Chapter 2 - QuickDir Quickstart.

2.1 - Installing QuickDir.

- Go thru the process of unarchiving the QuickDir install archive.
- QuickDir performs best if it is in the DOS PATH.
 Most users have a utility directory. Copy QuickDir to the utility or DOS directory.
- If you do not have LIST.COM, copy QDLIST.EXE to a DOS path directory.
- Now, start QuickDir by entering QD on the DOS prompt.
 - An introduction screen is displayed.
 - After you press any key, QuickDir scans all your hard drive and Lan directories.
- A directory tree will be displayed and you're ready to USE QuickDir!
- You can scroll up and down the tree, or press enter to see the files in a directory.
 - If QuickDir does not detect a drive, use F3 (configure) and add the drive to INCLUDE and ADD TO TREE fields.

- 2.2 - Using QuickDir.

- Using QuickDir is easy because every QuickDir command is displayed on the screen, always in view.
- In addition, using QuickDir is SAFE, because every command requires one extra keystroke to process.
- For instance. Let's say you want to delete a directory.
 You may press 'D' at any time on the directory display.
 Most of the time you will get a message like 'Cant Delete Directory Contains Files or Subdirectories'.
 But, should you run across an empty directory, you are required to press 'Y' in order to delete it.
- If you're an experienced DOS user, refer to QuickDir Command Summary. If not, all QuickDir commands are documented in detail in this User's Manual.

Chapter 3 - QuickDir Basics.

- 3.1 - Display Keystrokes

- QuickDir uses 3 different types of 'Panels':
 - An Entry Panel: The user enters information.
 - A Selection Panel: Select from different options.
 - A Scrolling Table Panel: Access large amounts of information.
- The mouse simulates an Up/Down Cursor arrow keypress
- The left mouse button is the same as pressing enter.

- 3.1.1 - Entry Panels.

- An Entry Panel allows the user to enter or change information. Here is an example:

- When an entry panel is first displayed, the cursor is positioned on the first reply area.
- A 'Reply Area' is the place you enter information.
- To advance to the next reply area (List Pgm Name), use the Tab, Cursor Down, or Enter key.
- If you need to go back to prior reply area, use the Shift-Tab or the Cursor Up key.
- To edit (correct) a reply area, use either the Left Cursor, Right Cursor, or Backspace key.
- Use the Home or End key to go to the start or end of a reply area.
- Insert and Delete changes your data accordingly.

- 3.1.2 - Selection Panels.

- A selection panel lets you choose from a predetermined number of options. Here is an example:

- The cursor is initially positioned on the first selection.
- Use the Up and Down cursor keys to move.
- Or use the mouse to scroll up and down.
- Or press the First Letter of the selection. For instance, type 'E' and the cursor moves to the 'EXTENSION' selection.
- Press enter to process the selection made.

- 3.1.3 Scrolling Table Panels.
 - A scrolling table panel is similar to the selection panel, except it contains much more information. An example of a scrolling panel follows:

- Note the cursor position (+) sign.
- You may scroll up or down using the cursor keys or mouse.
- Page up and page down is a faster way of positioning.
- The home and end keys move the cursor to the top or bottom of the display information.
- Typing the first letter does NOT position the table.
 Most keystrokes are reserved as command keys.
- 3.2 Primary Display Panels.
 - There are 4 main primary display panels in QuickDir.
 These are described in this section.
- 3.2.1 Directory Display Panel.
 - The directory display panel looks like this:

- The cursor is at the C:\A\UL directory.
- This panel shows all hard drive directories and the size of each.
- Press enter or the left mouse button at the current position to display the file list for directory C:\A\UL.
- Directory commands, such as delete and copy, affect only the directory at the cursor.
- Use the Mouse or Up, Down, Page Up, Page Down, Home, or End keys to move the cursor to a different directory.
- If you move to 'Chg to Removable Disk' and press Enter, QuickDir displays the directory for a new drive.
- For a complete discussion of directory commands, refer to chapter 5 (Page 27).

