed fonts in sizes from 6 to 99 points using different effects (bold, italic, strike-through, etc.) and justification modes (left, center, right).

It's easy to preview or print pro-quality font specimen sheets of fonts (installed or uninstalled) using several different formats including single or two-column, full sheet, and keyboard display. The specimen sample is fully customizable from point sizes to which fonts print to the actual text printed. (By the way, **FontSpec Pro** creates the snazziest looking spec sheets I've ever seen.) You can also scan your disk drives and print reports based on the fonts you have, which would be helpful in finding font duplicates. Need to look at (or even print) fonts on a CD-ROM? No problem. The options are nearly unlimited.



If you're like me, you usually have too many fonts installed on your system. With Win95, there's no longer a performance hit for having a large number of installed typefaces, except for the time it takes to scroll through an application's font listing. However, in Windows 3.x having a bunch of those fonts installed at the same time takes up a good chunk of memory and slows your system down.

FontSpec Pro gives you a method of managing fonts in smaller bite-size chunks which are called "Font Groups." A Font Group is a collection of fonts which you intend to use together, for a certain purpose. For instance, you can create a group of fonts that you use for one project. Or, you can make a group of your favorite fonts. You can then install and activate any Font Group you choose. If you want, you can even mix groups, combining two or more to create a new group.

FontSpec Pro is so flexible that the number of options might be a little intimidating at first. There are *lots* of check boxes, buttons and viewing windows that do take a little while to figure out. Luckily, the program has balloon help that's activated by resting your mouse cursor over the feature you're unsure about. This takes the place of a standard help file, and the README document that comes with the program is very helpful. Furthermore, the author of the program has made himself accessible to the point that he doesn't even mind hearing from unregistered users (phone or e-mail) if they have questions.

If you need a way to manage the fonts on your system, then I'd highly recommend **FontSpec Pro.** Its specimen sheets and viewing capabilities are superb. Unless you're a *total* font dweeb like me (who always keeps at least a half dozen on my hard drive just for kicks), it could be the only font management utility you'll ever need.

USEFUL UTILITIES FOR WIN95

a review by Ed Hoffman

In spite of the unavoidable shortcomings of any new operating system, Windows 95 has certainly improved, or at least changed, many of the ways we work within Windows. Many of the imperfections in Windows 3.11 have been corrected, or at least improved, in this new version. Regardless of the improvements, there are still a few areas where even this powerhouse needs a bit of help.

I've long had great confidence in the host of Windows shareware authors and I knew it would not be very long before a profusion of utilities and add-ons would appear for Windows 95. As I expected, no sooner had Windows 95 been released, than a wealth of shareware programs and utilities began to pop up. Some of these offerings are very ho-hum, where others are really quite useful. The following are a few of the better utilities available today. While they may not solve all your transition problems, adding these to your system can make Windows 95 a bit more manageable and perhaps even somewhat more user friendly.

EZDesk 1.7

One of the more noticeable differences in the new Windows 95 is the appearance of the desktop. Where earlier versions of the operating system required Program Manager to start most of your programs, the Windows 95 desktop is actually a platform for storing and launching many of your frequently used programs. This makes using your computer a bit simpler and faster. Unfortunately however, you may occasionally find there are problems in keeping your icons properly arranged on the desktop. Whether you inadvertently move the icons, or some misbehaved piece of software rearranges your desktop, there are times when your nicely arranged desktop becomes jumbled. Though you can manually rearrange the icons, a simpler way is with the *EZDesk 1.7* program.

This utility takes a snapshot of your desktop and can automatically restore your personal choices whenever necessary, saving your layout for any of the screen resolutions you normally

use. This allows you to keep different arrangements for different screen configurations. *EZDesk* will either install itself as a notification icon on the taskbar or can be set to operate in the background and activated with a hot key. This utility is an ideal add-on for the Microsoft® QuickRes utility, which is also included with the *EZDesk* utility. In addition to maintaining your desktop layout, *EZDesk* also offers a variety of other useful features. One function I find especially useful is the <u>Clear</u> option. Clicking on this menu item allows you to clear the contents of the Documents Menu, Temporary Directory, Run List, and the Recent File List.

QuickRes 2.1

One of the more annoying requirements of the Windows operating system is the need to restart Windows just to change the screen resolution or display. While this may not be a giant task, it is an irritation. I would have thought this would be one of the first features that the programmers at Microsoft would have fixed as part of the new Windows 95 operating system. No such luck. But at least someone at Redmond also thought this to be important because, though it isn't part of the new operating system, *QuickRes 2.1* is part of the **Microsoft Windows 95 Power Toys**.

This applet provides a quick and easy way to change DPI and bit depth without rebooting your computer or even restarting Windows. Like *EZDesk*, this applet places an icon in the notification area and allows you to switch your screen display with a simple click of the mouse. Then once changed, the new resolution is instantly available.

🔊 QuikView

Another very useful freeware utility from Microsoft is the *QuikView* applet. This utility adds considerable flexibility to the Windows Explorer. With *QuikView* installed its a very simple matter to peek inside a file without actually opening the document. In use, simply open a folder and select a specific file. Then click the right mouse button and select Quick View from the available options. A small window then opens to display the contents of the file. The *QuikView* applet is furnished with almost thirty DLL files that will permit the program to view a wide variety of standard file types.

PrintSwitch 4.0

Some time ago, (in WOLRS28), I wrote a review covering an earlier version of the PrintSwitch

utility. Now, there's a brand new version of this very useful utility for Windows 95. Like the other programs mentioned here, this utility serves a single function, printer management, and it does this very well. Rather than fumbling through a series of steps to get to the Printers applet in the control panel, the PrintSwitch applet sits right on the desktop. This small, unobtrusive, box can also be moved or resized to suit your requirements.

In use, a simple mouse click on the box brings up a complete listing of all the printers attached to my system. All I need do is select the printer I want and *PrintSwitch* makes all the necessary changes. There is also a small box at the right end of the box that allows you to switch the printer orientation. Click the mouse on this letter and the utility instantly switches the printer orientation. When the printer is in portrait mode the letter "P" is displayed. The letter "L" indicates landscape mode. A simple click with the right mouse button on the *PrintSwitch* box allows you access to the printer properties for the currently selected printer. If you often switch between different printers, or different modes with the same printer, this is one utility you might want to look at.

Hot Corners

The *Hot Corners* utility has turned into an applet that I now wonder how I've lived this long without. This little applet does only two functions: it turns the screen saver on or off. No big deal you say? Well, as I've frequently found, some programs just refuse to coexist with a screen saver. My tape backup software, for example, stops copying when the screen saver activates. I found this quirk a while back when my tape drive was still whizzing a half hour after I thought it should have finished. As soon as I moved the mouse and my screen popped back to live I found that my backup was only 25% complete. Thereafter, I made it a point to disable the screen saver before performing a backup.

Now, with *Hot Corners*, rather than turning off the screen saver with the Control Panel, all I need to do is drive my mouse to the upper left corner of the screen and voilà! no more screen saver. If I want to turn the screen saver on, I just drive the mouse to the lower right corner and a second or two later the screen saver appears. I've added *Hot Corners* to my StartUp group so, now each time I load Windows 95, the program is instantly available. This applet also places

an icon in the notification area of the task bar and allows you to select the activation corners with a simple click of the mouse.

Although these Windows 95 utilities may not cover every possible Windows function, they do perform their specific tasks very well. Each of these utilities and applets can certainly help to make the transition to Windows 95 a little less traumatic. Likewise, by simplifying these routine chores, these applets will also make us all more productive. This way we can spend more time with our applications and less time fiddling with Windows. Each of these utilities is quite useful and they all definitely deserve a test drive.

