

Don't forget to install PixFolio and Paint Shop Pro.

These programs have their own installations and are well worth installing. On the CD-ROM you'll find a directory called PIXFOLIO and one called PSPRO, run the SETUP program in each of these directories.

<u>Differences between Lovely Ladies II and Mother Earth II</u>

There is a new and improved version of Paint Shop on Lovely Ladies II called Paint Shop Pro. If you have installed the software from Mother Earth II you will want to delete the older Paint Shop and use Paint Shop Pro instead.

<u>Using 24-bit images.</u>

There are 24-bit (true color) images on the Lovely Ladies II disc in the \24BIT directory. Viewing 24-bit images while running Windows in a 256 color mode can be painfully slow. Unless you run Windows in a *true color* or *hi-color* mode the quality of these images will not be seen.

Hints on PixFolio

One of PixFolio's greatest advantages is it's "Thumbnail View". This allows you to see many images on the screen at once. This mode can be slow when Windows is running in 256 color mode but is still worth the trouble.

To quickly get started pull down the Catalog menu and choose Build Catalog... In this dialog box select the CD-ROM drive letter and pick one of the directories (*HINT*: You need to click an additional time on the directory name for it to show the right files). Put an X in the Select All and Auto Update boxes. Then click on the Build button. Sit back and wait... this will take awhile.

When this procedure is finally done close the dialog box and pull down the View menu. Choose Thumbnail view to see all of the pictures. Be patient.

NOTE: If you build a catalog of all the 1024x768 images it will take approx. 7.3 MB of disk space. The same is true if you build a catalog of all the 640x480 images.