- 3.2.2 File Display Panel.
 - The file display panel looks like this:

- The top line contains the number of files and directory size.
- The third line contains the number and total size of tagged files.
- The next columns are:
 - Tagged These files are grouped together for multiple processing.
 - Filename The filename and extension are separated so they can be easily identified.
 - Date File date is given in yr/mth/day format.
 - Time File time is given in military time.
 - Flags The DOS attribute flags.
 - Size The number of bytes in the file.
- Scroll thru the file display, or use 'F' or 'N' keys to locate a particular file.
- For a complete discussion of File Display Commands, refer to Chapter 7 (page 33).

- 3.2.3 Utility Display Panel.
 - The Utility Display panel shows the results of a utility. Here is an example:

- Note the panel contains less information than the file display panel. That's because the drive and directory require extra display space.
- The 2nd line contains the current utility.
- The top line contains the number and total size of files captured in this utility.
- The next columns are:
 - Filename The filename and extension are separated so they can be easily identified.
 - Size The number of bytes in the file.
 - Date/Time The date and time file created.
 - Drive/Directory Location of the file.
- Scroll thru the file display, or use 'F' or 'N' keys to locate a particular file.
- For a complete discussion of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 (page 43).

- 3.2.4 - Archive Display Panel.

- An Archive Display panel shows the contents of an archive file. To display it, use the view or extract command on a file with an .ARC, .ARJ, .LZH, .PAK, .SDN, .ZIP or A00-A99 extensions.
- Here is an example:

- An Archive Display is the same for any archive format. For example, an ARJ format display is exactly like the above ZIP format display, except for the method.
- The top line contains the number of files, the total original (uncompressed) size, the total compressed size, and the total percentage of compression.
- The second line contains the pathname of the archive.
- The next columns are as follows:
 - Filename The filename and extension are separated so they can be easily identified.
 - Date The original date of the archived file.
 - Time The original time of the archived file.
 - Orig Size The uncompressed size.
 - % Percent compression.
 - Compr Sz The compressed size.
 - Method The compression method.
 - + (+) means the archive contains paths.
- Scroll thru the archive display panel, or use the 'F' and 'N' keys to locate a particular file.
- For a complete discussion of Archive Display Commands, refer to Chapter 9 (page 45).
- 3.3 Secondary Display Panels.
 - Other panels that are used throughout QuickDir.

- 3.3.1 - Drive Select Panel.

 QuickDir's drive select panel is displayed whenever a drive needs to be selected. Here is an example:

- Note the command is rescan disk. Many other commands use the drive selection panel.
- There are 3 methods for selecting a drive:
 - The easiest way is to type the first letter of the drive and press enter.
 - Use the cursor keys to scroll to the drive and press enter.
 - If your PC has only one drive, just press enter to choose all fixed disks.
- If a drive is missing from the drive select panel, follow these steps:
 - Use F3 (configure) from the Directory or File Display.
 - Add the Drive Letter to INCLUDE drives.
 - The directory tree will be rebuilt and the drive should appear on the drive select panel.

- 3.3.2 - Select Directory Panel.

 QuickDir's point to directory panel is designed to save typing. Here is an example:

- The Select Directory Panel is always accompanied by a command panel. For instance, when copying a file, a copy command panel is displayed below the select directory panel.
- Pressing enter to transfer the directory name to the command panel.
- Use the Tab key to bypass the select directory panel. Use it again to return to the select directory panel.
- Use the 'L' key to display another drive. Refer to section 3.3.1 on page 18.
- Use the 'F' and 'N' keys to locate a directory in the tree.
- Use the mouse or Up/Down keys to move thru the tree.
- Hints
 - If a command panel already contains the correct path, use the Tab key to skip select directory.
 - If the destination path is a new directory, point to the parent of that directory and press enter.
 Use the End key and type the remaining characters.
 - If the destination path is the root of a drive, use Tab to skip the select directory panel. Type in the drive (A:).

- 3.3.3 - File Overlay Prompt.

- QuickDir will ask before overlaying existing files. Here is an example:

- Input and Output information is displayed.
- Type 'Y' and press enter to overlay the file.

- Or just press enter to cancel file overlay.

- 3.3.4 New Directory Prompt.
 - If a new directory is entered as an output path, this prompt is displayed:

- Answer 'Y' to create the directory.
- Or answer 'N'. Press enter to abort the current option.