Regular readers of WOLR might be interested to know that Wolly, perpetrator of our "Shareware Briefs" section and alter-ego of our editor, can be as cranky with WOLR writers as he is with needless or sloppy shareware. A few months ago he subjected me to what I was pleased to treat as good-natured ridicule over my enthusiasm for eccentric information managers—software for organizing free-form "information" rather than orderly "data." But I want to reveal to everyone that it was Wolly himself who brought to my attention HyperNotes, a shareware information manager for Windows 3.x and Windows95 that some readers might find useful.

The program takes as its task the filing, searching, and linking of short documents, each of which gets its own title and window. You can create new documents from within **HyperNotes**, of course, or paste text from other applications; or you can import ASCII text or Rich Text Format (*.RTF) files. For testing the program, I imported all the "readme" files that came with Windows95 and its new applications.

The screen shot shows you two of **HyperNotes'** three main screens, and illustrates several of its strengths and weaknesses. After a search has been executed, a "Search Results" window shows you the long names (which you assign within the folders) of the notes that match your search; double-clicking on one of them brings up the document window for that note. The

searches are very fast, and (in Windows 3.x) the long note names are far more useful than the ASCII filenames that separate text or word-processing documents must use.

If information in one note pertains to information in another, you can establish a *hypertext link* between the two. I've long advocated hypertext linking as an under-exploited tool for connecting and organizing disparate information; **HyperNotes'** very name shows how important this function is in the conception of the program, and its implementation is wide, if not very deep. In addition to *hypertext* linking, it also allows *hyper-MIDI*, *hyper-WAV*, *hyper-VIDEO*, and *hyper-BMP* links that allow you to call up instances of these different file types from one double-click. Most usefully, perhaps, you can also create a hyperlink *to a search*; so that if you often search for all the documents containing the word "printers," for example, you can save that search and make it easily retrievable from a link.

But despite the broad application of hyperlinking in **HyperNotes**, there are real limitations on its power, the greatest of which is that it allows you to link a phrase only to an entire note. In other words, while you can link a phrase in "Win95 Readme 1" to "Win95 Readme 2," you cannot link it to any particular *part* of that document; once your double-click on the link opens the second document, you must either scroll through it or execute a "Find" command to locate the pertinent passage.

And this limitation even more seriously compromises the searches I've already discussed: after your search has retrieved several documents matching the search criteria and you have opened one of them, there is no way of going straight to the word or words you were searching for. You must, again, execute the "Find" command to get there. This limitation is particularly annoying if you have performed a Boolean "or" search (for notes containing *either* "print" or "fax," for example), since you then must "find," separately, the terms on either side of the "or."

The final and, to my mind, greatest limitation on the program is that searching is the only mode of finding information in notes. The best information managers offer at least two different ways to find what you want: either by searching or by browsing the titles of different documents, for example. This is crucial, simply because the human memory, as we all know, is a capricious creature. You might start out with only a vague idea of what you're looking for, and need something more articulate than a search to help you realize what it is: browsing document titles, or looking at the top-level entries in an outline, for example, can sometimes take you straight to what you want, or at least give you the words with which to search for it. In HyperNotes, you are just out of luck if you cannot think of precisely the right words with which to formulate your search.


The program does offer one superb innovation in its user interface, called the *HyperBar*. **HyperNotes** will reduce to a tiny taskbar that will attach to other applications' title bars. Clicking on the little binoculars inaugurates a search; the Search dialog, the Search Results window, and the note that you choose to open will all present themselves directly onto the screen *without ever opening the main window*. This brilliantly convenient trick is something for which the author deserves great credit; I hope either that other, more powerful applications will take up the idea, or that he will continue working on **HyperNotes** to make it as powerful as it might be. As it is, I would urge readers with need for sophisticated free-form information management to consider commercial products like *Ecco Professional*, *FolioVIEWS*, or (my own favorite) *askSam*, or shareware products like *WhizNotes*. But if you need an inexpensive and very usable program for assembling and searching all those little documents, HyperNotes might be just what you need.

BUSINESS CARD DESIGNER PLUS



Most of us have to go out and pay a print shop to make up cards we have designed or have them design and print them from scratch. This can add up to some pretty high costs, especially if you keep changing physical or e-mail addresses, or have to frequently change your business name to keep ahead of your reputation.

If you are tired of paying those outrageous prices to have your own business cards printed up, **Business Card Designer Plus** may be your answer. It lets you quickly and easily create your own, professional quality, 3.5 inch by 2 inch business cards in just minutes without the hassle of paying someone else big bucks.

Business Card Designer Plus comes with a variety of tools, arranged in floating boxes (or accessible from menus), that let you add text and/or bitmap graphics, draw lines of various thickness, create boxes, draw circles, change the background/foreground colors and more.

One of its neatest effects is the Rotate Text feature. Calling this up lets you change the alignment of new (or selected) text anywhere from between 0 and 360 degrees.



Business Card Designer Plus has some good printing features, as well. You can preview your cards before printing them in order to get them just right. Once they are you can print anywhere from a single card to a whole sheet of them. The program also lets you easily adjust the offset settings so the entire page can be shifted up/down or left/right. You can also adjust the horizontal and vertical gaps to increase or decrease the space between each card.

Business Card Designer Plus utilizes full click and drag that allows you to size, move, cut, copy, and/or paste objects or text very easily. It makes use of the right mouse button to call up a floating menu whose available options depend on the type of object you are working with and the position of the cursor.

The only downside to the program is its zoom in/out. When you zoom in on a card making it larger than your screen display, there are no scroll bars to move around within the card. This is a major oversight in an otherwise great bit of programming.

Despite the zoom problem **Business Card Designer Plus** is one of my shareware favorites. I was able to design and print my first stunningly attractive business card in less than 15 minutes from installation. This is one program that can save you a lot of money and it's quite a bit of fun to use.

BUSINESS CARDS



There are two sides to every business card, other than two physical ones that is. One side is collecting them. It seems every time I turn around someone is handing me their card. Not that there is anything wrong in this as some of my best contacts have come about from a card introduction. The problem here is, with so many cards changing hands, it can be hard to keep track of them all.

I have had so many cards given to me over the course of time. Quite a few of them have been for important contacts too. Unfortunately, I do have this knack for misplacing items like addresses, phone numbers, business cards, cats, etc. That was until this program came into my life.

BusinessCards is one of the most versatile and useful databases to come around in a while. It lets you keep records of almost anything you can think of while incorporating two things that are usually contradictions. It is both easy to use AND very powerful.

It's ring binder interface, with tabs for the alphabet along the side, feels very familiar and so makes it easy to learn. Each page of the binder can display from one to three cards (the size of the cards changing with the number displayed). There is also a table of contents view you can call up in order to scroll through your collection to quickly find an entry.



BusinessCards is not limited to just being a warehouse for your contacts and phone/address listings. It does this excellently, but each card entry is a scrollable freeform note field where you can enter ANY data you want. If you need a database of the software you own, gardening information you have collected, a list of your video/audio tapes, genealogical information, ANYTHING, then you need look no further for an easy way to record it.

As a writer, one of the features I love, is that **BusinessCards** allows you to attach one or more external files to specified cards. A small paper clip appears at the top of the card that, when clicked on, allows you to select which attached file you want to run. If it is a data file, **BusinessCards** will launch the attached file using the program associated with it.

Another neat thing is its drag and drop capability. If you need to place an address from one of your cards into a letter you are writing there is no need to use copy and paste. Simply drag the card directly into your open word processor file and the card's selected information will be transferred instantly.

Its search and sort capabilities are also first rate. If you have more that one entry matching your search parameters **BusinessCards** displays a list of them so you can turn to the one you want. It also has flexible printing options making it very easy to get just exactly what you are looking for in your hard copy.

As a bonus, the program comes with BusinessDialer. This phone utility has a traditional

keypad entry interface for placing phone calls through your computer. One of its features that is not traditional is its Speed Dial. It lets you store up to 90 phone numbers. That helps someone who has many phone contacts, like myself. There are ten pages of nine numbers each so you can organize them by type most painlessly. BusinessDialer also comes with an international area code list which displays a database of country and city codes and a USA area code list which displays state and city codes. No more wasted time or headaches in obtaining them from traditional phone books or by calling the operator.

