- o **Weather** is an interface to numerous weather-related services available on the Internet. There have been recent changes to the popular ``*Weather Underground*'' server at U Michigan, and these have been incorporated into this version.
- o **Installation:**  
*Weather.app/* contains all source and utilities, as well as the application itself. To install, simply put *Weather.app* in the appropriate *Apps/* directory. Make any changes in place. Look at *Makefile.postamble* for details. Note that all of the source code is included, as well as a number of little scripts for fetching things like weather maps. Most of it is driven by the text in the file *Weather.app/menus*, as well as the ancillary scripts in *Weather.app/other/...*

The program is not hard to adapt to other similar services.

o **License, registry, and feedback:**

The *License* agreement is intended to promote the sharing and cultivation of high-quality software.

When you first run the program and accept the license, a receipt (like a "*read receipt*" in Mail) will be electronically mailed to us. It helps us keep a census to learn how quickly and widely software travels, and to gauge the size and scope of the community it serves.

There is also a "*Suggestion...*" menu item under "*Info ±>*" to help you send suggestions and improvements to the author.

Thanks for your help.

o **Problems:**

The server on *downwind.sprl.umich.edu* occasionally gets stuffed up. If the telnet interface to that server changes, *Weather.app's menus* file may become obsolete.

Old satellite photos sometimes crash certain GIF viewers.

**Please let me know if you find bugs or make changes or if you find other useful weather services.**