Chapter 4 - QuickDir Commands.

- 4.1 DOS Command Line Options.
 - A command line option is entered at the DOS prompt. Here is an example:

C:\QD> QD C:\DOS /R /?

- 4.1.1 /R(escan) All Drives.
 - The /R option forces QuickDir to rescan all non-removable drives. Here is an example:

QD/R (At DOS PROMPT).

- /R is the same as the F3 global rescan command, except /R rebuilds the QuickDir directory index and drive tables.
- You MUST use /R for any of the following:
 - A non-removable drive has been added to the system.
 - The system crashed and corrupted the QuickDir directory index (garbage in directory tree).
 - QuickDir does not work (locks-up). This always means the directory index is corrupted.
- Under normal conditions, F2 should be used to rescan a drive. Refer to section 3.2.2 on page 15.
- Do not use /R on a routine basis. QuickDir was designed to run fast and efficient. /R wastes time and computer resources.

- 4.1.2 QD /A /RCD Auto Rescan at Bootup.
 - Use the /A along with /R(Drives) to keep QuickDir's tree display up to date.
 - Add this line to your AUTOEXEC.BAT AFTER the PATH= statement:

QD /A /RCD - To rescan drive C+D.

- Where: /A Perform a scan then quit. /RCD Identified rescan drives.
- BE CAREFUL:
- You MUST supply the drive letters for automatic rescan.
- The drives you supply will appear on the directory tree display regardless of configured drives.
- The drive letter is ignored if /A is not specified.
- 4.1.3 QD Drive:\Directory.
 - The initial drive and directory display can be controlled from the command line. Here is an example:

QD D:\DOS\MYCMDS - Point to dir DOS\MYCMDS on drive D:
Ignore same dir name on drive C:

or QD B: - Scan drive B: and display tree.

- Enter a drive without a directory (D:) and this occurs:
 - The root of the drive is selected.
 - The tree is built if the drive is removable.
- Enter a directory without a drive (MYPGMS) and this occurs:
 - For fixed drives, a matching directory is located in the tree.
 - For removable drives, a tree is built and the matching directory located.
- Enter both a drive and a directory, (EG. C:\DOS) and this occurs:
 - If the drive is fixed, a matching directory is located on the drive given.
 - If the drive is removable, a tree is built and the matching directory located.

- 4.1.3 QD Drive:\Directory. Continued.
 - The error 'DRIVE/DIRECTORY NOT FOUND: \DIRNAME.' is displayed if QuickDir cannot locate it.
 - If QuickDir points to the wrong matching directory, use the 'N'ext key to find another.
 - Hint: Use QD DIRNAME to easily and quickly change DOS directories. Just enter QD DIRNAME, and press 'Q' to quit.
- 4.1.4 QD /?
 - Use /? to display the QuickDir Help Screen.
 - QuickDir returns to DOS.
- 4.2 Quickdir General Commands.
 - Common to more than one display panel.
- 4.2.1 F1 Quickdir Help Key.
 - Use F1 to display the online help panel.
 - When finished with help, press escape to return to QuickDir.
- 4.2.2 F2 Rescan Selected Drives.
 - Use F2 to recognize changes to a tree.
 - Here is an example:

- Refer to Section 3.3.1 Pg 18 Drive Select replies.
- QuickDir displays the progress of the rescan.
- If a drive is not listed on the rescan panel, refer to section 3.3.1. on page 18.
- Note: If QuickDir cannot find the current DOS directory, it automatically does a rescan.

- 4.2.3 - F3 - Configure QuickDir.

- Use F3 to configure QuickDir. - Configure External Programs.
 - QuickDir looks for these programs in your DOS path.
 - A blank entry means the program was not found.
 - A 'NOT IN DOS PATH' error is displayed if QuickDir cannot locate a program in the DOS path. Space out the program name to recover from this error.
 - Do not change the archive programs given in the example above. QuickDir may not operate correctly.
 - The exceptions to this rule are:
 - Any Editor or Viewer may be used if it uses command line pathnames. EG. EDIT C:\DIR\FILE.EXT
 - The ARC format is supported by both PAK.EXE and ARCE.COM. To simplify matters, Quickdir uses PAK. You may substitute ARCE.COM for PAK.EXE.
 - I've heard that ARJ will soon support SDN files.
 I haven't tested QuickDir using ARJ SDN files.
 - When entering a new program, make sure it ends in .EXE, .COM, or .BAT.
 - To use command line switches, create a .BAT file.
 Don't forget to use %1 for the filename.