Don't you hate it when you have to dial one of those mnemonic phone numbers, like 1-555-MYTH. With my nowhere near 20/20 eyesight and low patience level I get frustrated when I have to figure out the number (one of my personal quirks). Well, BusinessDialer recognizes and dials mnemonic phone numbers for you!

Another thing you'll like is its timer. This lets you keep track of how much you are spending on that long distance call to Uncle Ralph in Utah or that new business contact in Hong Kong.

BusinessCards and BusinessDialer are linked together. You can highlight a phone number on a card entry and have it transferred to the dialer, with just simple mouse clicks, saving time and eliminating dialing mistakes.

There are more little features to this program that you will have to explore for yourself (I am still finding them), but if you need to organize any information you have then I recommend

checking out this great bit of software first. It may just be all you need.

Here's a case where the number thirteen may in fact be a lucky number for the inventive folks at Autodesk. At this point it is very hard to know whether the computer manufacturers have been leading the charge with their advanced megahertz chips and gigabyte storage devices or the software systems people have been at the head of the pack with advances in DOS and Windows technology. One thing is clear; AutoCAD 13 has taken full advantage of the power of both.

If you work as an Architect, Civil Engineer, Plant Engineer, Manufacturing Engineer, Facilities Manager, Piping Designer or any other field where your ideas are recorded and conveyed to others it doesn't take much to step up your productivity. The minimum you need to get started is a 386 IBM compatible PC with a math coprocessor and 16 MB RAM, Windows 3.1, MS-DOS 5.0, a minimum 35 MB hard disk, a VGA video display and a mouse. Of course, the more power you throw at the system, the more you will get out of it.

Documentation

Most reviews of software deal with the program and its interface with the user at the computer level. AutoCAD 13 has taken full advantage of the Windows environment with its online help. Click on the question mark and the familiar Help dialog box pops up. In addition to the conventional Help with hypertext, there is an interactive tutorial that walks you through the full range of features from simple lines to complex rendering. If you don't want to key in the commands, click on "Demo" and you will see all the steps done for you. It doesn't take long for the new user to become familiar with the command structure this way.

With programs as powerful as this, supporting documentation is often a confusing mix of books requiring a degree in library sciences to figure out. Not so here. One book features all of the commands in an easy to use format. Another is a user's guide that steps you through the system in a logical way. While each book has its own index, there is separate booklet that has a comprehensive index for the entire system. From the size books and clarity of the presentation, it looks like Autodesk has beaten the after-market publishers to the punch.

The "Cockpit"

Taking control of AutoCAD 13 for the first time is somewhat like slipping into the pilot's seat on a modern airliner. The early versions of CAD programs seem like the open air cockpit of a Sopwith Camel (WW I fighter flown by Peanuts' favorite pilot, Snoopy). Just looking over the controls on the screen, one gets a feeling of power and finesse available at the click of a finger. The usual menu bar appears in its appropriate place at the top of the screen. But, then a bewildering collection of buttons with cryptic sketches on them show up across and around the screen.

It seems that AutoCAD is a command driven software package that requires the user to type in the correct word and the values it expects in order to execute properly. The button bars present the visual equivalent of the desired command. When the user clicks a button, the correct

function is automatically entered on the command line in a box at the bottom of the screen. Since it is sometime nice to know what you did in the previous command, you can enlarge the size of the command line box to suit. Nice touch!



The button bar feature covers a bewildering range of features. Every command that can be called from the menu pull downs or typed in on the command line has an associated button. The buttons are also arranged in logical groups with fly-outs. Select one button and a series of other buttons pops out at right angles allowing you a multitude of choices. And, to make your life even easier, each button will display its own label when you pass the arrow over it. So, while you are busy trying to figure out what that dotted line with two circles at the end may mean, AutoCAD pops up a label for you. As you become more accustomed to the symbols, you will point and click before the name appears. The array of buttons that appear can be tailored to your specific needs. Those commands that you use all the time will be just a click away.

How many times have you forgotten the name of a file you wanted to call up? How many times have you remembered the name but couldn't remember what was in it? Again, Autodesk has added a nice touch. Click on the "Open File" button and a familiar dialog box pops up. Familiar? What's that viewing area on the side labeled "Preview" doing there? That's right! Each drawing you stored will appear in the Preview window as you click on the file name. No more guessing, no more time wasted calling up the wrong drawing. What you see is what you get (sound familiar?). This feature becomes even more important when you are inserting one complicated drawing into another. Picture placing a chalet you designed for the mountains resting on the topography of a seashore.

Text

All CAD packages offer a complete package of geometric features to allow the user to complete a drawing. With the ability to customize the toolbar to suit, AutoCAD has just made their package even easier to use. However, the real kick comes when it is time to add text to the drawing. Every designer has to convey his idea in both lines and text. In the early days, draftsmen struggled like monks of old to put on paper that which the "master" intended. That may also be why pencils of old had lead at the front end and rubber at the back. Some old timers will report using motorized erasers to speed up the editing process!

Users of word processors are familiar with numerous varieties of fonts. We have been spoiled with the ease of editing text. Our vocabulary and knowledge of the English language has begun to atrophy with the grammar and spell checkers available at the click of a button. No longer do we typists have to slap the return lever to move the carriage to the next line; the computer automatically wraps the words to the next line. Some of us remember early CAD packages and it was very difficult even lining up our text, let alone having it left justified, right justified, or center justified. And finally, Windows has given us the gift of "Cut", "Copy" and "Paste". If you like what you said on the first page, copy it to the second. If what you wrote on the first page belongs elsewhere, cut it out and paste is elsewhere.

Well, AutoCAD seems to have come out with a word processor with a powerful geometric capacity. You can justify, cut, copy, paste, word wrap, check spelling and most anything else that a word processor can do. Your text can appear along all six faces of a cube or you can identify a pipe with text between the two lines. No longer do you have to complete your geometry on your CAD system and try to use your word processor to add the finishing touches. This can all be done beautifully within AutoCAD 13.

Dimensioning


It is important for designers to convey proper information on their drawings that will enable others to complete the project whether it is a simple object to machine or a building complex to construct. Without dimensions on the drawing, the lines are all but meaningless. Dimensions tell us how much, how wide, how tall, how deep and even how many. AutoCAD's dimensioning capacity is outstanding. Dimensioning is much more than simply a line with two arrows and a number. There are linear, radial, angular and ordinate (datum) dimensions. And AutoCAD makes all of these very easy to add to a drawing.

The new treat comes with a new dimensioning feature that is critical to containing costs while ensuring a quality product. Geometric tolerancing is the latest means of conveying information regarding not only the dimensional values but also the relationship between these values. The form that this information takes has been standardized so that everyone is "singing off the same sheet of music." Punch up the Tolerance button on the Dimensioning toolbar and fill in the blanks in the dialog box. Gone are the days of "plus or minus" and other vague references to tolerance. What you see (want) is what you get.

Three Dimensions

Early 3-D CAD systems were really like the early 3-D movies except that you didn't have to wear the goofy glasses. You were either working with a room sized computer or you were getting 2-D. When your design was finished, the chances were that you were looking into the center of a "fur ball" with all the lines used to express that third dimension. Looking at a simple box for too long often led to spatial disorientation with the lines moving into and out of the page as you tried to decide which end was up. Later versions came out with hidden line processors that simulated 3-D and removed the "fur ball" aspect of reviewing the drawing. However, users of such systems learned the true meaning of the word "infinity" by waiting for the hidden line processor to hide the lines.

