1.2 Introduction

First there was DisplayBeep that alerts the user by flash the screen, then came DisplayBeep with sound extension that alerts the user with a beep or sampled sound and/or flash the screen. Now comes BeepAManiac, a small Commodity that patches the standard Intuition DisplayBeep function.

BeepAManiac lets you play infinite number of sounds. Each time the DisplayBeep is called, BeepAManiac plays a random sound. This is much more pleasant to listen then the same old standard boring sound.

BeepAManiac requires WB2.0 or higher. BeepAManiac is very small and uses very little memory. You can configure BeepAManiac to use from 8K to 128K size sampled sounds. BeepAManiac can also play two simultaneous sounds at the same time if the DisplayBeep is call twice in the row.

1.3 To do list

1. Add DiskRemove and DiskInsert events.
2. Select which sounds to play from the list.
3. Any suggestion from you.

1.4 User Registration

BeepAManiac is Shareware meaning that you have the rights to use BeepAManiac for a limited time of two weeks. After this date, you must register BeepAManiac if you want continue to use it.

Registration fees are as followings:

1. \$10.00 US per copy US and Canada ONLY
2. \$15.00 US per copy Outside of North America (Rest of the World)
3. \$5.00 US each additional upgrades. You can include the upgrades when you register or send in the upgrade fees when there is a new release. If you have an internet account the cost is free for upgrades.

When you become a registered user, you will receive the full version of BeepAManiac with bug fixes and enhancements and crippled codes removed.

Please print the registration form in the 'About' menu item in BeepAManiac.

This is to ensure that it will not be confused with my other shareware registrations and that you wouldn't end up getting the wrong product.

1.7 Configuring BeepAManiac

BeepAManiac displays the setup window if you don't already have a preference file setup. To config BeepAManiac use the hotkey Left-Alt-Control F10 or use the Commodity Exchange program. Setup Pic

The setup window is straight forward. On the left is a listview that holds all the IFF sound files. In the middle of the window are buttons.

Directory - Opens a ASL file requester. Select the directory where all the sound files are located. You can not pick sounds from different directories.

They must reside on the same directory. Path name can not be more than one word. Eg: Ram Disk: use RAM: instead.

About - Display the about window.

Test - A Toggle button that switches from test mode. Once toggled you can single click on the listview and listen to the sound.

Hide - Save changes to ENVARC:BeepAManiac.pref and closes the window.

Quit - Abort all the changes and quit BeepAManiac.

Buffer Size - The size of the sample you want to allocate. Note if you don't have enough memory don't select higher size it may crash you system. BeepAManiac handle this error.

Volume - Sets the volume for all the sounds. This setting will over ride the setting in the sound file. Valid setting 0 - 64.

Note: the other gadgets are disabled because they are not implemented and may not be in future release.

Left-Alt-Control F10 for the hotkey.

1.8 Demo

This is a demo program only. Only 10 sounds can be used. The first 10 sounds from the sound listview will be used. Registered version lets you use unlimited number of sounds.

Once you have installed BeepAManiac you can run the BeepTest which tests BeepAManiac. Make sure you have at least 5 or more sounds in your selected sound directory for it to make it worth while.

1.9 Installation

If you don't have ARexx running you can't run this rexx script. Go to Workbench or Shell and start ARexx. Double click on the 'Installation.rexx' this will copy BeepAManiac to the system's WBStartup drawer. Once installed you can reboot your machine or double click on the BeepAManiac icon.

Manual Install

BeepAManiac can be run in Shell or Workbench. The best method is to put it in the WBStartup drawer which it will be automatically be executed during startup. The first time you run BeepAManiac, you will need to setup the configuration. [Config BeepAManica](#)

1.10 Tips

To make BeepAManiac more enjoyable to listen and useful, I suggest you to do the following:

1. Use small sample sounds. The best is less than 8K in size.
2. Have different mix of sounds. The more sounds the better.
3. For programmers please call DisplayBeep() when putting up an requester.

This will give the user an indication that attention is needed.