- QD Work Path.

 Only experienced DOS users should change the QD Work Path. The work path is used to store QUICKDIR.DIR (index file) and to create temporary files and dirs, primarily when viewing archives. The QD work path must have .5 meg free space.

- 4.2.3 F3 Configure QuickDir. Continued
- Ignore/Include/Add To Tree.
 - IGNORE: Add the drive letter, (eg. A), and QuickDir will treat this drive as if it does not exist. You will not be able to change to it.
 - INCLUDE: Add the drive letter as follows:
 - If QuickDir doesn't automatically recognize the drive, you should 'include' it. It will be treated as a removable drive. Add the drive letter to 'Add to Tree' to include the drive in the directory tree.
 NOTE: Both 'Include' and 'Add to Tree' must contain the drive letter to actually add it to tree.
 - If you want a hard drive to be treated as removable. QuickDir will recreate the tree without the drive.
 - ADD TO TREE: !Drive must be also in 'INCLUDE':
 - For drives not recognized by QuickDir, Add the drive letter to both 'Include' and 'Add to Tree' to have the drives added to the tree display.
 - If you want a removable drive to be displayed on the directory tree display, add the drive letter to both 'Include' and 'Add to Tree'.
 - XMS/Disk Swapping Change to 'Y' to enable swapping. QuickDir will shrink to just 2k when executing another program. You can now edit larger files! Note: If you don't have extended or EMS memory, set this field to 'N' for faster execution; but you may have memory errors.
 - Mouse Enable Change to 'N' if you do not use a mouse, or do not want accidental mouse movement.
 - Blink Disable If your video card displays blinking characters while running QuickDir, set blink disable to 'Y'. You must

- 4.2.4 F4 Register QuickDir.
 - Use F4 to Register QuickDir. It's the best way of insuring you are notified when upgrades are available.
 - You are protected from future price increases because you receive a coupon good for free upgrades (S+H only).
 - F4 is an easy way to register.
 - Registration Name: The name you wish to have appear on your registered copy of QuickDir.
 - # PC's To Register: Decide how many PC's to register the same way as deciding how many books to purchase.
 If QuickDir is loaded on more than one PC at a time, count the total the number of PC's it is loaded on.
 - Cost Per PC: Enter the cost as stated in this chart:

- Disk Size: Enter either 3 or 5 for 3 1/2 or 5 1/4 installation disks.
- Extra Install Diskettes: If required cost \$4 each.
- Extra Printed Manual: 1 manual is included with registration. Additional manuals are \$6 apiece.
 The manual is printed on a laser printer with a nice cover. As registrations increase to a profitable level, I will have them printed professionally.

- 4.2.5 F5 Print current display.
 - Use F5 to print contents of the current display.
 - You can print the Tree, File, Archive, or Utility displays.
 - Save the printout or use it for utility analysis.
 - Or, PC Lan Administrators can send the printout to user departments, for delete authorization.
 - Pressing F5 will cause the following panel to display:

- First, select the printer using the cursor up/down keys or by typing 1-5.
- Then, enter the lines per page. 60 lines is perfect for laser printers, and is the default.
- Enter the line spacing you desire. Triple spacing is provided if you need room for notes, etc on the printed page.
- Press enter, and the current screen, along with all file tag indicators will be printed.
- 4.2.6 Escape Key.
 - The escape key is a cancel key. Escape cancels any function, except external programs.
- 4.2.7 Quit Key.
 - Use the 'Q' key to return to DOS.

 - Use the 'D' key to delete an empty subdirectory.
 - If the directory contains files or subdirectories,
 a 'Directory Not Empty' message is displayed.
 - Use F2 Rescan if the directory cannot be deleted.
 Another program may have already deleted it.
 - This prompt is displayed if the directory is empty:

- Reply 'Y' to delete the directory.
- Reply 'N' to cancel delete.