AutoCAD 13 has incorporated a full-blown 3-D capability right in the package. Solids is the wave of the future. 2-D designers think in flat terms. Their designs are then given to others who have to convert these designs into 3-D components. When working with 3-D CAD, the designer must think like the guy who has to make his part. Want a simple cube with two holes through it? Call for the Box button, give it a size and then subtract (drill) two cylinders (holes). Simple? You bet!



When working with solids, you will be amazed what you can find out about your designs. Most of the screens will show the parts in wireframe format. Type "Hide" or hit the button and all the hidden lines will disappear. In the cube you designed, you will see three sides and parts of the two holes you drilled in the top, just like you would if you held it in your hand. With solids you will easily be able to spot interferences between features. A workholding fixture designed for welding shows the parts to be welded into a finished weldment. But, it also shows the clamps and locators that make up the fixture. When you see that half of one of the clamps is missing, it is clear that there is interference that must be eliminated before this fixture is sent out to the shop to be built.

Other Features

Sometimes you need to put a little more into the drawing than lines, numbers and words. In some cases, the drawing has to convey not only facts but also a feeling. Picture the architect trying to give his client a realistic view of his design. Black lines on white paper are difficult for many of us to warm up to. AutoCAD 13 has a shading function that brings the three dimensional feeling to the drawing. But, something is lacking.

In the real world, we see things because light is reflected off the surfaces of a variety of materials. The rendering function lets you set the scene. You choose the lighting, the colors and even the type of materials your design will use. With an optional program, AutoVision, you can add shadows and texture and you can simulate transparency and refraction. While Michelangelo doesn't have to worry about another Mona Lisa being created, your renderings will be your own Mona Lisas.

With AutoCAD, you can embed your drawing into another document. If you want to link your drawing, every time you change the original drawing, the document containing this drawing will also be changed, eliminating the need to continually search and update your files. Using the reverse process, you can easily embed or link external documents like spreadsheets with your drawings.

It is sometimes important to be able to communicate with the past (we are not suggesting a seance). Files can be exported in translation formats like IGES and DXF. But, you can also export and import files in AutoCAD 12. This can be very important when your customers have not yet upgraded to AutoCAD 13.

Conclusion

AutoCAD 13 could be a lucky number for those fortunate enough to be using it. The changes to the cockpit have made it possible for pilots of earlier versions to sit in the chair and start some serious flying, right away. When you open the hatches and look what's under the hood, you can see that Autodesk has put a lot into this baby. And, boy does she fly!

NORTON NAVIGATOR FOR WINDOWS 95

Many millions of users recently upgraded their operating systems to Windows 95. For most, the experience was a pleasant one. There are some of you, however, who may feel like you were left adrift in the middle of uncharted seas, in need of a new navigator. Well, fellow users, you just might find one in Norton Navigator for Windows 95. This utility package is the product of the combined technology of Central Point's PCTools and Xtree along with Symantec's Norton Desktop for Windows and Norton Commander.

One of the first features we'll explore is the Norton Taskbar. This adds two important new functions to the Windows 95 Taskbar: multiple desktops and a QuickLaunch menu.



You can create a different desktop for each of your tasks. In my case, I write for a total of three e-publications (including the Windows OnLine Review, of course). Keeping track of all of this was becoming a chore and having shortcuts, for the various applications I use, on the Windows desktop was a cluttered mess. Navigator changed that, however, by letting me create a different desktop for each publication. Each one contains the programs, files and folders I use in that specific publication. It even allows the use of different wallpaper schemes and colors in each desktop.

The desktops appear as small windows on the Norton Taskbar. Norton's TaskBar Wizard helps you create new ones in no time. You can also just drag a folder (containing the files, folders and programs you want to appear on the new desktop) down to the Taskbar and a new desktop is created for you! Also, if you were using Norton Desktop for Windows or PCTools Desktops, under Windows 3.1, you can import these directly for use with **Norton Navigator** upon its installation. Switching from one desktop to another is achieved with a simple mouse click or key stroke. This process goes fairly quickly if you are not using wallpaper (1.5 to 2 seconds on a 486DX2-50 with 8 Megabytes of RAM) or if you are using a solid color background (3 to 3.5 seconds). If you are using 256 color or higher wallpapers however, you may lose some wind in your sails. Some 16-bit (and up) backgrounds can take up to 45 seconds to load.

The QuickLaunch menu lets you place programs you use often (or ones you use in common on different desktops) onto the Taskbar as small icons. These icons remain regardless of what desktop you are working in. Adding a program, file, or folder to the menu is as simple as dragging it to any empty spot in the QuickLaunch menu.

We do run into some choppy water here. QuickLaunch's icons are VERY small and their sizes are not changeable. Tooltips can appear over each button informing you of what they are, but I would have preferred the option of changing the icon's sizes. Also, you cannot configure the order in which the icons are presented. They will only appear in the order they were added.


Something which users may find annoying is the way QuickLaunch redraws its menu every time Windows 95 adds or removes an icon from the Taskbar's status area (where the clock, volume icon, etc. appear). So, every time you print something, for example, and the spooler icon pops up, the QuickLaunch Menu is read and redrawn. This happens again when printing is complete. Unless you have at least 16 MEGS of RAM this will significantly slow you down.

A Navigator feature you should enjoy is the QuickMenu. This adds cascaded history lists to the Run command, Documents menu, and Control Panel command of Windows 95's Start Up menu. The Documents menu list is broken down into type (Text files, Help files, application specific files, etc.) to make finding a document a simple task. The Control Panel enhancement includes an applet list for your most often used Control Panel selections.

Two power helpers are Norton's Folder Navigator and Explorer Extensions. The Folder Navigator lets you cruise the contents of folders without opening them. By right mouse clicking on a drive or folder you get a cascading list of its contents. Norton File Manager and Norton Compress Folder commands are also added to your shortcut menu. The Explorer Extensions add powerful File Manager commands to Windows 95's Explorer pop-ups.

Norton's File Manager is packed with utility and ease of use. It adds powerful and appreciated innovations to the waters of Windows 95 making it my favorite part of Navigator. In order to suit your preferences, in every respect, it allows you to change how drive and file information is sorted and displayed...

My favorite feature is File Manager's built-in compression and decompression (PKZip, LHA, ARC, and self-extracting ZIP-compatible). Files can be added to or copied from an archive via simple drag and drop. I also like is its built-in file encryption/decryption. If you have to share your files with anyone (whether it is across a network or multiple users on one system) you know how difficult it can be to keep personal data secure. Now you can password-protect sensitive information from within Norton File Manager or Windows Explorer. And for all you newsgroupies out there (like me) there's point and click UUEncoding and Decoding that make it easy to cast and catch binary files across the Internet. Speaking of the Net, if WinSock 1.1 or higher is on your system, you can connect to FTP sites directly and transfer files to and from these sites with easy drag and drop operation.



Our next port is Navigator's SmartFolders. These are individual folders that automatically create and update shortcuts to specific file groupings (word processing documents, spreadsheets, databases, etc.) using date ranges and extension types of your choosing. Change (or add) a file in one of these folders and the changes (or additions) are automatically updated in the SmartFolder.

Have you started to save a file before realizing you needed it in a new directory (folder)? Well, Norton FileAssist adds some appreciated file management tools to every Browse, Save and Open dialog box of your Windows 3.1 and Windows 95 programs. You can add a Command Menu (move, copy, delete, etc.), a Document history and/or a Folder history menu to each.

Tired of trying to figure out what that truncated Windows 95 filename stands for in your old 3.1 applications? Navigator's LFN (Long File Name) Enabler lets your older applications, that use standard dialog boxes, read and write Windows 95 long file names. There are some programs this doesn't work with (like Microsoft Word and Excel), but for all the others it is worth switching on.

Also, if you are tired of the length of time it takes for Windows 95 to search your system for a file then you will like Navigator's File Indexing. You define a list of file types that Navigator saves and uses whenever you search for a file. This search criteria allows a speedy, more highly focused process that really clips by Win95's Find File feature.

