Overview

WAV Player for Windows 95/NT is a small utility applet that will allow you to play individual WAV sound files. WAV Player is distributed as part of the Audition for Windows 95/NT application.

Using WAV Player

WAV Player for Windows 95/NT plays individual WAV files using the following command line syntax:

```
PLAYWAV "d:\folder\sound file.wav"
```

Use the full drive and folder path when specifying a WAV file. Sound file names that include spaces in either the folder or file name should be enclosed in double quotes.

Uses for WAV Player

WAV Player for Windows 95/NT was designed to be invoked from Batch Command Scripts and from other applications that provide a means of running an external program with command line arguments. The specified sound file will be played synchronously, that is the program will not exit until the specified sound file has completed play.

Associating WAV files with WAV Player

You can associate WAV files with the WAV Player application if you would like to have a WAV file played whenever you double-click your mouse on a sound file. Use the MS Explorer View | Options menu command to assign WAV Player as your default WAV file player when selecting WAV file icons.