- 5.6 Rename Directory (C).
 - Use the 'R' key to change the name of a directory. Here is an example:

- The 'Rename To:' reply area is preloaded with the current directory name.
- Enter the new directory name in the 'Rename To:' reply area. Press enter to process rename.

- 5.7 - Graft Directory (G).

Use the 'G' key to move a dir branch to a new parent.
 A select directory and graft directory are displayed.
 Here is an example:

- Use these rules for selecting a new parent:
 - The new parent must be on the current drive.
 - The new parent directory must exist.
- The select directory panel must be used to select a parent directory.
- Also, Log to another drive is disabled.
- Select a parent from the directory display and press enter.
- Press 'Y' to process the directory graft. Grafting is a multiple command. New directories are created, files moved, and the old directories deleted.
- Because grafting is complicated, no escape sequence is provided. You MUST let the graft complete or your hard drive tree will look strange. If your system crashes during a graft, you must rescan and move files manually.
- 5.8 F8 Eliminate Directory.
 - Use the 'F8' key to remove all files and subdirs. Here is an example:

- Type 'ELIM' in the reply area.
- Use care. Important files can be wiped out.
- 5.9 DOS SHELL (S).
 - Use the 'S' key to shell to DOS without leaving QDir.
 - QuickDir swaps to XMS/DISK, leaving just a 2k stub.
 Be sure XMS SWAPPING is ON in the configuration.
 - Type 'EXIT' to return to QuickDir.

- 5.10 - Log (L).

- Use the 'L' key to change to another drive.
- Select the drive from the drive select panel.
- Removable drives are scanned before the directory tree is displayed.

- 5.11 - The Enter Key.

 Use the 'Enter' key to display the files in the current directory. Refer to section 3.2.2 for an example of the file display panel on page 15.

Chapter 6 - Utility Commands.

 QuickDir has some very useful utilities. This chapter discusses them in detail.

- 6.1 - All Files (A).

- Use the 'A' key to display all files on your drive.
- Select the drive from the drive select panel.
- The drive is scanned and every file is marked for display.
- Up to 3,001 files can be displayed.
- For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.

- 6.2 - Bad Files (B).

- Use the 'B' key to identify temporary files.
- Select the drive from the drive select panel.
- The following types of files are displayed:
 - Files with 0 size.
 - Files with extensions of .BAK, .BU, .OLD, .SAV, .TMP, ._SB, .\$\$\$, and .!!!.
 - Files with no extension.
- For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.

- 6.3 - Archive Files (H).

- Use the 'H' key to scan for archive files.
- Select the drive from the drive select panel.
- Archive files are files with extensions of .ARC, .ARJ, .LZH, .SDN, .PAK, .ZIP, and A00-A99.
- For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.

- 6.4 Duplicate Files. (I).
 - Use the 'I' key to scan for duplicate files.
 - Select the drive from the drive select panel.
 - Duplicate files are files with the same filename and extension, but reside in different directories.
 - For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.
- 6.5 Find a File (J).
 - Use the 'J' key to locate a file.
 - Select the drive from the drive select panel.
 - Also, any part of the filename, as shown:

- Use Find File for locating:
 - Any part of the filename. For instance, 'SHARE' matches all of these files:
 - SHARE.EXE MDSHARE.DAT RVSHARE.TXT
 - The extension. For instance, '.TXT' matches all files with '.TXT' extension.
- For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.
- 6.6 SysDups System Duplicate Files. (K).
 - Use the 'K' key to scan for duplicate files.
 - Select the drive from the drive select panel.
 - Select the type of duplicate file search as follows:
 - A) Version Dups Archive Matches: QD12.ARJ-QD10A.ZIP
 This option is intended for sysop's use to match archives that are duplicated by version.
 - B) Version Dups All Files Matches: QD12.EXE-QD13A.ZIP
 Essentially the same as above, but does not limit the matches to just archive extensions.
 - C) Dups Archives Only Matches: QDIR.ZIP-QDIR.ARJ
 This option is intended for sysops use to match archives that are alike, except for the archive format.
 - D) Ignore Extension Matches: QDIR.XXX-QDIR.CFG
 PC Lan Administrators can use this duplicate match to locate possible errors in installation or configuration.
 - For a complete list of Utility Display Commands, refer to Chapter 8 on page 43.