Navigator's File Archive Wizard is our last port of call. This wonder Wizard lets you clean up your hard drives by searching for files, matching specifications you enter, offering you the choice of compressing them, moving them or deleting them. The number of files I've found cluttering my system amazes me. I maintain my system quite well, if I do say so myself, but Norton was able to find old stuff I don't use enough to warrant keeping.

You may have hoped for smooth sailing all the way, but there are areas of rough seas that we need to charted. The foremost is cost. The full version price of **Norton Navigator** is more

than the upgrade price of Windows 95. Usually, a package like this is worth it, but in this case the waters are a little muddy. Especially in the light of the shareware and rival commercial programs that will inevitably be on the market offering similar features, but at MUCH lower cost.

Next, we need to chart performance. Some of Navigator's individual apps reduce your system's speed a bit (especially if you set Norton's Undo to track all Windows 95 activity). Furthermore, turning on all of its enhancements can make a low memory system almost dead in the water. This is an area Symantec will need to work on.

In the final analysis, **Norton Navigator** is an adequate way to keep your system's management on course and steady as she goes. That is, as long as price is not an issue and you find it's compatible with how you work. If these issues DO matter, however (as they will to most), then I recommend waiting for the price to drop or to look for shareware alternatives.

Editor's Note: As we published, mailings are being received by some that offer the product direct at the upgrade price. Perhaps Symantec has recognized the true value, or perhaps lack of value, of this release.

NORTON ANTIVIRUS FOR WINDOWS 95

a review by Mark J. Tieman

A friend lends you a floppy disk. It contains a really hot new shareware game he downloaded from some FTP site. You pop it in, load it on to your hard drive, and excitedly start it up. Suddenly your joy turns to pure terror as you watch your hard drive being reformatted!! What went wrong? Your system has just been infected by a virus. Of course, this is an extreme example. Most viruses quietly wait in the background, infecting other files and disks until the moment comes when it has been preset to strike. This is sometimes days, weeks, or even months from the time of the initial infection.

If you have recently upgraded to Windows 95 you may have noticed, by now, that Microsoft did not include an antivirus program with as they did with their DOS product. Unfortunately, 16 bit version of any antivirus software is not usable in Windows 95 and many of the existing DOS/Windows 3.x viruses can *still* infect our systems. This leaves all of us very vulnerable.

Norton AntiVirus for Windows 95 can solve that problem. This excellent program gives you peace of mind in knowing your system is safe, at least from known viruses. You can use it to scan one or all your disk drives, a particular folder and all of its files, or just a specific file you may be suspicious of.

This program is very flexible in its configuration. For maximum protection you can set it to load each time you start the system. It can then scan memory, the boot record, system files, etc. Once Windows has started you can have it scan files as they are run, opened, and/or created. This is especially assuring if you download a lot of files from the Internet or switch floppies full of shareware around with your friends. If a virus is detected **Norton AntiVirus** will either repair or delete the infected files or prompt you for a decision based on your own preferences.

Norton AntiVirus is able to scan for known viruses that may have already infected your system, but one of its real strong points is it can also monitor activity that may indicate an unknown virus at work. Some applications, however, perform activities that an antivirus program may misinterpret as a virus at work. **Norton AntiVirus** solves this problem by letting you set up an exclusion list containing those programs you know exhibit such behavior. AntiVirus will not scan these files during its checks.

When you perform a scan of a drive, **Norton AntiVirus** inoculates each of the program files on that drive. This is a process where AntiVirus records critical information about each file (location, size, etc.) and boot record it scans and stores this in a special data file. Each time AntiVirus is run, it checks the files and boot records it finds against the inoculation record previously made. If it finds any difference between the two AntiVirus alerts you that there could be an unknown virus at work.

A manual scan can be performed at any time, but **Norton AntiVirus** comes with a Scheduler you can configure in order to run unattended scans on specific dates, times, or at periodic intervals. What if you want to use your system during one of these pre-scheduled scans? That's no problem. **Norton AntiVirus** runs quietly in the background so you can keep working.

What if you download a zipped file and want to check it before you decompress the files within it? **Norton AntiVirus** can do that too. It will automatically scan compressed files (within a ZIP, LHA and LHZ file) before you unzip them onto your system.

It would be a wonderful world if you only needed to purchase this AntiVirus program and it be all you would ever need to protect your system. Unfortunately, new viruses are created daily. How do you keep your computer's immune system up to date? That's easy with Symantec's Virus Updates. These are available from America Online (keyword SYMANTEC), CompuServe (GO SYMVIRUS), or either Symantec's WWW site (www.symantec.com) or BBS (503-484-6669). Each month an updated definition file is available for download containing the new viruses discovered during that month and the methods for curing those ills. If you do not have a modem, Symantec offers the monthly updates on floppy diskette that is available via snail-mail.

Okay, so you keep **Norton AntiVirus** up to date by downloading the monthly addendum and you set it up to scan in the background so it is always on the lookout for suspicious files. Suddenly, you discover an unknown virus is at work! There is no need to panic, however, because Symantec has a potential virus submission plan for just such an occurrence. By following the step-by-step instructions given in the programs manual you can create a floppy diskette infected with the unknown virus. Send this to Symantec along with the submission form in the back of the manual and they will analyze the virus and inform you of the results. The best part of this service is that it is all for free.

If you are running Windows 95, and want your system safe from viral infection then **Norton AntiVirus** is one of your best bets. It is certified by the National Computer Security

Agency (NCSA) for complete and up-to-date virus detection.

ALPHA FIVE a review by Ted Tatman

I love personal computers, but I'm not a programmer. My attention span is much too short. I even hate writing batch files. I like word processors. I like desktop publishing. I *love* sound editing software. But when it comes to database and spreadsheet programs, my eyes glaze over and I get a headache the first time I see the words "value" or "formula." Too much like Mrs. Rhinebloom's math class, I guess.

However, I need a *real* Windows database program to manage a music database for my mobile DJ service. I had been using Softkey's Key Database Plus (also known as Ace File 2.0) for a couple of years, but when I found out that the program has a major bug that causes you to lose data whenever you pack large databases (like mine), I started shopping around for something else.

I considered all the "big boys" like Access, Approach, dBase, FoxPro and Paradox, but they didn't seem to be right for me. Then, **Alpha Five's** ads caught my eye. They bragged of the application's ease of use, with no code-writing required. Could there really be a powerful Windows database program that required no programming? We'll see...

First off, you may be familiar with Alpha Software's Alpha Four. This DOS database program has won many awards for its ease of use over the years, and for a DOS program wasn't too bad (although I liked the DOS version of Q&A better). However, **Alpha Five** is not an upgrade to Alpha Four. According to the company, it was built completely from the ground up to take advantage of the Windows interface to solve real-world business (both home and office) user's database needs.

When you first start up **Alpha Five**, you see its Control Panel. This is the command center of the program where you create databases, field rules and indexes; design reports, data entry forms and queries; import, post and append data and run mail merges, and more. Hmmm

- tabs and push buttons. And toolbars and bubble help. Looks pretty easy so far.

When you go to create a new database, report or query, you can call up one of **Alpha Five's** "Genies." Like "Wizards" in Microsoft products, they walk you through the process pretty painlessly and with a minimum of *database speak*.

If you want to build your own **Alpha Five** application (like a form, letter, report, or label), the program offers drag-and-drop so you can design a layout without programming. You can drag fields off the floating toolbar and set them in place on the layout. You can even create buttons on forms by dragging and dropping saved queries, layouts, or **Alpha Five** menu items. Cool! Here's some of **Alpha Five's** other features:

Seven categories of field rules. Supposedly, these rules help achieve maximum accuracy and efficiency of data entry.

A data dictionary that keeps all **Alpha Five** files together and makes certain that no files are accidentally deleted or lost.

A properties editor that pops up when you right-click on an object. (Windows 95 users should be familiar with this type of function.) You can control properties such as font, graphics, color, size, alignment, and more.

System cards that allow users to complete database operations without having to program.

(Yea!) There are cards for any operation you would need when building an application.

A versatile WYSIWYG report writer with several types of reports available including tabular, banded, multi-column and group reports.

A powerful letter writer that lets you drag-and-drop fields to quickly compose letters, including mail merge and address labels.

Vou can include bitmap images in reports, mail labels, letters and forms. You can also link sound and video files using OLE.

Alpha Five uses the dBase dbf format to store data and dBase IV mdx format for indexes. It also supports the dbt (dBase) and fpt (FoxPro) memo formats. And, as you would expect, it imports and exports a variety of mainstream database formats.

Now, if you *really* want to write code, **Alpha Five** includes a programming language called Xbasic. They tell me it's similar to Basic and Xbase and that it's powerful and flexible. But, I don't expect to see for myself anytime soon!

Alpha Five ships with three sample applications (Alpha Four Classic, which is a replica of the Alpha Four menu structure; Alphadex, a contact manager for business or personal use; and a scientific calculator) and one utility (The Database Documenter, which lets you examine the structure and components of **Alpha Five** Databases). Other applications are available at extra cost from the company.

Like most Windows database programs, Alpha Five needs a lot of memory to run

smoothly. Eight megabytes of RAM is recommended, as well as a 486 processor or higher. It ran very smoothly under Windows 95 on my 486/66 DX with 16 megabytes of RAM.

So, is it as easy and powerful to use as the ads say? Well, it depends. I consider myself an intermediate computer user and I had no problems creating sample databases, reports and queries without programming by using the Genies. And, you can definitely tell that there's a lot of power under the hood. But, for a real computer novice, I think a lot of what **Alpha Five** has would go over his or her head. They would have to be mildly familiar with basic database concepts before they would be comfortable with the program. Hopefully in the next version, the company will make the program a tad more "warm and fuzzy." However, if you're an intermediate or power user, you'll find a lot to like about it, especially its ability to create powerful database applications without writing any code. With its fairly low price, it deserves a serious look if you need a serious (but not difficult) Windows database program. A special home and business edition that doesn't include the Xbasic language is available for \$49.00.

INFO PRODUCTS IMAGEREADER

a review by Bob Gollihu

I learned a valuable lesson when I bought a color hand scanner a couple years back. While it's handy, limitations abound, with color variations, stitching trouble when the image is larger than the scanner path, and OCR — what a chore, especially for larger and multiple page documents —*if* you're lucky enough to have even partial success.

Just a few weeks ago I wrote about **Info Products Page Scanner** in <u>WOLR 102</u>. I really liked the ease of use and small footprint. Now, if I could only have it in color... Info Products to the rescue!

The **ImageReader** full page, color sheetfed scanner resembles one of those small thermal console printers of old (I date myself), a mere 13W x 9D x 5H inches, not including the feeder plate. Sliders above the feed slot guide the input of material; the unit can handle sizes from 2x3 to 8.5x14 inches. Power and "ready" LED indicators are alongside an eject button on this uncluttered unit, and a mechanical button releases the feed mechanism to allow cleaning of the scanner glass and jam removal. The small size and light weight of the device have enabled me to place it on a wall shelf above my computing table.

Setting up the **ImageReader** could not be easier. As with the **Personal Office page scanner** reviewed in <u>WOLR 102</u>, a well-designed installation program is included on a single disk. I have to repeat my praise of **Info Products** for this simple and convenient installation routine that will accommodate the most novice of users. The instructions provided have you run it prior to installing the 16bit ISA interface card included with the package. The program detects an open I/O address and tells you precisely how to change the jumpers on the card, if necessary. Afterwards, it adds device drivers necessary for the scanner's operation. Then it's time to open your PC and insert the interface card. I performed the installation on a machine running Windows 95 with no problems, although it should be noted that these are 16 bit drivers.

A six foot, 25 pin cable connects the **ImageReader** to the interface card. That's it. No additional wiring is necessary — the unit gets its power from your PC. Lest you worry about its demands, the UL sticker indicates that it draws up to a modest 0.2 amps at five volts and 0.9 amps at twelve volts when in operation; specifications provided stated power requirements at less than 3 watts. Standby draw is not indicated, but it must be negligible. Your final step is placing the plastic feeder plate on the two retaining clips to enable the automatic feeding of documents.

The standard interface allows you to use the **ImageReader** with any Twain-compatible application. You can easily size the capture you want by simply dragging with your mouse; this was ideal when I was only interested in a single image on an 8.5x11 page I was scanning. Drop down boxes let you choose from line art, halftone, 16 or 256 greyscales, and true color, as well as no filters, autofilter, and 2- or 4-pixel averaging. Slidebars adjust intensity, contrast, and resolution from 12 to 1200 dpi (true 600dpi). Pre-scan and inverse modes are available, and the software projects an image size and shows your free disk space to see if you're in over your head.

The **ImageReader** scanner is sold with different software bundles, with combinations of Photoshop LE, Recognita Plus, ImagePals GO!, E-Quip, and even a 14.4 fax-modem, at different price points and variations in model numbers. A similar unit is available without the automatic document feed for even less.

My evaluation unit was bundled with **Photoshop LE**, the "Limited Edition" version of the software. It is more than adequate to handle a wide variety of graphics functions, and offers an upgrade to the full version. The software that I have received with the various Info Products bundles has all included generous documentation, and while stripped down a bit, they are certainly up to the task at hand.

I made a specific request to look at **E-Quip**, which is bundled with other combinations, due to my specific interest in using the **ImageReader** in a small home office situation. It brings some handy applets that fit well with the scanner, referring to itself as Office-in-a-BoxTM software, although this version does not include all of the modules documented in the E-Quip

manual provided.

I really liked the handy Copier application. It offers letter, legal, or A4 sizes, intensity, reduction ratios for line art scans, and optimization for photographs in full size scans. It worked quickly, offered to scan multiple pages, and in combination with my HP LJ4P, produced output that put my regular photocopier to shame. I experienced some problems with the plain paper fax program, which looked equally easy but didn't get along well with my modem. I'm told that this is a Windows 95 compatibility issue. As we published this issue, updated disks were being sent to this reviewer.

E-Quip also offers Document Image File Cabinet and OCR programs. Neither are comparable to the high-end specialty programs available, but both performed well and are quite adequate for many uses, depending on your personal requirements.

I did test the **ImageReader** with a very sophisticated OCR program and another 'virtual file cabinet' type program. In both cases it performed admirably. I especially like the convenience factor of the document feed and small size of the unit.

Okay, let's answer the obvious question: yes, there *are* compromises to be made with a scanner that is sheet-feed as opposed to a flatbed, but that cuts both ways. No, you can't scan a book, or anything else whose third dimension is thicker than card stock. However, the unit has a footprint not much more than half the average 8.5x14 inch flatbed, and is more convenient for most scanning tasks. The automatic document feed (ADF) function can handle up to thirty sheets — have you priced an ADF for a flatbed scanner??? Finally, compare prices, and you're sure to

be sold, especially when you see the street prices on these units. Of course, you will have to weigh in your personal requirements, but for all around use, focusing on most practical and business applications, this sheet-fed scanner can't be beat for convenience, compactness, and price. Info Products offers another model, without ADF, at a lower price, if you don't need that feature.

The **ImageReader** has been ideal for most all of my scanning needs. I've done color photographs and ad copy, scanned newspaper articles and faxes and processed them through OCR, captured line art for a newsletter, and more, all with ease. Both installation and use are a no-brainer, a great relief for one who just wants to be productive.