Chapter 7. - File Display Commands.

- This chapter discusses the commands available in the File Display Panel.
- The File Display Panel is displayed by pressing enter on the directory tree panel, or by pressing the space bar on the utility display panel.

- 7.1 - Find File (F).

- Use the 'F' key to Find a file. Here is an example:

- Enter any part of the file name.
- Find file points to the first match.
- Since the match can be anywhere in the filename, make the search string as complete as possible.
- Use the Next key in conjunction with find.

- 7.2 - Next File (N).

- Use the 'N' key to find the Next matching file.
- No panel is displayed. Next points to matching file.
- If a Find is not performed, Next moves the cursor down one file.
- When the last matching file is found, Next redisplays the first.

- 7.3 - Sort the File Display (S).

- Use the 'S' key to Sort the file display by file size, date/time, attribute flags, extension, or file name.
- The file display is initially sorted in filename order.
- Here is an example of the Sort selection panel.

+-----+

|Date and Time |
|Size of File |
|Attribute Flags |
|Extension of File |
|Filename |
| Use Arrow Keys or
| Type First Letter |

- Move the cursor to the selection.
- Or, key in the first letter of the selection.
- Press Enter. QuickDir sorts the file display.

- 7.4 - Tag All Files (T).

- Use the 'T' key to select all files.
- Every file contains a 'Tag' indicator on the leftmost side of the panel.
- File Display Commands process files as a group.

- 7.5 - Untag All Files (U).

- Use the 'U' key to deselect all files.
- Every 'Tag' indicator is erased from the leftmost side of the panel.
- File Display Commands process single files only.

- 7.6 - Selective Tagging (SPACE BAR).

- Use the 'SPACE' bar to Tag or Untag a file.
- If not tagged, 'Tag' is added to leftmost side of the panel.
- If already tagged, 'Tag' is erased from the leftmost side of the panel.
- The file display scrolls down to the next file.

- 7.7 - CTL KEY.

- Use the 'CTL' key to ignore tagged files.
- The 'CTL' key is used in this way:
 - Press and hold 'CTL'.
 - Enter the file display command.
- For instance, say you are tagging files for delete.
 After tagging a number of files, you come across one you have to view. Pressing the 'V' key alone will not view the file. Rather, it views all tagged files. Press CTL and 'V' together to view a single file.
- 7.8 Copy File Command (C).
 - Use the 'C' key to Copy a file.
 - If files are tagged, all tagged files are copied unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Single and tagged actions are documented separately.
- 7.8.1 Copy Single File (C).
 - Use the 'C' key without tagging any file to copy a single file. Use 'CTL-C' to force a single file copy.
 - Select Directory and Copy Input panels are displayed. Here is an example:

- in future QuickDir versions.Choose Verify: 'Y' if you are copying to a floppy and want to make sure the file is readable.
- Press enter and the following occurs:
 - The create directory prompt is displayed if the directory does not exist.
 - QuickDir displays progress of the copy as shown:

- 7.8.1 Copy Single File (C). Continued.
 - This panel contains informational messages only.
 - The following information is available:
 - File 1 of 1: The number of files copied.
 - From Path: Input file path.
 - To Path: Output file path.
 - Bytes Available on Drive: Free Space. Updated before file is copied.
 - Total Bytes: File size.
 - Copied: Progress of the copy.
- 7.8.2 Copy Tagged Files (C).
 - Use the 'C' key to copy all tagged files.
 - A single file copy is performed if no tagged files.
 - Here is an example:

- Point or Enter the destination path in 'To Path:'.
- Answer Y or N to 'Replace All Existing Files:'.
 - Answer 'N' and QuickDir asks before replacing files.
 - Answer 'Y' and QuickDir will replace without asking.
- Answer Verify = 'Y' if you are copying to a floppy, and wish to make sure the copy is readable.
- Copy progress is displayed.
- Refer to single file copy for more information.
- 7.9 Delete Files (D).
 - Use the 'D' key to delete files.
 - If files are tagged, all tagged files are deleted unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Tagged and untagged actions are documented separately.
- 7.9.1 Delete a Single File (D).
 - Use the 'D' key without tagging any file to delete a single file. Use 'CTL-D' to force a single delete.
 - The single delete panel is shown below:

- The filename is displayed on the panel.
- Change the 'Delete File?:' to 'Y' to process delete.