HP PRINTERPAL a review by Bob Gollihur

I love fax machines. What I can't stand is that lousy paper — that slick, pen-resistant, eternallycurling, wrinkly, won't-stay-flat, wadded-up-in-the-file-folder, rolling-up-on-the-copier-glass, fading-as-it-ages stuff. Sense a bit of hostility there? Darn, I have a laser printer — *if only*...

I love fax machines. What I can't deal with is the fact that I don't have much space in my small home office. Their footprint is so big and the location requires topside access. I already have a scanner. *If only...*

I love fax machines. What I can't seem to remember is to leave my PC with its fax modem and software on at all times, with the receiving software in the background, sucking the life out of my system performance. *If only...*

If only they would make a fax machine that would fit in the palm of my hand and make use of the stuff in which I have already invested. Enter the **HP PrinterPal.** Okay, call me nuts, but that little $3.75 \times 5 \times 1$ inch device pictured below receives and sends faxes. I tried it — it really does.



Yes, the **HP PrinterPal** will do it all, except scan a document for transmission. Receiving plain paper faxes is simple — you plug the unit into the back of your HP <u>LaserJet</u> (a <u>DeskJet</u> model is also available) printer and plug your printer cable into it. A short extension cable is provided if required. The only additions required are the nine volt power adapter and your incoming telephone line. A second jack to continue the connection to an answering machine or telephone is also included. A plastic sleeve on one side of the unit slips on to neatly hide the connections.

You can use the touch-tone pad on your telephone to program reception parameters for the **HP PrinterPal**, and even enter the DTMF coding information (local ID). Software provided

will also perform the task. My first use of the unit was as a plain paper receiving fax unit, connected to my HP LaserJet 4P. I don't expect to receive lengthy faxes outside of my abnormal business hours, so I left my printer off, although it consumes a mere 15 watts in standby mode.

The **HP PrinterPal** literature claims that it can store up to 20 pages of standard text if your printer is off, jammed, paperless, or otherwise out of service, so I wasn't worried about nighttime faxes. It quickly qualifies the statement by saying that that projection is based on a standard resolution ITU-T test chart. While more complex faxes will undoubtedly eat up that space more quickly, the unit is provided with a generous 512K of internal RAM.

For sending faxes, a second cable is plugged into the unit and routed to an open serial port on your computer. Yes, this tiny device is also a 14,400bps class 1 fax modem that can send faxes direct from your PC. A software program for use with the **HP PrinterPal**, **Fax Works 3.0**, is included to accomplish the task.

Fax Works installed easily and worked well. While not as heavily-featured as some of the standalone competitive products, it is functional, quick, and thankfully less hungry for disk space. A wide variety of options are available, and I found it very easy to use for most tasks. You can also bypass your printer and receive a fax direct to your PC using the software.

There are cover page options, including customization and notes, and it includes an address book. The program is well documented in a 60 page booklet and with a strong help file and cue card help.

Fax Works was a bit quirky in Windows 95, although it did eventually work, for the most part. It did work well using Windows 3.1. A representative of Hewlett-Packard advised me that an updated version for Windows 95 will be made available, free, from their on-line forums, web, and ftp sites, before the end of the year.

Since I am running Windows 95, I decided to see if the **HP Printer Pal** could act as a compatible fax device. The unit was readily recognized as a "standard modem" and I used it to send a fax from Microsoft Exchange. Although HP doesn't mention it anywhere in their documentation, it worked fine for me. I suspect that other, more sophisticated fax software may also be used with this Class 1 unit, although no compatibility tests were performed.

Finally, your telephone answering machine and the **HP PrinterPal** can coexist on the same line. Simply connect your machine to the output jack on the unit; sensing a fax tone being received, it cuts off the signal to your answering machine and takes over to receive the fax.

You can get the **HP PrinterPal** in two models, for both Hewlett-Packard LaserJet and DeskJet printers. The model tested works with most <u>HP LaserJet and some models of the</u> <u>DeskJet</u>. Another unit is available specifically for <u>certain Hewlett-Packard DeskJet models</u> and lists for \$199.00 (Product Number C2970A). Click on each for a complete printer model compatibility listing, and check your local retailer or a catalog for street prices.

The **HP PrinterPal** is an amazing little device. Initially, I really didn't expect it to replace my fax machine. However, my successful experience with it and the joy of receiving plain paper faxes has caused it to become a permanent addition to my small home office.

LOGITECH TRACKMAN MARBLE

a review by Ted Tatma


There's two main kinds of Windows users: those that use a mouse to point-and-click, and those that prefer a trackball. Count me in the latter category. I've owned trackballs for years, and find it a pain to have to use a conventional mouse when working on a friend or co-workers computer. (Are they nuts? Why would anybody use a dumb old mouse when a trackball is *so* much cooler? Mouse pads? We don't need no stinkin' mouse pads!)

But trackballs have one disadvantage over regular mice. The roller ball tends to get dirtier a lot faster, leading to sporadic cursor tracking on-screen. Try munching down on a bag of greasy (but oh-so-tasty) potato chips while working on your computer. Your trackball will "gunk up" faster than Bill Gates will make his next million dollars. It seems like I was cleaning my trackball at least once a week (yes, like any true computer nerd, I eat a lot of greasy finger food).



Well, Logitech has come out with a new trackball they call the **TrackMan Marble** that should clear up this problem once and for all. You see, it uses new sensing technology that replaces the mechanical parts of a trackball that records motion with a patented optical tracking system. A laser-like beam illuminates the black dots on the ruby red trackball, while a sensor tracks the motion. According to Logitech, this gives you greater precision, reduces wear and ensures smooth tracking even if the ball gets dirty (or greasy) or scratched.

This sounded just what I needed, so I gave the **TrackMan Marble** a real world test. Would it pass the "Lay's Test?" Sure enough, after several weeks of use (and many bags of potato chips), this pointing device tracked as sure and as smoothly as it did when I first hooked it up. Plus, the sleek, comfortable shape felt good on my hand. And I was especially impressed with the trackball's switches. They're light switches, more pressure sensitive than the ones used in my older TrackMans (Trackmen??). Logitech is using them in their *MouseMan Deluxe* and *Cordless 3* models.



The **TrackMan Marble** comes with Logitech MouseWare software, which allows you to adjust cursor size, speed and acceleration, plus assign Windows commands (like double clicking or drag lock) to the middle and right buttons. And, **TrackMan Marble** supports the new Plug and Play standard.

By the way, Logitech plans to use the Marble sensing technology in future pointing devices they produce, but only the "high end" ones for the time being.

The **TrackMan Marble** comes with a 3-year guarantee, as well as a 60-day money back guarantee. But once you get this trackball in your hands, you won't want to use anything else to point-and-click with. Not even a regular mouse.



CLICKART INCREDIBLE IMAGE PAK 25,000

Forget 2,000 clipart collections. Forget 5,000, 10,000 or even 15,000 image collections. T/Maker, one of the best known suppliers of graphics for the personal computer, has just released the ClickArt Incredible Image Pak 25,000. On multiple CD-ROM disks, you'll find 25,000 of the highest quality, most usable images you've ever seen produced for the electronic media. All come in the vector based WMF format, which means nearly every Windows application that supports graphics supports them, and the images can be resized without the fear of "jaggies" you sometimes get when you resize raster images (like BMP files).

Over 125 categories of clip art are provided. Sample categories are Animals, Borders, Business/Office, Cartoons, Education, Food, Holidays, People, Seasons, Sports, and Travel. As you would expect with 25,000 images, there's a lot of variety — but believe it or not, not that much "filler." I was especially pleased to find plenty of religious clipart to use in documents I produce for my church.



The ClickArt Incredible Image Pak 25,000 uses the Kudo Image Browser to help manage the images. With the Kudo Image Browser, you can drag and drop images into graphics applications that support DDE or OLE 2.0. Or, you can copy and paste images into virtually any Windows program that supports graphics.

Also included in this collection are over 1,000 TrueType fonts. Actually, there's only 74 distinct typeface families, as most fonts are furnished in multiple styles (like condensed, narrow, wide, light, etc.).

The ClickArt Incredible Image Pak 25,000 comes with a User's Guide (over 570 pages) that has a complete Visual Index of all images and fonts. The images are all printed in black and

white, which gives you a good idea of how the pictures will look in print form if you don't have a color printer. Also in the User's Guide is the ClickArt Design Handbook, which offers tips, tricks and techniques on how to improve the look of your documents.

As a bonus, you'll find free samples from some of ClickArt's other products ("Art Parts," "Handwritten Fonts," and "Cartoon Images"). All are usable, too.

If you can only get one collection of electronic clipart, then the ClickArt Incredible Image Pak 25,000 should be it. It's an outstanding value. You might never need anything else!

WINDOWS 95: VISUAL QUICKSTART GUIDE

My first impulse was to state that this book is for the intuitively-impaired, all the while laughing up my sleeve — but I would have been very wrong. I suspect that nearly everyone reading this review, if forced to sit down and page through **Windows 95: Visual QuickStart Guide**, would utter at least a few *a-ha's* under their breath. Unashamed, I'll admit that I did.

While some will argue that Windows 95 is intuitive, I will be happy to debate them, anywhere, anytime. I did not find it entirely so, and much of the Windows 95 on-line help is an abyss into which a novice will fall, never to return. Methods and answers are not always apparent.



The **Windows 95: Visual QuickStart Guide** is a 180 page, well-indexed and profusely illustrated book with short answers to a long list of questions. Frankly, if I was still in MIS, I'd give one to every new Windows 95 user. It is truly an effective visual tool with a minimum of chat and clutter, with a maximum of guidance. Broken into three sections, it is essentially a tutorial welcome to and basic reference for the new operating system.

Introducing Windows 95 starts with *The Basics*, with several pages explaining what's new with Windows 95 and then following up with the desktop. Terminology is covered, as is general operations. *Using the Accessories* hits each of those applets, and the *Exploring Your Computer* provides an in-depth look at the Explorer's functions.

Managing Your Computer starts off with *Disks, Folders, and Files,* and moves through *Changing Windows Settings, Maintaining Your Computer, Adding Hardware and Software, Printing Files,* and *Portable Computing.* Each section continues the visual theme, with liberal screen shots and valuable tips.

Communicating with Windows 95 covers *Connecting to a Network, Exchanging E-Mail and Faxes,* and *Using the Microsoft Network.* I could have done without the MSN information, but I guess it's part of the package.

Each page includes specific step by step instructions with a screen shot to illustrate the procedure. What you get is practice, not theory — and fewer questions for the support line. Windows 95: Visual QuickStart Guide may not be for you or me, but I suspect you know many that it would benefit. This is a book that I would recommend as an excellent tutorial for

new users and those in transition from Windows 3.1 to 95, and as a reference for non-technical users. If you know someone buying a home computer for the holidays, make this a stocking-stuffer.

BROWSING THE RACKS

a review by Ed Rasimu

Rutherford D Rogers, a Yale librarian, once said, "We're drowning in information and starving for knowledge." If you've walked down the aisles and aisles of computer-oriented publications in any good-sized bookstore, you can't help but agree. Here's my take on but three drops in the flood of information, and whether they can add to your knowledge.

Upgrading & Repairing PCs - 5th Edition

The twin certainties of death and taxes are, for PC owners, joined by the inevitability of upgrade and repair. It's not a question of "if" you will need the help Scott Mueller provides, but "when." *Upgrading and Repairing PCs* is a textbook, a reference, a do-it-yourself guide, and a history of the development of the personal computer rolled into a single package. The pace of technology in personal computing is breath-taking and for the beginning or intermediate computer user it is next to impossible to catch up to a state-of-the-art which is continually receding. Scott Mueller's book will give you a chance to know the "what" and the "why" of your computer while helping you make better choices in original purchase, add-ons or upgrades.

If you are technically inclined, *Upgrading and Repairing PCs* will take you step by step through every component of your computer, giving you the information necessary to understand, analyze, trouble-shoot, replace and repair your computer. If you wouldn't lift the hood of your car, let alone pull the case on your computer, U & R PCs will give the information you need to make informed and intelligent purchase decisions while avoiding getting fleeced by the unscrupulous repairperson. And, if you just want to know more about computers; how they evolved and where they are going, U & R PCs will take you through the history from the first XTs to the pending P6s with goodies about all the blind paths and side tracks along the way.

Upgrading & Repairing PCs, 5th Edition, is not the book to curl up with before the fireplace on a cold winter's night. It is the single source for all you ever wanted to know about your computer. Have you lost the CMOS settings for your hard drive? This book's got the numbers for virtually all manufacturers and models. Need to know the pin connections for a cable? It's here. Puzzled by an error code message? Look it up in the appendix. The book even comes with a CD-ROM database of specifications for over 1400 input/output cards, including drive interface cards for HDs, floppies, CD-ROM drives, video adapters, modems, sound cards and more.

If I had to have just one computer book on the shelf to give me answers to all my computer questions, *Upgrading & Repairing PCs, 5th Edition* would be the one.

The Underground Guide to MS Office, OLE and VBA

"Sometimes I feel like a nut. Sometimes I don't!" When I pick up a book for an entertaining read, I occasionally feel like a nut. If I'm looking for computer help, I usually don't. Lee Hudspeth and Timothy-James Lee (who hyphenates their first name?) under the guidance of Windows guru, Woody Leonhard have put together *The Underground Guide to Microsoft Office, OLE and VBA*.

There is little doubt that these two authors know what they are talking about. If you are a user of MS Office or if you use any software which supports the second iteration of OLE, there is some great information here on what currently works and what is only potential capability for integrated software. Unfortunately, the sophomoric, nudge-nudge, wink-wink, writing style overpowers the credibility of the information. Throw in a kitschy quote from some irrelevant source every two paragraphs to break up the reader's train of thought, and you wind up with a book that verges on the psychedelic. It doesn't so much expand your consciousness as distort reality.

The first half of the book contains some definite pearls of wisdom for anyone trying to take advantage of OLE. I confess that I now have a much clearer understanding of the difference between linking and embedding than ever before. Despite the understanding, however, I feel a frustration that I can't take advantage of the knowledge since the authors have gone to great pains to describe all of the inconsistencies in MS's implementation of OLE in their flagship Office Pro suite. If you want to know all of the bugs and blemishes, here's your source book.

The second half of *The Underground Guide to MS Office, OLE and VBA* focuses on a discussion of Visual Basic programming. If you are already an accomplished programmer, you will understand what is going on here--but then you probably don't need it. If you aren't a programmer and have waded through the first four chapters of complaint about OLE in hopes of gaining some insight into macro development for your applications when you got to Chapter 5, you're doomed. With no change in the frivolous tone or extraneous quotes, the authors jump into function discussions that will make the average home user blanch.

Sorry folks, this book is one to avoid.

With every new version, Quicken becomes a more powerful, and hence more complex, financial management tool. If you don't think you're getting all that's possible out of Quicken, then take a look at *Quicken 4 for Windows Answers: Certified Tech Support* by Mary and David Campbell.

This book provides detailed and accurate technical support for commonly asked questions about Quicken. The layout is pure Q & A format, however the information is grouped and indexed in such a manner that the reader can quickly go to an area of concern and find relevant information. Questions are clear and to the point. Answers are direct and well illustrated with screen captures from the program and step-by-step instructions on how to get the job done.

Quicken 4 for Windows Answers could be a model for software developers in support documentation. The table of contents takes you to the right general area to get an answer quickly. The index is complete and sufficiently detailed to focus on specifics. And, most obvious of all, the layout and typography makes for ease of understanding and great usability. This book is a must have for anyone who seeks to take care of investments, maximize their tax savings and keep track of even moderately complex finances with Quicken.