- 7.9.2 Delete all Tagged Files (D).
 - Use the 'D' key to delete all tagged files.
 - A single file delete is performed if no tagged files.
 - Here is an example:

- Escape cancels tagged file delete.
- 7.10 Move File (M).
 - Use the 'M' key to Move files.
 - Use Move to copy and delete the file.
 - QuickDir performs a quick move if the input and output paths are on the same drive.
 - QuickDir does not delete input if any DOS error occurs.
 - If files are tagged, all tagged files are moved unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Tagged and untagged actions are explained separately.

- The second line displays total files and bytes.

- 7.11 Rename Files (R).
 - Use the 'R' key to Rename Files.
 - Renamed files remain in the same directory. Only the name changes.
 - If files are tagged, all tagged files are renamed unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Tagged and untagged actions are explained separately.
- 7.11.1 Rename a Single File (R).
 - Use the 'R' key without tagging any file to rename a single file. Use 'CTL-R' to force a single rename.
 - Here is an example:

- Change the filename in 'Rename To:'.
- Do not enter a drive or directory. Rename is processed in the current directory only.
- If new filename exists, a warning is issued.
- 7.11.2 Rename Tagged Files (M).
 - Use the 'R' key to rename tagged files.
 - If there are no tagged files, a single file rename is performed.
 - Here is an example:

- The 'Rename To:' field is NOT preloaded.
- Since renaming a group of files can be tricky, follow these rules:
 - You CANNOT rename all files to the same filename.
 - You MUST use the character '*' in the filename.
 - You MAY use the * character these ways:
 - At the beginning of filename: *TEST.* appends TEST to the end of each filename
 - At the end of the filename: TEST*.* prefixes all files with TEST.
 - At the beginning or end of the extension: *.T* prefixes all extensions with T.

- 7.12 View File (V).
 - Use the 'V' key to run the external viewer.
 - A viewer must be configured.
 - If files are tagged, you are asked if you want to view just the current file or all tagged files, unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
- 7.13 Edit File (E).
 - Use the 'E' key to run the external editor.
 - An editor must be configured.
 - If files are tagged, you are asked if you want to edit just the current file or all tagged files, unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Some files are too large to be edited. If that occurs, quit QuickDir and run the editor from the DOS command line or make sure the XMS/Disk configuration switch is set to 'Y'.
- 7.14 Change File Attribute Flag (A).
 - Use the 'A' key to change the file attribute flag.
 - If files are tagged, all tagged file attributes are changed unless the 'CTL' override key is used.
 - Here is an example:

- Initially, the 'Done Return' area is highlighted.
- Type the first letters of A,R,H,or S to toggle the attribute flag on or off. Or use the cursor keys.
- Press enter on the 'Done Return' area and the attribute flags for the file or files (if tagged) are updated.

- 7.15 Execute a File (X).
 - Use 'X' to execute a file with an extension of .EXE, .COM, or .BAT.
 - The 'X' key is also used for archive extracting.
 - Execute supports only single file action. All tagged files are ignored.

- Option: Archive Display Panel.
- Action: Cannot process any commands. Use enter or escape.

Can't Be Blank.

- Option: Input field parsing.
- Action: Press enter to type new information.

Can't Delete Directory! - Use F2 to Rescan Drive.

- Option: Delete Directory.
- Action: Directory probably doesn't exist. Use F2 rescan.

Can't Delete Directory! Use F2 to Run Refresh.

- See above.

Can't Delete Directory. It contains Files and/or Subdirectories.

- Option: Delete Directory.
- Action: Delete the files and subdirectories or use F8 to eliminate.

Can't Delete Root Directory!.

- Action: None. There is no way to delete a root directory.

Error! Not Enough Space on Target Disk. Cancelling Copy.

- Option: Copy/Move Files.
- Action: None. Informational Only.

Error! One or More Read Only Files Were Not Deleted.

- Action: Use the (A)ttribute command and turn off read only flag.
